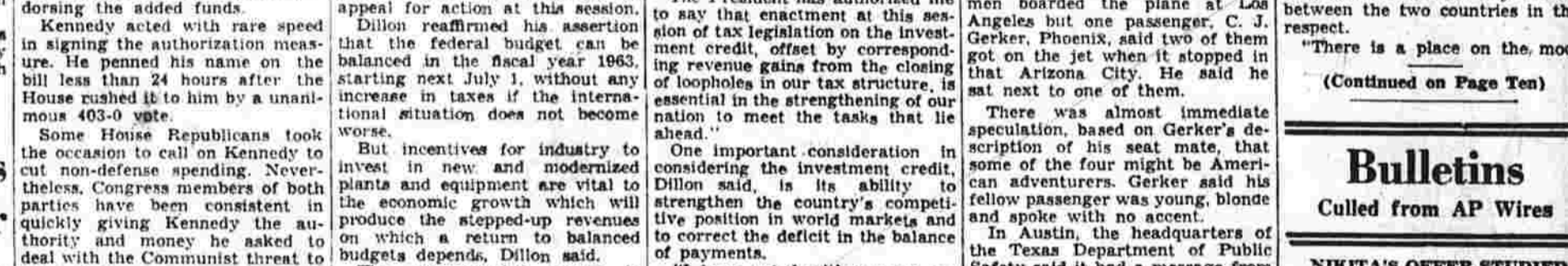

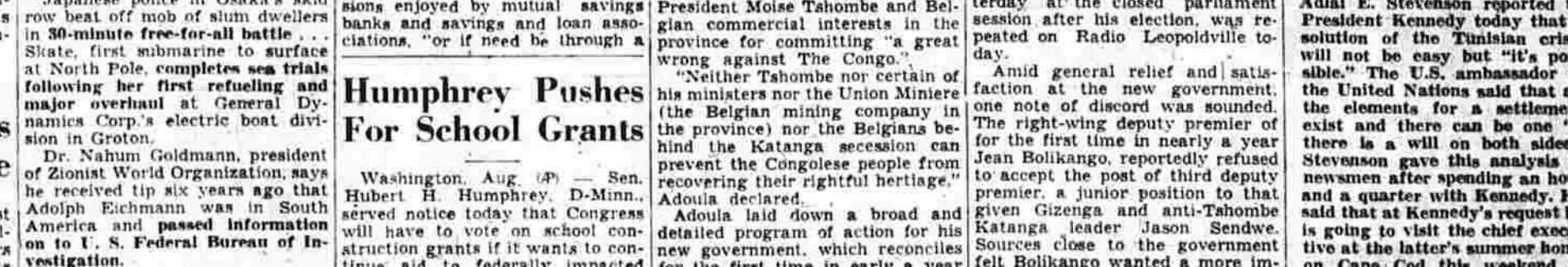

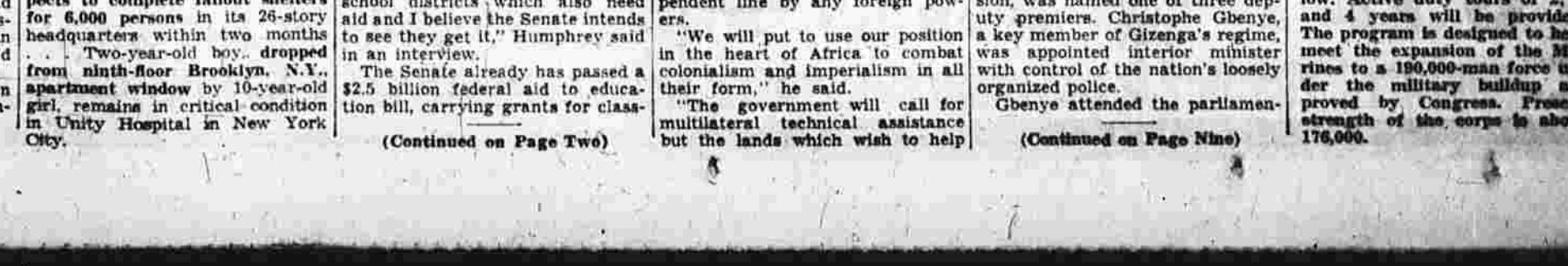

What Is East Germany? No One Uses That Name

NOTE: What is East Germany? For one thing, AP correspondent John Buzman reports in the third of a series of articles on the Berlin crisis, no German calls it that. Nevertheless, this war-born state is one of the keys to the complex problems of Berlin and Germany.

