Emphasis On Health

What to do if you get the flu, how throat swabs may help stop some heart disease, and a new aid for heart surgeons are subjects for Emphasis on Health.

Flu This Fall
Health experts warn another flu season is approaching. While the chance of an epidemic cannot be predicted, certain protective measures can be taken. Treatment of the elderly and people with chronic diseases should be vaccinated.

Here are other suggestions from the Connecticut State Department of Health:
Stay away from sick people. If you break out, keep away from crowds. Be sure to wash your hands before eating—and don't use glasses or other utensils that others have used. Get plenty of sleep. Avoid being chilled. If you do get sick, call your doctor and go to bed for your good and the good of others.

Medical Messenger
A new attack against rheumatic fever and rheumatic heart disease involves the Post Office Department.

Chicago doctors are getting throat swab kits suitable for mailing as the latest aid to diagnosing the disease that brings on rheumatic fever. Caught in the early stages it can be cured.

A type of streptococcus germ sets the rheumatic fever. Throat swabs from a sick patient seal it in an envelope and mail it to a laboratory where the type of germ can be identified. If the specimen in the diagnostic form is seen by a doctor, he can identify it quickly before rheumatic fever

has a chance to develop. The mail-in system was devised by the Chicago Heart Association and Board of Health.

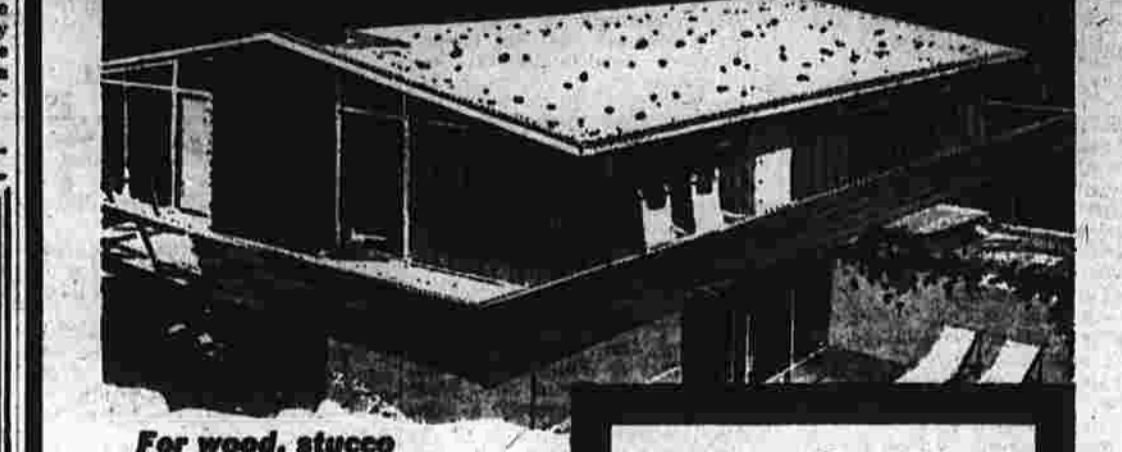
Heartbeat Trigger
In the heart there is a critical bundle of nerves which controls the heartbeat. For surgeons trying to repair these hearts, the heartbeat center is often a hazard. An operation in which surgeons try to mend a hole between two chambers of the heart comes dangerously close to the heartbeat trigger. Injury occurs in perhaps 10 per cent of these operations and may lead to death.

Our Air Defense Tests Its Muscle

Washington (UPI)—About 150,000 Americans will feel the first punch of a missile war on Saturday, Oct. 14, in a mass exercise that has been dubbed "Operation Sky Shield II." North America's air defenses will be tested against a sham atomic attack by long-range bombers.

Purpose of the exercise is to provide operational training for the entire North American Air Defense System (NORAD). Sky Shield will begin when a force of strategic Air Command (SAC) B-52's and B-57's, supported by a small number of British bombers, simulates an attack on the United States.
NORAD fighter squadrons of U.S. and Royal Canadian Air Force F-102, F-106 and F-104 jets will make an estimated 8,000 sorties in defense. Neither side will use missiles or live ammunition.
From headquarters in Colorado Springs, Gen. Laurence B. Kuter, NORAD commander, will coordinate defensive activities.

