# You Should Know...

**Mrs. George A. Sweet**

"Interest in these... we've just got to keep it going," says Mrs. George A. Sweet, secretary of the Manchester office of the American Red Cross, public relations officer for Red Cross work.

A few years ago, Manchester ranked near the bottom among the state's towns in its support of the Red Cross Bloodmobile, she said. "It's gradually coming up," she said.

The attractive, red-haired secretary says she thinks of the many facts of Red Cross activities as "children." "Each needs individual attention," she says. "You do the best for them all."

"Them all" includes home service, home nursing, disaster relief, building program, first aid and water safety instruction, and the Bloodmobile. The office supervises about 250 volunteer staff aides, "gray ladies," canteen workers, nurses' aides and building program aides.

Mrs. Sweet says all Red Cross programs are available to all people in "diverse ways." Some, however, are less familiar to the public, because they are "confidential" programs, she says.

Among Mrs. Sweet's duties is getting word to servicemen about emergency allowances. She says, "It's an example of a 'confidential' program in which 'you've got to be ready for'."

In New Haven, where Mrs. Sweet was born, she said she became interested in working for the Red Cross after being a volunteer blood donor and working as a blood recruiter. She has been at the Manchester office almost six years.

Mrs. Sweet was born Elaine M. Gilmore on March 30, 1929, daughter of Mrs. Letitia (Kane) Gilmore of New Haven and the late Richard Gilmore. She was graduated from St. Francis Parochial School and Commercial High School there.

After high school graduation, until 1946, she was employed for Blue Cross by the Connecticut Hospital Service in New Haven. The same year, she and George A. Sweet were married in New Haven. They have a son, Richard, 12, a fifth grader at Verplanck School.

Among the better known Red Cross programs is the first aid instruction program, which is led by the First Aid Instructors' Group. "As the world situation increases, the value of this type of instruction program is growing," she says.

The instructor group presented several programs on resuscitation methods during the summer, she said. "The first aid program is in great demand."

"I think with boys and girls being away from home so much and with groups, that it is important that they get education in first aid procedures," she says.

During the past summer, when the Hartford office of the Red Cross made appeal to the public to help restore the almost totally depleted blood stockpile, Mrs. Sweet worked vigorously with