Berlin, Aug. 8 (AP)—The country known abroad as East Germany has a variety of names. But no German calls it East Germany. East Germany's Communists call their country the German Democratic Republic—or GDR. Or Democratic Germany. They regard it as an independent German state, worthy of recognition as such.

West Germans still refer to it as the Soviet Zone of Occupation. Or they call it just "The Zone." They regard it as a puppet regime forced upon the people and not worthy of recognition. In fact they feel it is so unworthy of recognition that the West German government breaks off relations with any country except the Soviet Union that extends official recognition to East Germany.

There is another West German term for East Germany—"Middle Germany." This is based on the theory that beyond "Middle Germany" lies an East German-made up of those eastern parts of prewar Germany now assigned to Poland and the Soviet Union.

Smaller Segment
Whatever you call it, East Germany is the smaller segment of divided Germany. With an area of 41,700 square miles, it is less than a third the size of West Germany's 142,000 square miles. Its total population compares with 22 million for West Germany.

The country's boundaries—from the Baltic Sea on the north, from the Oder-Neisse border with Poland on the east to the Iron Curtain border with West Germany—were drawn at the Allied Conference at Potsdam in 1945, right after World War II. At that time East Germany was set up as the Soviet zone of occupation.

The Soviet occupiers ruled with a strong hand. They dismantled factories and tore up railroad tracks as reparations to be shipped off to the Soviet Union.

Early local elections in the Soviet zone showed the majority of voters opposed to the Communist Socialist Unity party. But with Soviet backing, the party gained control of the zone's political life and became its governing force when the German Democratic Republic was proclaimed on Oct. 7, 1949.

West Germany's answer to the establishment of the Federal Republic of West Germany was France, the United States and Great Britain a month earlier.

By that time the break between the Soviet Union and its war allies was fully recognized. Efforts to cooperate in Berlin had since collapsed and the city had separate governments for the East and West sectors. The city had been the Allied airlift, lasting nearly a year, to break the Soviet blockade of Berlin and foil that first attempt to force the Allies out of the city.

East Germany, impoverished by stern reparations demands, was now called on to build itself up as a flourishing Soviet satellite.

A heavy industrialization program left little production for consumers. Farms were collectivized and private firms and tradesmen were expropriated. For four years the East Germans submitted to their fate, escaped to the West each year.

Then on June 16, 1961, building workers in East Berlin demonstrated against heavy work requirements and poor food supplies.

The next day, June 17, popular uprisings broke out in East Berlin and other major cities. The people demanded free elections, food and an end to tyranny. The Soviet proclaimed martial law and brought in tanks and troops to stop the rioting. Leaders of the

Rockville-Yernon Boothroyd Home, Starts Sad Trek

The violin in his right eye is impaired and there is a scar the size of a half dollar under it.

But Charles E. Boothroyd Sr., 55, of 27 Cottage St., Rockville, is not particularly bothered by these handicaps.

"I wake up every night and go through it all again," he said, referring to the July 4 evening in Utah when a gunman shot him, killed Mrs. Jeanette Sullivan, who was traveling with him, and kidnaped Mrs. Sullivan's daughter, Denise.

The memory of that time and the sleepless nights create the real pain.

Boothroyd returned from Utah to his son's home in Tolland yesterday afternoon.

He left at 9:45 this morning for Rhode Island with some of Mrs. Sullivan's personal possessions to take to her mother.

He was driven to Rhode Island by his sister, Mrs. Mabel Anderson, who has been visiting the family on her vacation from New Hampshire.

Sleeping pills given him in the hospital in Salt Lake City couldn't make me sleep," he said. Despite the grim memory, Boothroyd has been generous in submitting to interviews and photographers, both here and in Utah.

"That part doesn't bother me at all," he said.

