No Machine Guns Used In Series on Twenties

The roar of the 20's is seen and heard weekly on television — generally to the tune of chattering machine guns and the squealing tires of bullet-proof sedans.

But there was more to the 20's than gangland wars and bathtub gin. People not only survived — they had fun while doing it.

The zany, wacky and zestful side of our most celebrated decade is the domain of "Margie," a new half-hour comedy that can be seen Thursday nights, ABC-TV.

Each week "Margie" centers around "Margie Clayton," a teenager of the 20's who lives in a small town. Her world is full of football games, the Charleston and open readers — preferably driven by the star quarterback.

Ethel Waters did a Route 66 show directed by veteran director and ex-jazz musician Jack Smight. Smight says Miss Waters, who has been in semi-retirement for years, didn't want to do the show. That's because she lately has turned to religion, so she objected to some of the jazz flavoring in the script.

She flatly refused to say some of the words the script called for (words such as "swing" and "having a ball"), because she felt they might be offensive to some of her religious friends. The script was changed.

Hollywood on TV

Hollywood, —(NEA) — Hugh O'Brian, wearing a lace-trimmed shirt and a floppy feather in his hat, was doing a minuetlike dance step and singing, "I'm a Man, a Man, a Man!"

We wouldn't have believed it unless we'd seen it. "Six years of bullets," as O'Brian expressed himself, had brought him to the first book-musical on TV since Betty Hutton, Bob Hope and several other big stars bombed out on the small screens in stories told with music. "I like contrast and variety," explained the man who made Wyatt Earp a household word.

Hugh O'Brian's "I'm a Man" song cue—he was rehearsing with Jane Powell for the Oct. 19 "Feathertop" special on ABC-TV—was necessary because just a few minutes before he had been a scarecrow hanging in a cotton field near New Orleans.

A witch, unhappy about not being invited to the governor's ball, turned the scarecrow into a man with the charm of Errol Flynn, the muscles of Hugh O'Brian, and the heart of a pawnbroker. Her idea is to have him fascinate the governor's daughter (Miss Powell) and then go back to scaring crows.

But love finds a way, with the help of song, and the trick is not to treat the unhappy witch. Johnny Marsh wrote the story. "Suggested but not based," he says, on a Nathaniel Hawthorne short story of old New England.

The music was written by Mary Rodgers, daughter of the famed Richard Rodgers. Mary once wrote a show titled "Once Upon a Mattress" for Broadway, but "Feathertop" was as close as she could get for television.

Instead of singing "I'm a Man," Hugh O'Brian may have preferred "I'm a Versatile Man," which his appearance in a TV musical amounted to. But it wasn't really necessary. Since filming of the last Wyatt Earp show—No. 264—the has been playing all sorts of nonwestern roles in upcoming TV shows.

He's retired as Earp, but not as O'Brian. "It's a nice change of pace," he explained, "and I'm really selling, more than singing, the songs—handing them like Bob Freston did in 'Music Man.'"

He will be singing (or selling) four numbers in "Feathertop," but his teaming with Jane Powell was overshadowed, in a way, by the fact that a sponsor was taking a chance on a book-musical.

Writer John Marsh beamed: "Even the head of one network asked me, 'How in the world did you ever sell the idea of a book-musical? They're supposed to be dead.'"

"My answer was that maybe TV is ready for a little light, gay, musical fun instead of violence. I'm sure it is ready. I'd like to see a whole cycle of book-musicals. The public is ready for them, and where else can TV go for material?"

In most cases when a TV series ends, the star rushes into a movie. Hugh said he's had the chances, but: "I now have a nice bank balance. I'm not going to do anything I don't believe in. I didn't believe in the movies I've been offered, so I'll just wait."

"If you want to grow as an actor you have to reach—and the higher I'm made to reach the better. I finished the Earp series on a Friday. On Monday morning I was on the phone to my agent to say, 'How come I'm not working?'"

Ex-fighter Maxie Rosenbloom has become a west coast radio commentator. Groucho Marx will do a dramatic role as star of "The Hold Out" on General Electric Theater this season. David Rose will write special music for and conduct the Danny Kaye Special on CBS-TV, Nov. 6. . . .