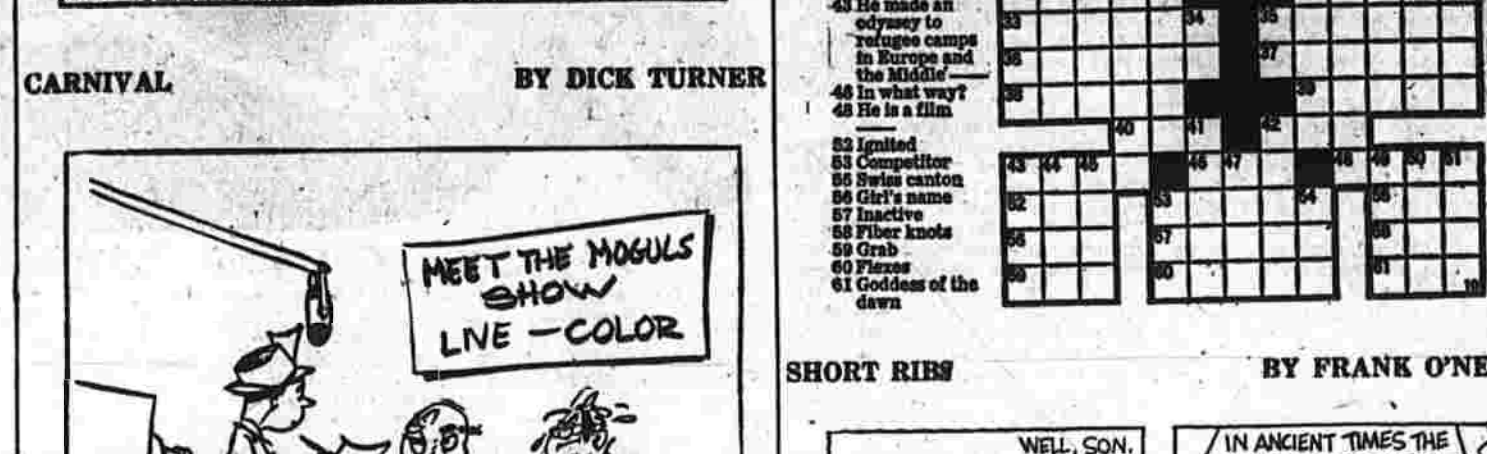

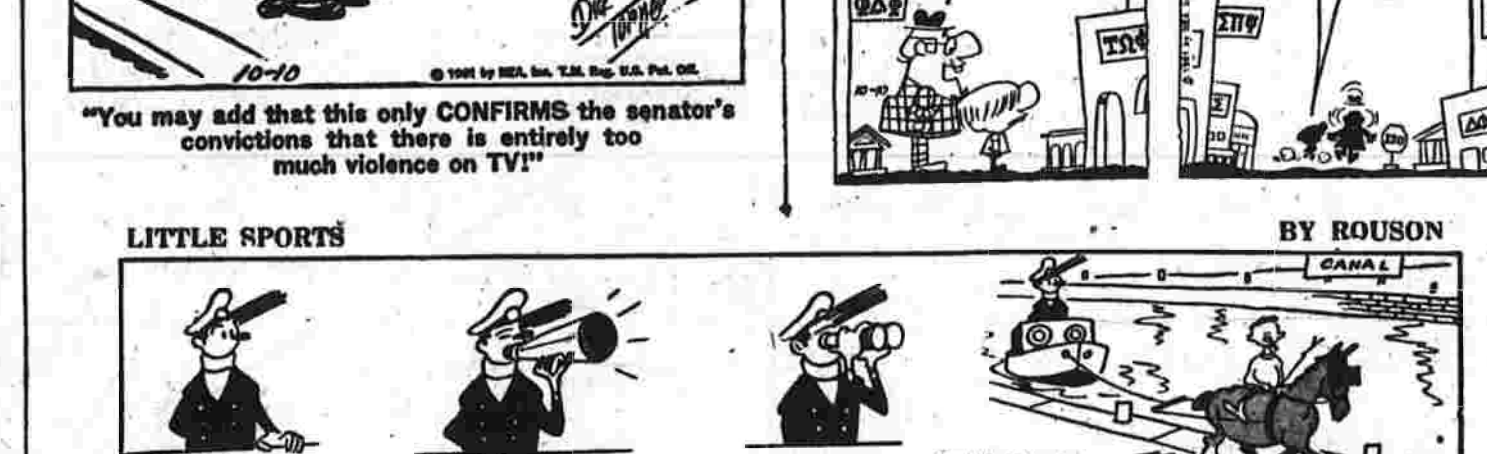

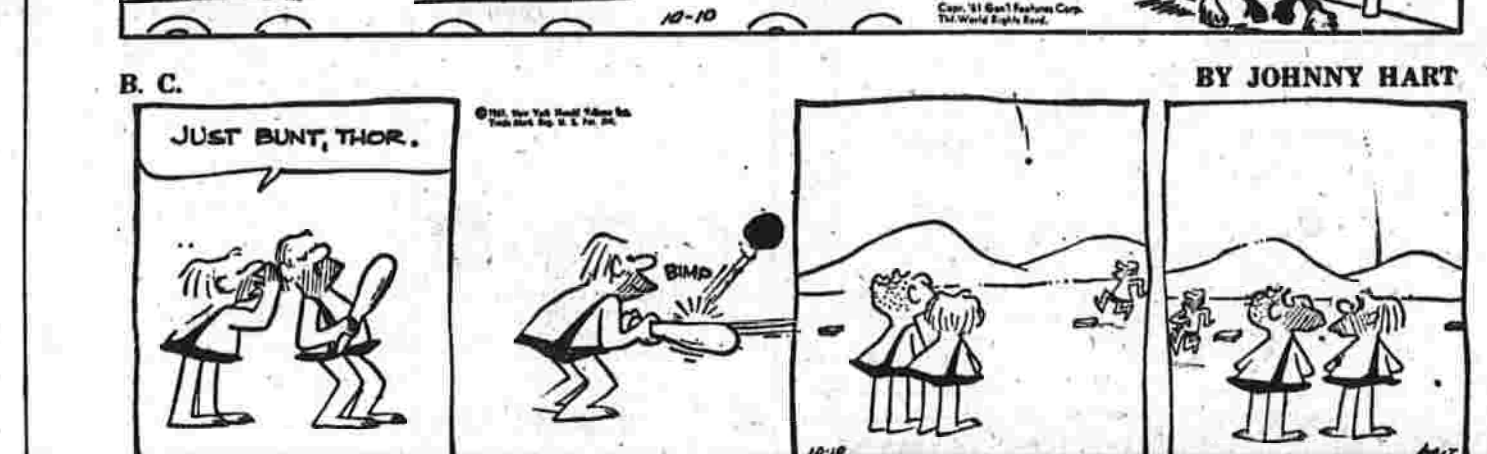