Librarian Reports Hike in Patronage

Miss Marjorie H. Martin, head librarian of Douglas Library, reports that though there has been a gain of 1,014 in book circulation over last year, the library falls short on technical books which are expensive and soon go out of date. It is doing well in general reference books, and also in magazine and newspaper books.

Douglas Library has a book stock of 8,500 volumes. Books circulated are also increased by those borrowed at "swap meetings" and at last report there were nine books per capita, five per capita being a good average.
Miss Martin quotes a statement from the American Library Association that Connecticut as a whole is a million books short of what it should be according to post-war standards. Books most needed are up-to-date scientific and technical books, books on world affairs, reference books such as encyclopedias, and picture books for the youngest potential readers.

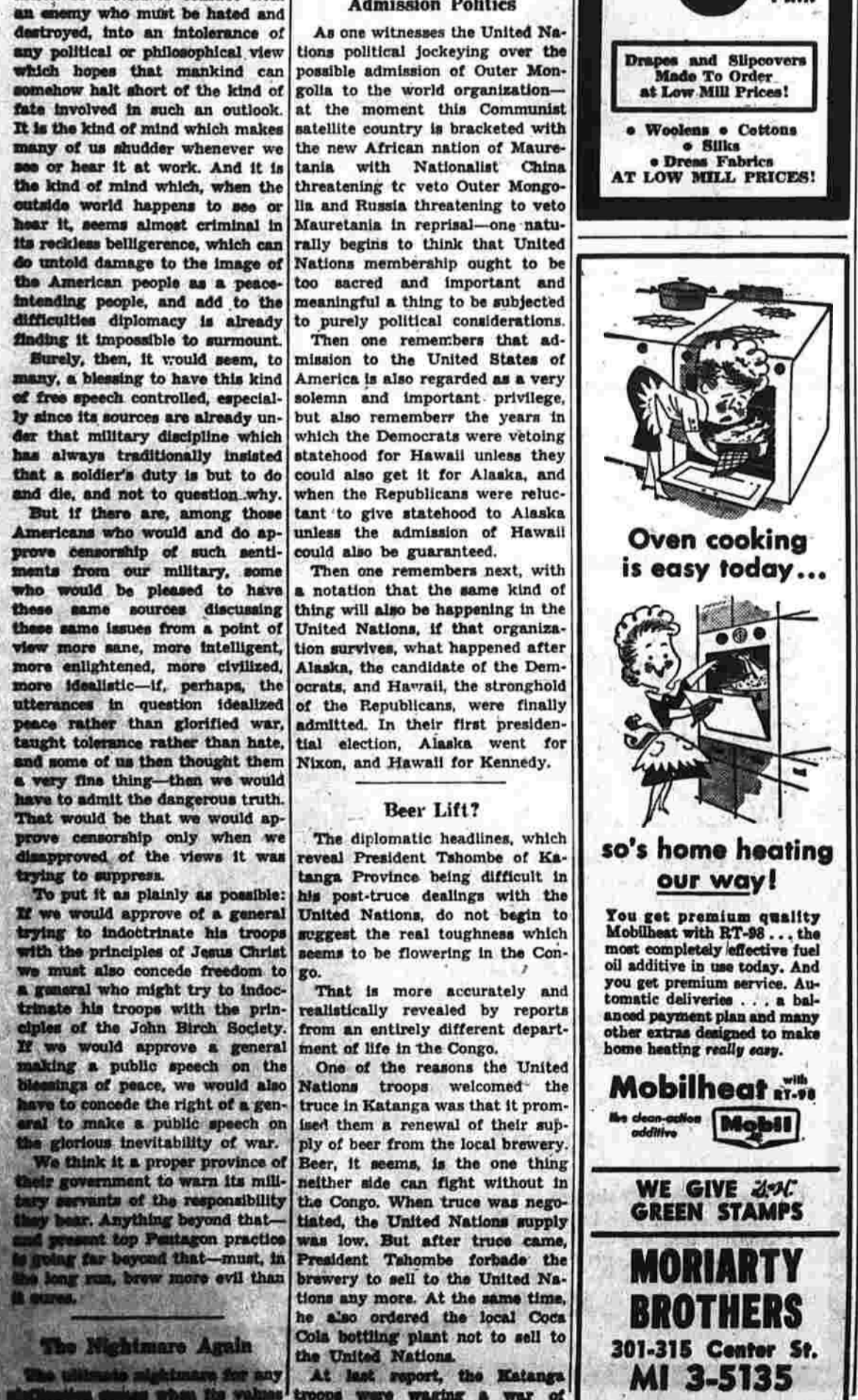

The Doctor Says

Q—My leg has been amputated above the knee but I still suffer almost continuous pain that seems to be located in the missing portion. Can anything be done to give me relief? Medicines haven't helped.

A—Pain in a "phantom limb" is an occasional complication of amputation. Usually it is your experience that this pain is severe, unrelenting and unresponsive to pain-killing drugs. You should return to your surgeon who may be able to give you relief by injecting or severing the nerves responsible for your distress.

Q—My granddaughter recently was bitten on her foot by a small red ant. Within a few minutes she almost passed out. She went limp. Her skin got all red and her face was so swollen you could hardly see her eyes. By the time the doctor came, she was somewhat better. I saw the ant myself so there's no doubt about what caused this reaction. Is this a common thing? Can anything be done to prevent a recurrence?

A—What you witnessed was an allergic response to the venom of the red ant. Not many persons exhibit this reaction, so it's not strange that you never heard about it before.

However, it's sufficiently understood to have attracted the attention of the Hollister-Stier Laboratories of 1810 Harrison St., Oakland, Calif. From them your doctor can obtain a solution for injection, prepared from the whole bodies of red ants.

With this, he may be able to desensitize your grandchild and, if he proceeds with great caution, he may successfully avoid any serious allergic reaction. Since another bite may produce another even more grave reaction if the child is not desensitized, the course of injections merits your most careful consideration.

Time of Your Life

