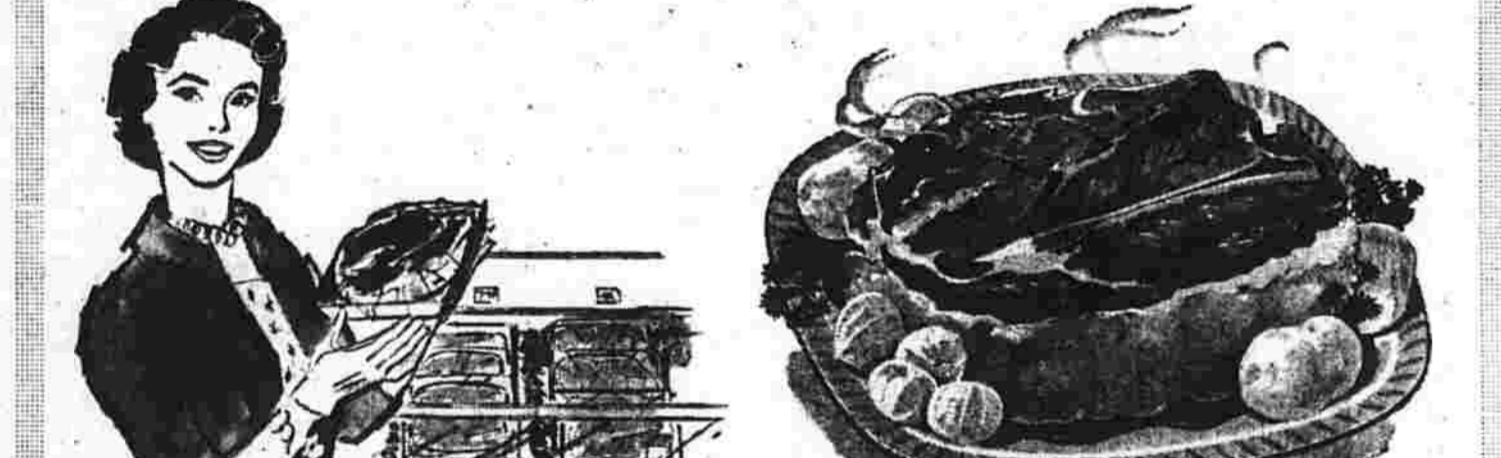

### Time Forcing School Board To Quit Fight on Budget Cut

The Manchester Board of Education apparently plans to abandon its nearly four-month-old fight for a \$300,000 new budget for the 1961-62 school year, according to the agenda for Monday night's meeting.

"We are at the point in our budget operation where the final adjustments should be either approved or amended as desired by the board," said Superintendent of Schools William H. Curtis in the agenda. The board of education will meet Monday at 7:30 p.m. at Harvard Junior High School.

The school board has been trying since May 3 when the board of directors approved a \$1,186,847 budget, to have \$250,000 that was eliminated by the directors restored to the school budget.

After the directors refused to grant the school board's request for a special hearing on reaffirming the money, the board prepared plans for a public announcement of the school year. The board said it hoped the public would start a petition for a referendum to organize a referendum on restoring the money.

However, when the public announcement was made, General Manager Richard Martin reported that "approximate budget reductions" had to be made. He said that, despite the cut, \$150,000 more than last year would be available to a decreased number of pupils in the school system.

No Response

The public has been apathetic to taking action on a referendum, no response has been given to the board's challenge.

The board of education will also discuss two other topics from General Manager Martin concerning additional renovations for either elementary schools and possible budget-setting dates.

Curtis had asked Martin to request that the board to request the unexpended balance of appropriation for the elementary school renovations for further announcements for the schools. The general manager replied that \$15,000 of the unexpended balance had been used to repay notes financed more than a year ago to finance the project until the issuance of bonds.

Minister Martin also reported that the board had decided that additional renovations constituted the state renovation project.

Conferees Hold Fate Of Aid Bill

Washington, Aug. 19 (AP)—Administration hopes to put together against the pieces of President Kennedy's foreign aid program when the Senate and House blend into a compromise this afternoon...

Kennedy, who campaigned long and hard for the program, got substantially what he asked for in the Senate last night. It approved a measure providing for a 5-year, \$5 billion lending program to be financed by borrowing from the Treasury...

The House, a little earlier, passed a bill stripping of the borrowing authority and limiting the program to one year with \$1.2 billion for loans this year to be provided by congressional appropriation...

Kennedy considers the powers eliminated by the House to be essential to the success of the overseas development program. Administration leaders will try to get them when the representatives of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee and the House Foreign Affairs Committee meet next week to hammer out a compromise of their two versions of the bill...

There was considerable speculation that the compromise would give the president the right to lend authority instead of the way he asked, and the authority to borrow from the Treasury. Sen. J. William Fulbright, D-Ark., who will head up the Senate conferees, told a reporter he will do everything in his power to retain the long-range borrowing authority which he said, "is the very heart of a worthwhile foreign aid program."

Fulbright, chairman of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, said it was unlikely the conferees would get into any real work Wednesday.

House conferees, so friendly to the Kennedy approach, raising identification hopes it will be completed before the end of the year.

The Senate measure provides \$4,000,000 for the first year, \$1,187,000,000 for the next four years.

The House passed, 287 to 140, a bill carrying \$4,368,500,000 for its one year program, including loans and grants and covering military aid as well as economic.

The Senate loaned \$200 million to the House.
