Mauch praised rightshander John Borchert, who pitched a four-inning game and did not pitch in his entire club.

Manchester, which designed the building; and Griswold Chappell, first vice president of the Manchester Council of Churches. Others included Robert Widham of the church's board of trustees; Hjalmar Carlson of the board of deacons; Miss Esther Granstrom, supervisor of the Sunday School; Henry Janssen, representing the church family; Frank Johnson, representing older members; and Miss Carolyn Raak, the pastor's daughter, representing future members of the church. Miss Diane Platt was organist for the program, at which hymns were sung and prayers recited. Formal construction will begin this week on the 13-acre site by Squillacote Builders Inc. At the same time, laymen of the church will begin work on a recreation area, which will eventually include a baseball diamond, badminton courts, picnic area, outdoor chapel and swimming pool. Plans call for completion of the church by March 1962, and of the grounds by next summer.

Under the old contract, which expired April 1, the basic wage was about \$45 a week. Commissions, however, bring the average income up over \$100 a week in most cases.
