

Only After Peace Treaty East Reds Demanding Voice In Any Talks on Germany

Bonn, Germany, Aug. 28 (P)—The western powers will demand in the next few days a conference with the Soviet Union on the Berlin crisis, West German Foreign Minister Heinrich von Brentano said today.

Brentano told a news conference talks are needed to make clear the positions of both sides before a catastrophe develops. He said it should be on the foreign minister level.

Bonn, Germany, Aug. 28 (P)—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer wants the West to take the initiative in starting negotiations on the Berlin crisis, government sources said today. They added that Adenauer gave instructions to this effect to Wilhelm Grewe, West German ambassador to the United States, at a meeting this morning.

Berlin, Aug. 28 (P)—East German Communists today demanded a voice in any East-West talks on Germany and said the subject of such talks could only be the conclusion of a peace treaty.

Ikeda Charges Nikita Meddles In Jap Affairs

Tokyo, Aug. 28 (P)—Japanese Prime Minister Hayato Ikeda today told Soviet Premier Khrushchev he was meddling in Japan's affairs by demanding abrogation of the U.S.-Japan security treaty.

In reply to a personal message from Khrushchev, Ikeda said in effect that unless the Soviet Union has aggressive intentions against Japan, the U.S.-Japan pact could not be a threat to Moscow.

The text of Ikeda's message delivered to Khrushchev by the Japanese ambassador in Moscow was released by the Japanese Foreign Office.

Ikeda also told Khrushchev Japan will stand with the free world.

"Japan pursues freedom and democracy as the highest political ideal. This is and will continue to be our immutable policy," he said.

The Soviet Premier's message said the Soviet Union could not remain indifferent to the U.S.-Japan Security Treaty and the presence of foreign troops here. He said

Justified... but Harmful Nehru Clarifies Views On Access to Berlin

New Delhi, India, Aug. 28 (P)—Prime Minister Nehru today said that the East and West Berlin by the Communists "in strict law... may be justified, but from every point of view it is a harmful thing."

"From the human point of view," Nehru said, "it causes tremendous misery."

He declared continued western access to Berlin is essential and should continue as heretofore.

Obviously seeking to clarify a foreign policy pronouncement last Wednesday that roused a storm in the West by appearing to back the Soviet bloc, Nehru told the house "a terrific barrier has been put up in Berlin—I hope that it is a temporary barrier."

He called again for a settlement by negotiation.

Western diplomats showed elation at Nehru's remarks.

In his original speech he declared western access to Berlin is "not a right but a concession by the Soviets" and that this was diluted when the joint 4-power administration of the city ended after the Soviet blockade of Berlin in 1948-49.

The western Big Three nations, seeking to convince the world that in spite of basic differences of approach between the East and West, there is leeway enough to do it should not be difficult to find

some basis of agreement" on the German and Berlin questions.

"Any agreement should take the human approach and not stick to legal niceties," he said.

He said it is "not proper for me to suggest a solution," but the powers involved should get together.

"The greater the delay in doing so, the greater the perils," he added. "The Cold War is getting more and more heated."

De Gaulle Reluctant Rusk Denies West-4 Split on Berlin Talks

Washington, Aug. 28 (P)—Secretary of State Dean Rusk denied today that the United States, Britain and West Germany have agreed to seek Berlin negotiations with the Russians without French participation.

He commented on published reports that he boarded a plane for New York City, where he will discuss United Nations matters with U.N. Secretary General Dag Hammarskjöld and U.S. Ambassador Adlai Stevenson.

Rusk told newsmen there is "nothing to report that the three Western Allies—without France—have agreed on a note to Russia proposing a foreign minister's discussion on Berlin at the forthcoming U.N. General Assembly session."

As for any idea of the three deciding to negotiate without France, he said "There is no three to one activity here."

Some published reports had stated that an ambassadorial group representing the four western nations had drafted a note proposing talks with the Soviets next month, but that the French government refused to go along with this.

U.S. informants said it is true that French President Charles de Gaulle is more reluctant to get into Berlin negotiations with the Reds than are the other three allies. But they portrayed this difference as a matter of varying degrees by the allies rather than as any fundamental split.

They denied that three of the four were pushing ahead without the other.

Rusk said he was going to New York today because he has wanted for quite awhile to talk to Hammarskjöld about a lot of U.N. questions.

Sikhs Planning Wholesale Fast

New Delhi, India, Aug. 28 (P)—The threat of wholesale Sikh fasting—was raised today as Master Tara Singh completed two weeks of fasting in support of demands for a separate Punjab-speaking Sikh state.

Sant (Saint) Fateh Singh, another Sikh leader, has joined Tara Singh in the fast. J. J. Singh, former president of the India League of America, said he had signed a list of 11 other Sikh leaders who would fast to the death if Tara Singh and Fateh Singh died.

Asked if he expected violence to erupt in the Sikh community of Punjab if Tara Singh dies, J. J. Singh said:

"The results will be horrible, especially after Sant Fateh dies."

Yogindra Suraydev, a Hindu ascetic fasting in an effort to prevent granting of the Sikh demands, was reported in serious condition today. His doctors said he had entered the danger zone and his life was almost despaired of. The government feared his

West Offers Soviet Total Testing Ban

Geneva, Aug. 28 (P)—The United States and Britain offered today to negotiate with Russia a nuclear test ban treaty covering even the smallest tactical atomic weapons.