In Salt Lake City, he was faced with television, movie and press cameras. Reporters interviewed him before, during and after his hospitalization.

On one occasion, four cameramen focused on him at once.

"They took more film of me," he said, "than I took of the countryside."

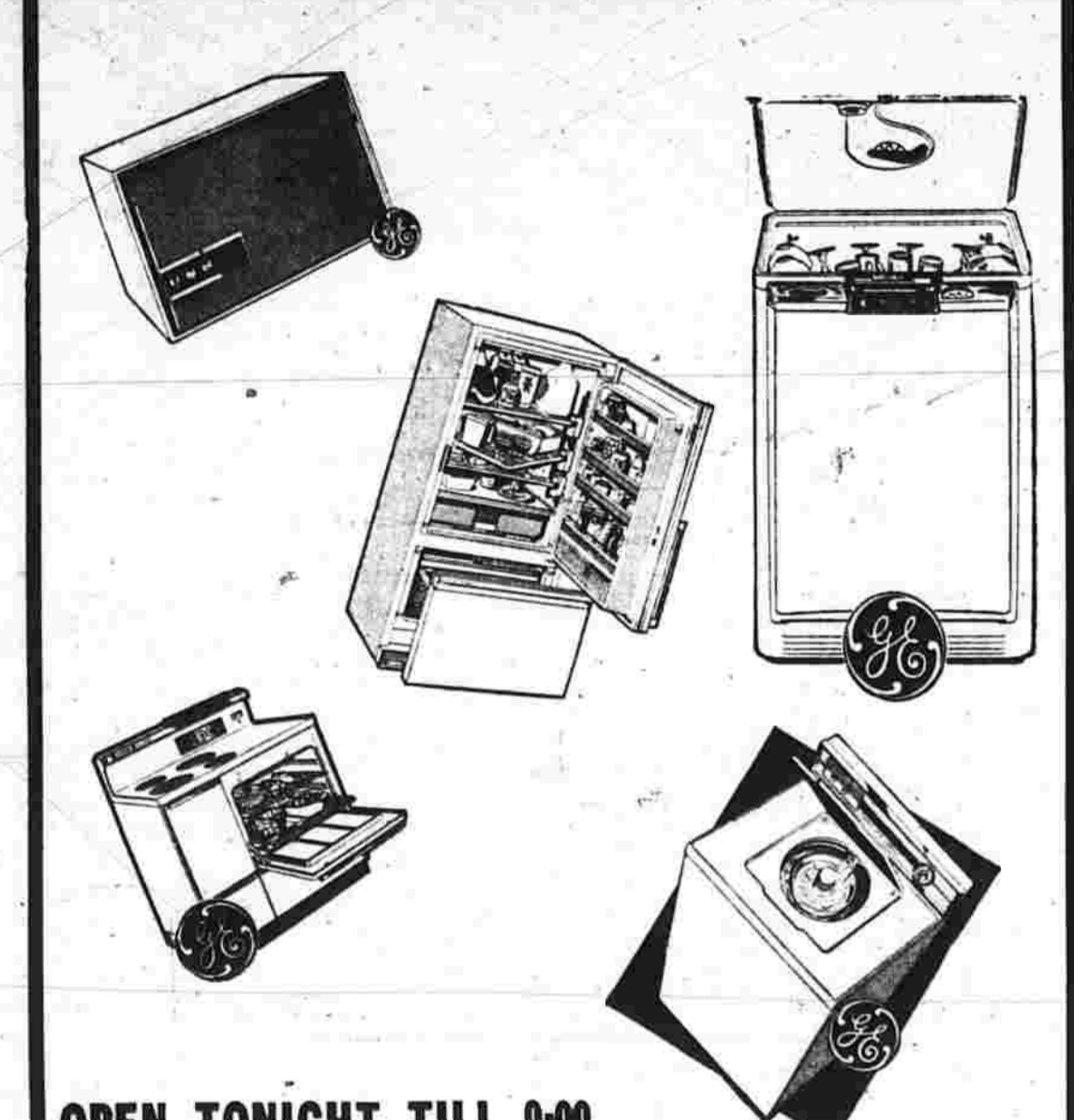
