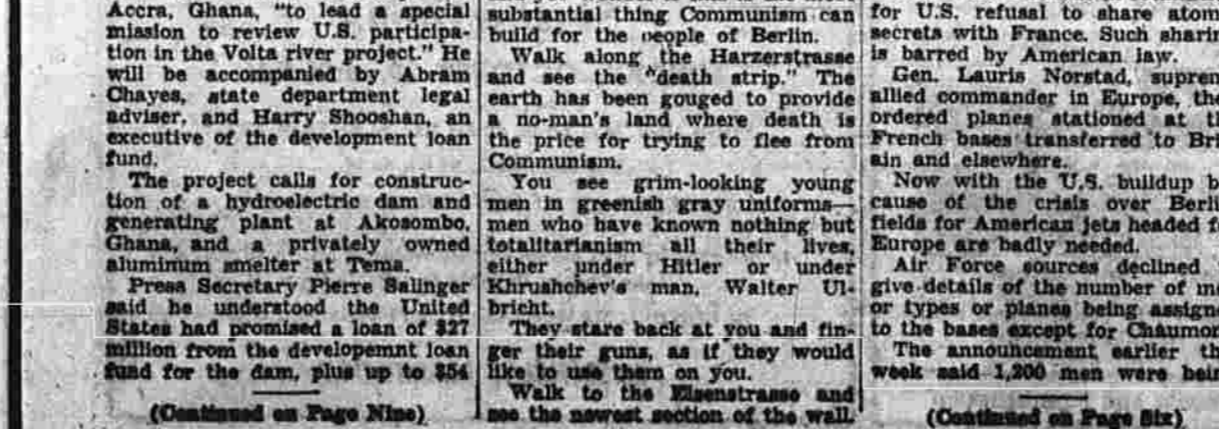
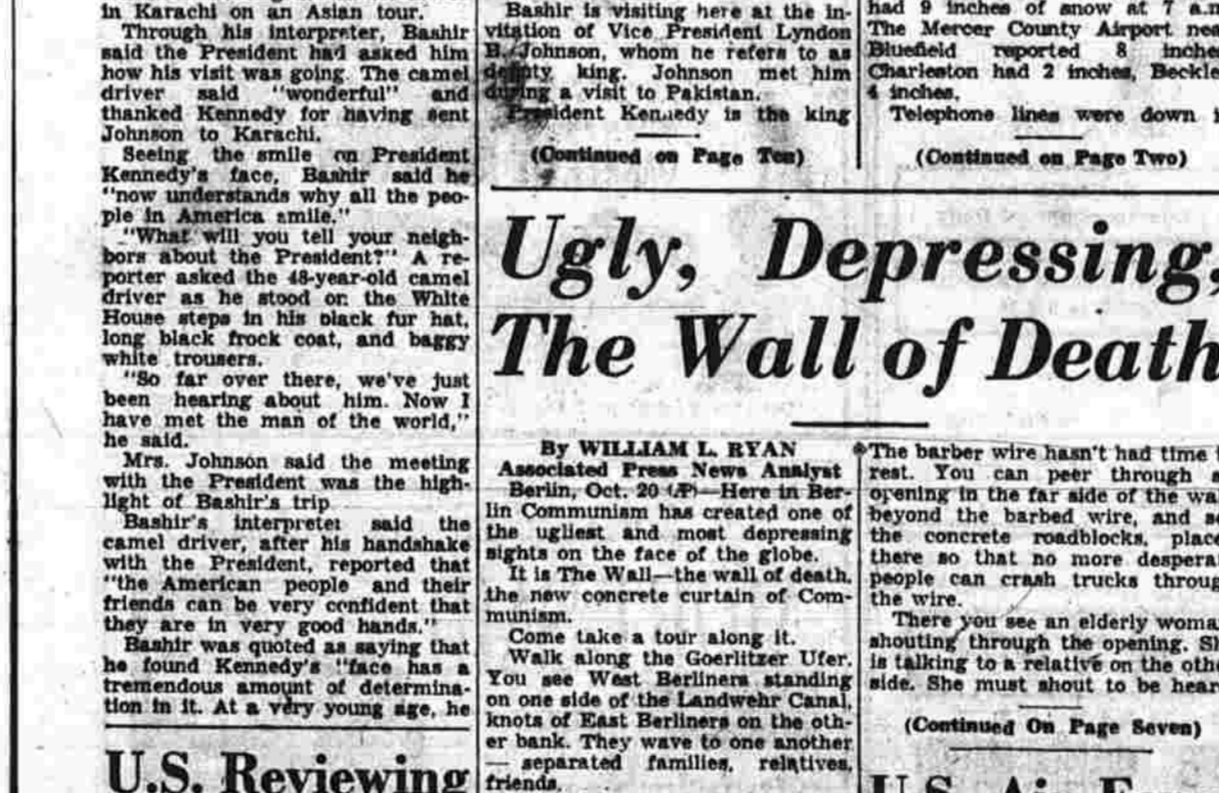