Dear Arthur: I'm always amazed when you offer me a quick and easy way to solve a problem. You should see the way my men and women live in other parts of the world. They have to take care of themselves! So they learn how—and with very little complaining.

I'm a sociologist and the other day I was reading a report that an explorer named Lauder made in 1890. He was in Japan and reported on the conditions among the aged. I thought your readers might like to compare their circumstances.

"As I got closer I discovered a mass of white hair and two claws, almost like thin human feet with long hooked nails. I could hear someone breathing under that mass of white hair. I could not make out the shape of the human body. I touched the hair, and with a groan, two thin bony arms suddenly stretched out and clasped my hand. Nature could not have afflicted more evils on that wretched creature. She was nearly blind, deaf, dumb; she was apparently suffering from rheumatism which had crept up her body and stiffened her bony arms and legs. . . . She was neither treated nor taken care of by the village or her son, who lived in the same hut; but she was regarded as a worthless object and treated accordingly. A fish was occasionally flung to her."

Dr. P. L. Dear Arthur: The doctor my mother goes to seems like a quick to me. He keeps her running back to him every week. But mother never seems to feel any better.

What should I do? Dear Ozie: The first thing I'd do is to quit questioning the integrity of your mother's physician. Then talk over with your mother the nature of her condition. Finally, visit the doctor and find out what you can do to help your mother.

Dear Arthur: Is the increase in social security benefits applicable to everyone receiving them at this time? I have been retired for over four years and am receiving \$16 a month. Will this be increased?

Confused: You are not the only one who wonders about the new increase. Everyone who receives social security wants to know. So here's the answer for everyone: the increases apply only to minimum benefits and the sole surviving widow, widower or parent of insured deceased worker. If you have social security problems, write me about them in care of this paper.

Your Pocketbook

Consult a Lawyer When Needed; Follow These Tips "Do I need a lawyer?" I've had a host of such inquiries recently, usually from people who are already in trouble.

What strikes me is that many of these situations need never have developed had those involved known where to turn before they got into trouble.

Legal fees can be expensive, but legal advice can often save you money too. Get a lawyer when: You write a will, and when there is an estate that needs settling.