U.S. Delegate Arthur H. Dean made the offer on behalf of the two western powers at the opening of a critical phase of the deadlocked 34-month-old talks.

At the end of the 90-minute meeting, Soviet Delegate S. K. Tsarapkin, the day's chairman, thanked the westerners for their western proposal, telling newsmen:

"While arms and military preparedness are being increased throughout the world, it is naive to speak quietly about such technical measures."

The only possible way out for the conference, the Soviet Delegate said, is for it to be merged with general East-West disarmament negotiations.

"Separation of the two issues is unacceptable to the Soviet government," he declared.

For the first time since the talks opened on Oct. 31, 1958, the West held out a prospect of a total ban on all nuclear tests, including those too small to be policed by known long-range detection methods.

But as a condition for a total ban, the West demanded a substantially stronger international control and inspection system than heretofore proposed.

The talks have been stalemated all the way because of an unacceptable Soviet veto demand which in the western view would paralyze the entire inspection system.

In earlier stages of the marathon conference—today's meeting was the 337th, the West offered Russia a treaty banning all nuclear tests except underground tests below a seismic magnitude of 4.5—approximately a 10,000-ton conventional explosive equivalent.

Smaller nuclear blasts, difficult or impossible to distinguish from natural earthquakes, would be temporarily outlawed by a 3-year moratorium, while scientists of both sides worked to improve detection methods, Tsarapkin re-

Portugal Gives Citizenship to Colony Natives

Oporto, Portugal, Aug. 29 (P)—Overseas Minister Adriano Moreira announced today a decree that every native of Portugal's eight overseas provinces is in a full citizen of Portugal, without distinction of race, religion or culture.

The decree, to be published officially soon, is the most sweeping reform by a Portuguese government since the abolition of slavery in the Portuguese territories of Africa a century ago.

It primarily affects Negroes of the African provinces—including revolt-torn Angola—by repealing the laws that have kept them only natives achieving a certain level of education have had full citizenship rights. This statute never applied, for instance, to Portuguese India.

Moreira made his announcement in a speech at the City Hall Stock Exchange. He said Portugal aims "simply to do our duty" in Africa.

"We feel we have been right in our view of the problem of these territories, which depend in everything—technique, education and capital—on the help which they can obtain from Portugal," he said.

It is necessary for Portugal to increase settlement of Africa, the minister said. "By European Portugal, we mean the officers who go home there. He announced special provincial settlement agencies are to be set up in Angola and Mozambique.

He expressed hope that youths now doing their military service in Africa will settle there. He said

Colorado to Probe Denver Police as Scandal Spreads

Denver, Aug. 28 (P)—As two officers watched from their police cruiser, a safe tumbled from the trunk of a moving car on a downtown street. The officers gave chase, halted the car and questioned its two occupants.

The driver was a 24-year-old Arthur Winstanley, a Denver policeman. His passenger was Eugene Haas, a former deputy sheriff in suburban Arapahoe County.

From that bizarre beginning 16 months ago has come a widening scandal which has reached deep into the 770-man Denver Police Department, outraged community leaders and led to a full-scale state investigation.

So far, 13 Denver policemen have been indicted on burglary charges. Five have been convicted, including Winstanley. He is serving a 4-to-8 year term in the Colorado Penitentiary at Canon City. Two

Montague, Mass. Aug. 28 (P)—A man identified as Charles Bennett, 31, his wife and daughter, 2, were found shot to death today in a trailer.

Montague Police said it appeared that the three had been discharged from a 32 caliber pistol. They said it might have been a case of double murder and suicide.

Authorities in this Connecticut Valley town, not far from Greenfield, appeared to be investigating the circumstances.

State Police were rushed from Northampton and Shelburne Falls. Mrs. Bennett, whose first name is Irene, was found in a trailer parked off Route 63 in Montague Center.

Also Strongly Against French Algerian Rebels Pick Pro-Red for Premier

Tunis, Tunisia, Aug. 28 (P)—The new Algerian rebel leadership asserted today it will bolster military action against French rule in Algeria, but at the same time reaffirmed that a negotiated solution to the rebellion is still possible.

The statement followed yesterday's announcement of a shuffle in the rebel provisional government, shoving moderate Premier Ferhat Abbas, 62, and replacing him with Ben Yousef Ben Khedda, 41. Ben Khedda, virtually unknown outside rebel circles, is farther to the left than Abbas and favors a tougher approach in the war against the French.

The shuffle took place at a meeting of the National Council of the Algerian Revolution (CNRA), a sort of parliamentary body, in Tripoli, Libya. A communique issued at rebel headquarters here today said:

"The decisions of the CNRA dealt principally with the reinforcement of the action of the National Liberation Army and the mobilization of the Algerian masses."

The CNRA reaffirmed that a (negotiated) solution is possible within the fundamental principles safeguarding the territorial integrity of the Algerian territory, including the Sahara. It added, Repeated peace talks with the French broke down largely on French insistence that the oil-rich Sahara is not part of Algeria.