Stamps in the News

Early 1962 Stamp Schedule On April 11, a stamp will be released at Washington, D.C., to mark the centenary of the birth of Charles Evans Hughes, who served as governor of the state of New York, secretary of state and chief justice of the United States, according to Postmaster General J. Edward Day. Seven other special stamps have been scheduled for issuance early in 1962. The first will be a stamp marking the 50th anniversary of statehood for New Mexico, to be released at Santa Fe, Jan. 6. Issuance of each stamp at Santa Fe was proposed by Sen. Fabian Chavez, Jr., as Senate (State) Joint Memorial Resolution No. 1, and was endorsed by Tom Block, president of the New Mexico Service; Jack M. Campbell, speaker of the New Mexico House of Representatives; and Edwin L. Mechem, governor, among others. Commemorating the 50th anniversary of the statehood of New Mexico, a stamp will be issued Feb. 14, at Phoenix, Arizona. The understanding that such a stamp would be authorized was announced recently by Sen. Carl Hayden and Congressman

The Postmaster General has already announced a second stamp with a series of five stamps to be issued between the States, commemorating the centenary of the Battle of Gettysburg.

Another stamp for 1962 will be released May 20 to mark the centenary of the enactment of the Homestead Act, as signed by President Lincoln. This law made possible the development of much of the West.

Rockville-Vernon Phone Move Wins Support, Including That of SNET Co.

The proposal to push for a new telephone exchange service being set up in Rockville and Vernon at 8 p.m. at the Rockville-Vernon Telephone Exchange Co. is gaining support from all quarters, including the telephone company.

John H. Moffat, manager of the local business office, who met with a delegation from the Vernon Telephone Exchange Co. on Wednesday, said the company will announce soon a plan for additional service and the increased rates that will go with it.

He said if the plan is acceptable, the new installation can be in operation before the end of 1962, two years away.

Norman E. Chase, president of the Rockville Rotary Club, said Rotary's support can be sought in a poll of the membership Monday.

Chase said adding that businessmen in the Rockville and Ellington areas have signified they favor the expanded local service.

Charles H. Brown, chairman of the Vernon Fire District Zoning Commission, said he "supports it 100 per cent."

It should be a tremendous boon to the community," he said, "and a tremendous stimulus to business."

Frank B. Corvill, chairman of the VTB, said of the meeting with Moffat Wednesday that it displayed a feeling of the best cooperation.

Extended local services will not be installed here, Corvill said, but added that the increase in the monthly phone rate will be worth the additional service.

Extended local dialing would permit clients in the Vernon exchange to call into the Rockville exchange without paying toll charges.

Similarly, Mitchell and Hartford clients could call into the Vernon area free of tolls.

Mitchell said it should be made plain that the plan, if accepted by the users, would affect all clients in the Vernon exchange, which covers Rockville, most of rural Vernon, Tolland and Ellington.