When you buy or sell real estate. When you form or dissolve a business.

When you enter into a verbal or written contract that involves substantial sums of money.

Often when you are threatened with a nuisance claim, a simple letter from a lawyer will restore peace.

When you become involved in a costly accident.

Annually, according to the National Research Bureau, Inc., we spend some \$2 billion on legal services. Lawyers themselves are the first to admit that a large portion of this amount would be saved if people would consult lawyers before, rather than after, they get into difficulty.

If impossible for you to meet the cost of your own lawyer, check whether there is a legal aid society in your area which could be of help to you.

If you wonder where you might find a lawyer, consult your phone directory to see whether there is a bar association in your vicinity. Frequently bar associations offer lawyer referral services. Check your bank or county courthouses.

Because of crowded court calendars and vacation closings you might be better off trying to arbitrate your case, especially in the case of suits involving auto accidents.

The American Arbitration Assn., with headquarters in New York, has 14 regional offices where you might apply. The A.A.A. maintains a file of 12,500 lawyers, business-nessmen and other specialists in 1,600 U.S. cities.

You and your opponent can file statements with the association. Arbitrators will be chosen and closed hearings arranged. Often the disputing parties are represented by their own lawyers. Since arbitration proceeds usually are speedier than court trials, they cut costs of settling claims. Once a hearing is adjourned an arbitrator has 30 days to reach his decision. His ruling generally is binding, cannot be appealed in court unless misconduct or bias is proven.

If you are debt ridden to the point of bankruptcy or facing garnishments of your pay, you may apply for help via the Wage Garnishment Plan. This plan is part of the National Bankruptcy Act of 1938. Get a lawyer to file for your protection under the Administrative Office of the U.S. courts. This is done for a \$15 fee at your local court. Your lawyer might charge \$150 for his services. Yet these costs are far less than the price of bankruptcy, and the court may help you plan your financial solvency for the future.