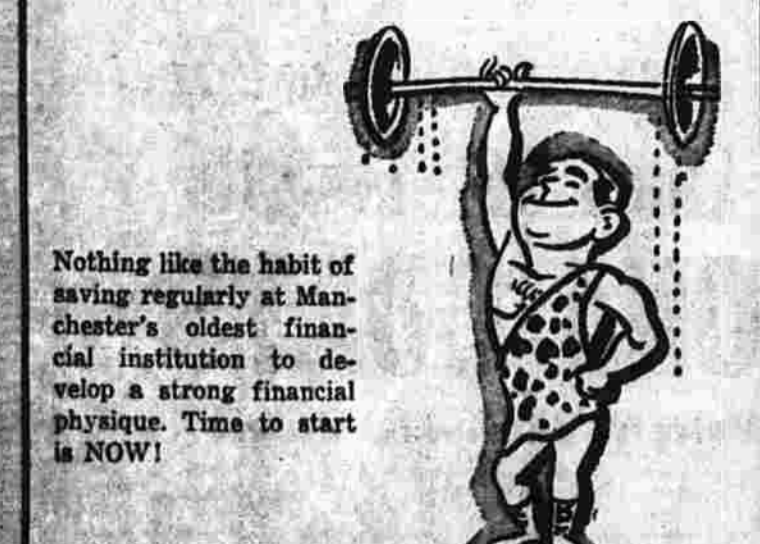

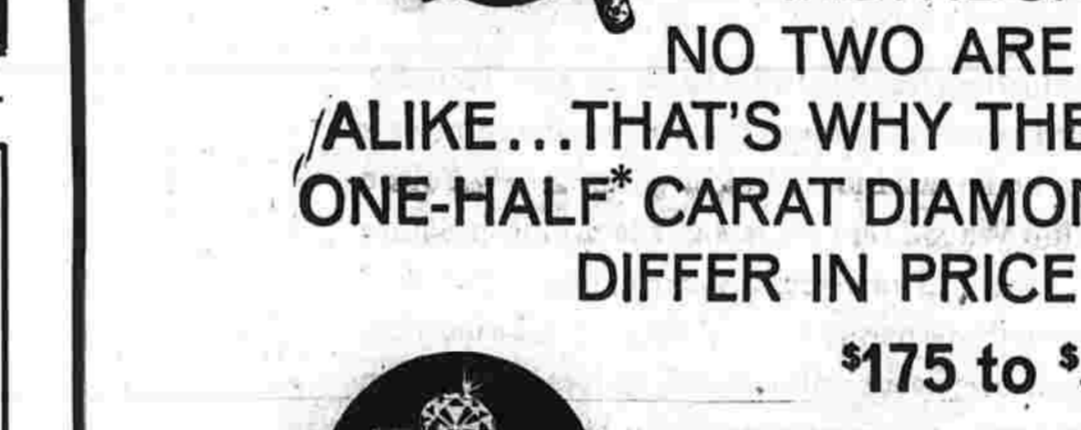

to "arrange themselves with urgency and speed" in efforts to meet the United Nations' prohibition of nuclear bomb testing.

This apparently was the result of Western insistence that the only way to halt tests was through a treaty. The United States said yesterday it was ready to sign a treaty now.

The move by the six neighbors of the Soviet Union to halt the United Nations' intervention to the Soviet superpower first became known last week. Aides of the United States reportedly had planned to introduce a similar resolution, but they apparently decided to leave the initiative to nations more likely to be affected by fallout from the giant blast.

A number of U.N. delegates have expressed the suspicion that Khrushchev had no intention of setting off the bomb. He has made dramatic announcements before the Communist Party Congress in Moscow, they believe.

Stevenson said the United States is ready to join Britain and Russia at the negotiating table.

"I pray we do not lose another chance to meet this challenge of our time and stop this United States nuclear test program," Stevenson said yesterday.

U.S. Ambassador Arthur E. Stevenson told the political committee yesterday that the United States purposes whatever in such weapons.

Rockville-Vernon CRPA Dump Study Weighs Suggestions to Cut Costs

Refuse transfer points—stations where refuse is mechanically compacted for hauling to a distant incinerator or other disposal area—may be the means of cutting trash transportation costs in a regional area.

Two weeks ago, Abe Nusdorf, a private incinerator for use by the seven towns joined in the study, or more.

He estimated a cost of \$4.00 a ton to the towns who would use the plant. All burnable refuse would be handled in the incinerator, Nusdorf said. Non-combustible materials, such as tree stumps and refrigerators, would have to be disposed of elsewhere by the participating towns.

The study committee told Nusdorf it cannot commit the towns to his proposal because the committee has no authority to do so. Incineration has been the focal point of discussion so far, and CRPA planners are compiling data from Hartford and East Hartford municipal incineration operations.