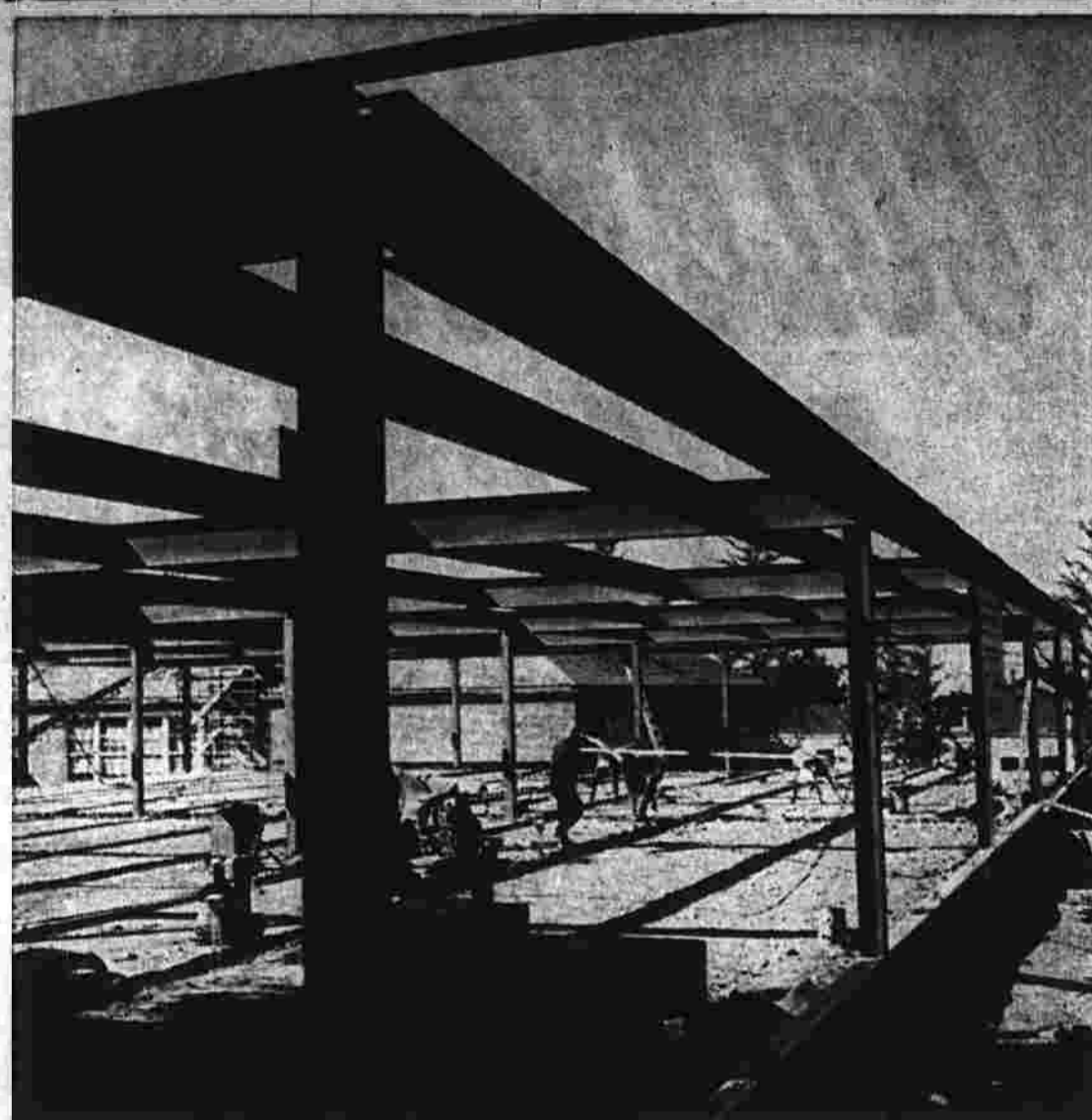

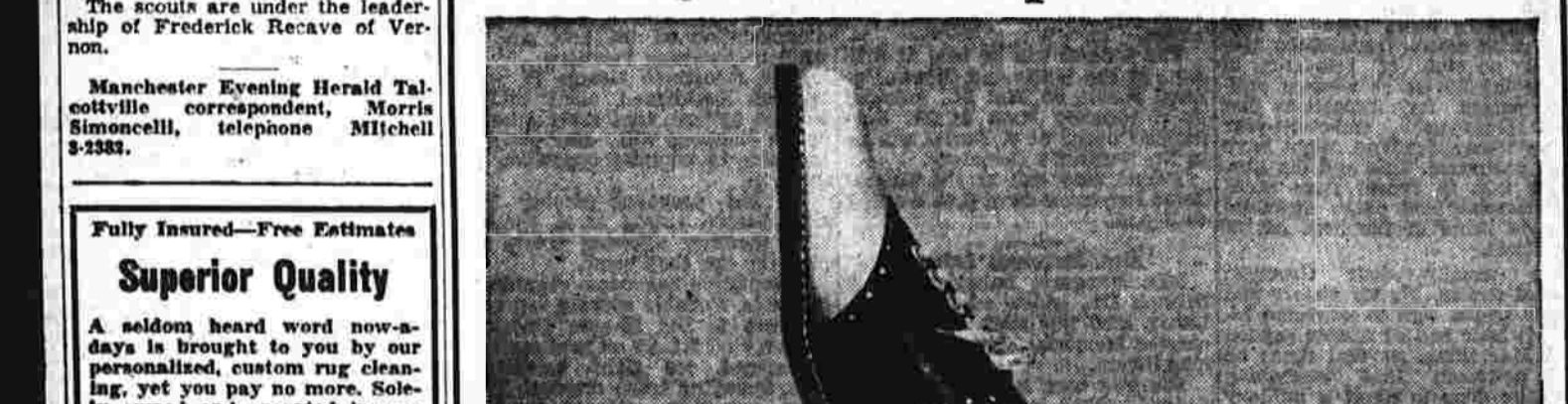

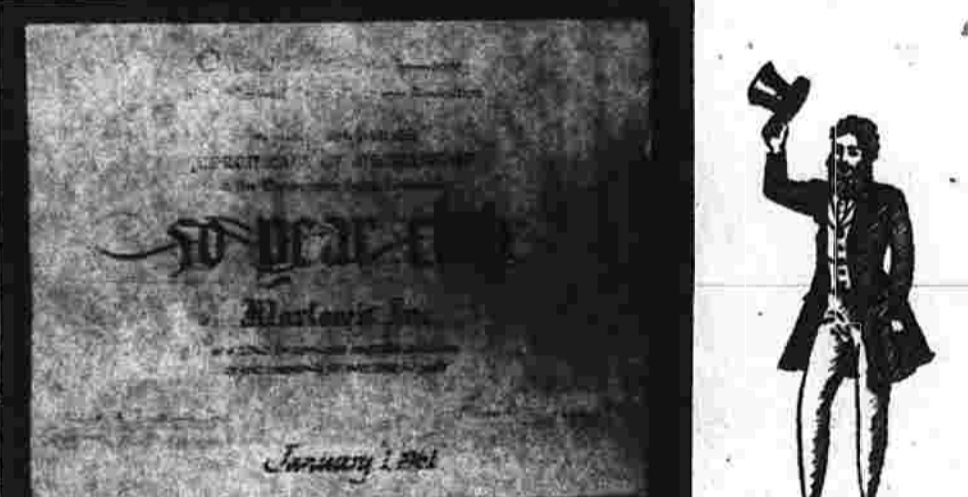

Johnson Carves Models of Ships He Sailed

By MARGE FLANN
Fred K. Johnson's lifelong romance with the sea has come to harbor at Lutz Junior Museum where his collection of superb models is now on display.
The 66-year-old retired seaman, who lives at 17 1/2 St. St., has loaned to the museum his own model designs of every ship on which he sailed.



"My craft is sailing on... 'tis good to sail upon the sea!"

In addition to Johnson's hand-crafted models, the current museum exhibit on sailing ships includes his well-kept collection, a display of knots, a collection of ship's carpenter's tools donated by Miss Hazel Lutz, and the single vertebrae of a whale donated by the Rev. E. Winslow, pastor of the Church of the Nazarenes.
During an illness three winters ago, Johnson, with the aid of a knife and his memory, started carving his first ship model. He made the dozen or more ships in this collection that winter, and hasn't made another since.
But just a year ago he spent Sunday sailing around Bam's Island off Nantuxet, and he was 13 years old. When he was 13 years old, Johnson spent summer vacations in his native Norway working as a deckboy on cutters and pilot ships.

Johnson has served as quartermaster or seaman aboard freighters, steamships and yachts, but neither remains his favorite. The Johnson collection of models includes prototypes of every class of vessel on which he sailed—sloop, bark, brigantine, two-, three- and four-masted schooners, fullriggers and a catamaran.