Chisholm, Chisholm and Robert D. Brown, chief CRPA planner, indicated the study is branching into the problem of collection and transportation because distances in the seven-town area may make hauling cost the major factor in the program.

Brown indicated the start will look into the feasibility of two, possibly three, disposal sites for the area.

Chisholm said further study of the transfer station idea will be made.

Combustible refuse could be compacted mechanically at each station for hauling by trailer truck to whatever disposal unit, or units, had been established for the towns.

By reducing the volume of refuse, hauling costs would be cut. Cost analysis of municipal refuse disposal would be done. Figures to light, he said.

For the 15-month period ending March 31, 133,477 tons of refuse were hauled into the Hartford incinerator and landfill area off Veterans Highway on the Connecticut River plain.

Of that amount, \$8,728 tons were incinerated and \$4,948 tons were non-combustible and had to be buried. The high amount of non-combustible material was due to bricks, garden, rubble and heavy wood pieces from Hartford's redevelopment program.

Total cost of operation for that period was \$28,718. The amount included annual principal payment of \$8,000 and interest of \$18,648.

Dividing the total cost by the tonnage of burnable material, a cost of \$2.38 a ton is achieved.

Dividing the total cost by the total tonnage of refuse, including non-combustibles, a cost of \$2.06 a ton is achieved.

It is 10 percent from incineration amounts to 10 percent by volume and 20 percent by weight.

Chisholm said the figures are no more than guides at present. More detailed data will be needed before the agency considers it significant in the northeast refuse study, he indicated.

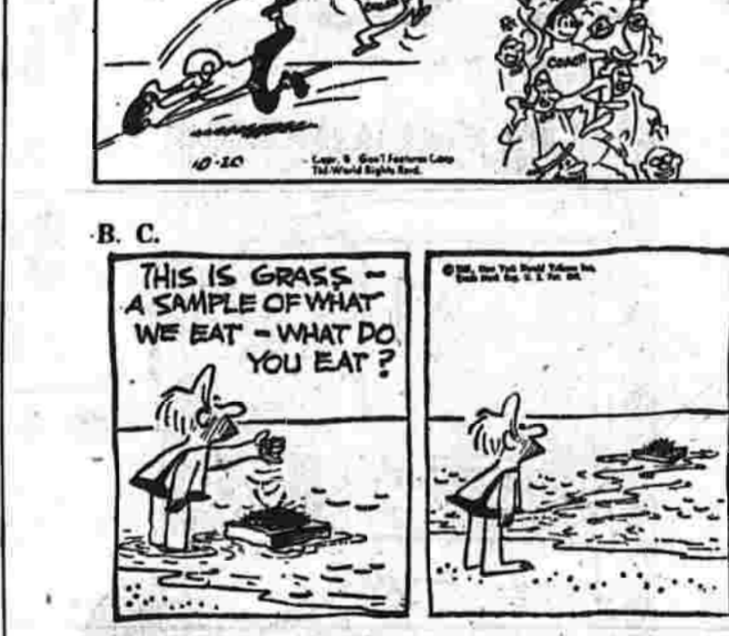

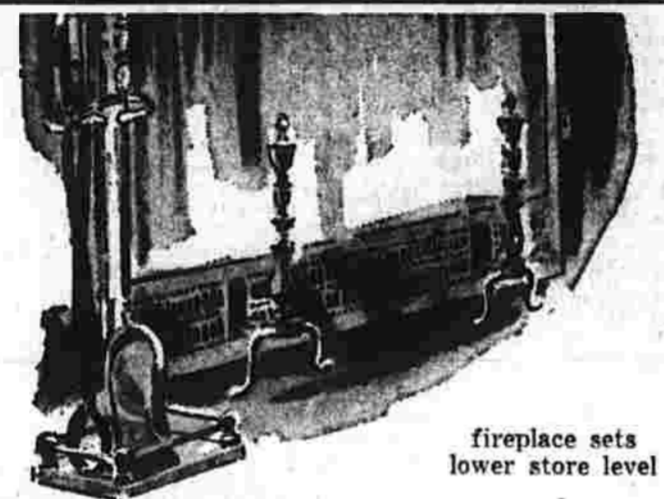