The seaman's longest voyage was aboard a three-masted fullrigger, the "Trifolgar," which in 1907 took 115 days to sail from London around Cape Horn to Melbourne, Australia. After three weeks ashore and a visit to Sydney, the ship loaded up cotton for a 98-day voyage back to Liverpool.
"In those days, we worked four hours on and four hours off, and we slept in three-deck bunks," the seaman recalled.
Johnson has sailed three of the five oceans—Atlantic, Pacific and Indian—as well as the North Sea, Norwegian Sea, White Sea near Russia, and the Mediterranean Sea. He also served aboard a government surveying ship on the Great Lakes.
He came to this country in 1912, and remembers when New York harbor was full of square riggers. He served aboard schooner transporting coal between Baltimore and Boston, and was quartermaster for the old Fall River line from New York City to Newport, R.I., and Fall River, Mass.
In 1914, Johnson was a seaman aboard the "Vagrant," a two-masted racing schooner, owned by Commodore Harold Vanderbilt, when that ship won the Bermuda race. He made his last trip across the Atlantic in 1915 as boatwain aboard the 6,000-ton "Narnax," a heavy steamer sent by John D. Rockefeller as a relief ship to Belgium.
Johnson served in the U.S. Army infantry during World War I and was discharged as a private first class, and in the U.S. Coast Guard Reserves during World War II at New London, advancing from seaman to oceanian.
After his World War I service, Johnson became chauffeur and caretaker for the late Frank Cheney Jr., whose home on Hartford Rd. is now the Susannah Wesley Hall property of South Methodist Church. Johnson retired five years ago after 39 years' employment.

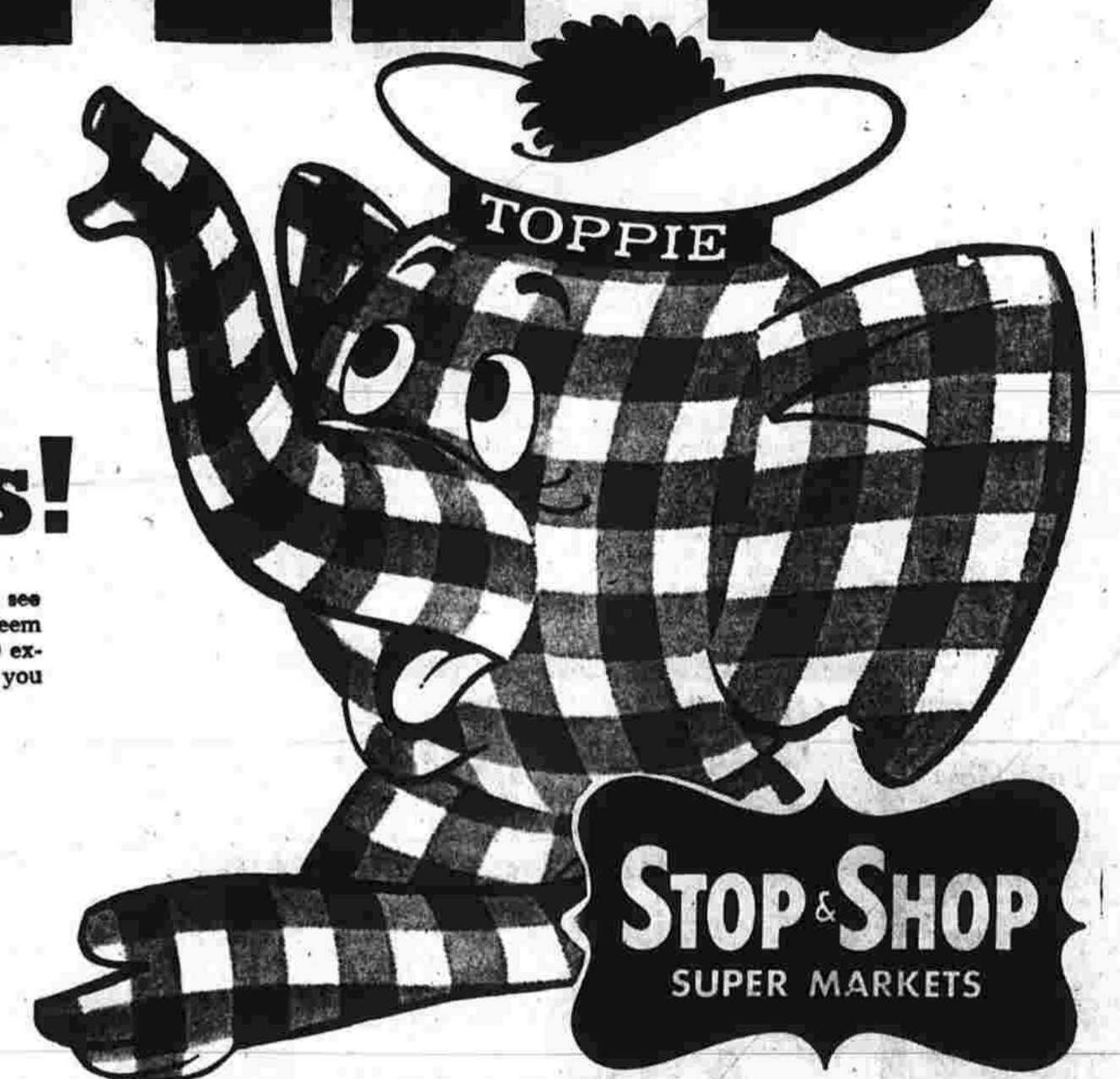
