This past week, the installation of the newest of compact switchboards was completed, and brought the Manchester Answering Service and its owner, Mrs. Betty Ruth Edwards, to maturity — to the goal line of up-to-date equipment in its "private secretary" type of operation.

More than 110 clients, one being The Herald with its 24-hour want ad innovation, are served by the two new boards.

Mrs. Edwards said that "With the installation of our new switchboards by the Southern New England Telephone Co., we have reached goal, however, with SNETCO making such strides in the telephone equipment and techniques, we shall be ever watchful for a post-graduate course."

Incoming and outgoing calls each month number about 12,000 with four to five thousand messages being recorded, stamped with the exact time they are received and put into individual cubby holes with no chance of a message being mislaid.

The firm, which is a member of Answer America and the Associated Telephone Exchanges, works with four shifts of operators and is receiving and making some 12,000 calls a month, of which four to five thousand messages are recorded for clients.

"We not only handle 'Want Ad' calls for The Herald which average about 125 a month, but we have a 'wake-up' service for WINF in which we call some 100 persons every morning of the week," Mrs. Edwards said.

"Other calls beside our business calls come from persons asking for the correct time, children wanting to know the answer to a homework problem, and various information questions," she added.

The new switchboards are equipped to handle 200 calls, 100 on each board. The boards which now bring four of our former pieces of equipment into one unit is a dream come true," Mrs. Edwards said. The new board is 2 1/2 feet high and slightly over 10 feet wide, including the clients message slots. Industry business-people and doctors are listed as clients.

On emergency, the chairman of member answering service can connect the doctor with the patient.

Future plans for the service, which acts as a "private secretary" for the members, include the SNETCO condenser identifier, which would enable the board to contact out-of-town areas direct, Mrs. Edwards said.

When a comedian is funny, he attributes his success to his own abilities, but when he bombs, he blames his writers.

The precarious world of the comedy writer is explored each week on "The Dick Van Dyke Show," a new half hour comedy series (Tuesday nights, CBS-TV).

Handsome Dick Van Dyke stars as Rob Petrie, head writer for Alan Brady, a fictional television personality.

Van Dyke, recently the toast of Broadway as the star of the hit musical "Bye, Bye Birdie," brings his singing, dancing and pantomimic talents to television for the first time in a series although he has appeared on every major variety show and starred in the much acclaimed two-hour long special "The Fabulous Fifties."

Rounding out the writing team are two television veterans, Morry Amsterdam and Rosemarie.

As Buddy Sorrell, Amsterdam is the old-school gag writer whose head is crammed with one and two liners. At any time he's apt to come up with something like—"This room is so small you have to go next door to change your mind." Buddy's proclivity for such jokes frequently brings him into conflict with Rob who, in college educated and has more refined ideas about comedy.

Rosemarie portrays writer Sally Rogers, a single girl on the prowl for a husband. Her only problem is that she overpowers and destroys prospective mates with her razor sharp humor. After meeting Sally, a man's only consolation is that he can chuckle as he puts his ego back together.

Carl Reiner, who achieved fame in classic comedy sketches with Sid Caesar, is the creator, producer and writer of the show which is being made in conjunction with Danny Thomas and Sheldon Leonard's production company in Hollywood.

In addition to being a gifted performer, Reiner is also a highly talented writer. He has written for Sid Caesar and Dinah Shore and has sold a movie script and published a novel titled "Enter Laughing," which is currently being adapted for Broadway. Because of his busy production and writing schedule, Reiner will not appear in the series.

Stories for "The Dick Van Dyke Show" are not devoted exclusively to the working activities of the writers. Some episodes deal with the home life of Rob Petrie, his lovely wife Laura, portrayed by beautiful Mary Tyler Moore, and their five-year-old son Ritchie, played by Larry Mathews.

Every effort has been made to produce a program of high quality, including the introduction of a unique production schedule, which calls for complete run-throughs of each script on two successive nights. Audiences are present at each session and three cameras, rather than one, film the action.

The first, or "preview" night, is employed as a guide to audience reaction. Based on the response of the "preview" audience, story changes are made which permit the improvement of each episode before it is filmed the following night.

The three-camera technique is used by a few other series but "The Dick Van Dyke Show" is the only program which incorporates the "preview" aspect in its production plans.

The laughter heard on the show is the honest response of the audience. No canned laughter is used.

Dick Van Dyke first broke into television with a Garry Moore type morning show in Atlanta, Ga. This morning show was extremely popular and, after a few years, Dick received an attractive offer in New Orleans to do the same kind of television program. It was while doing this show that Dick was auditioned by CBS.

Impressed by his versatility and good looks, CBS put him under contract.

Van Dyke eventually replaced Jack Paar on his morning show, and he also filled in for Garry Moore. Although he has worked extensively in daytime TV, Dick has appeared on almost every big variety show including Ed Sullivan's, Perry Como's and Jack Paar's.

After establishing himself in television, Van Dyke decided to give the theater a whirl. Despite the fact that he had never taken a singing or dancing lesson, he was well received by critics in his first Broadway show, a revue called "The Boys Against the Girls" which also starred Bert Lahr, Nancy Walker and Shelley Berman.

Under the guidance of director Gower Champion, Dick received his first professional dancing training and emerged as a major musical comedy star in "Bye Bye Birdie."

As a jack of all arts and a family man, Dick's little leisure time is divided among paintings, shooting home movies, racing miniature sportcars on a twenty foot track, studying Stan Laurel and Cary Grant movies in his home, and, when time permits, eating every fattening food known to man in a fruitless effort to gain weight.

And, actually, Holliman got all his training in Hollywood.

You'll see him next on CBS' "The Dispossessed," a major dramatic work scheduled for Oct. 24.

"I come from small towns in Louisiana and Texas," Holliman says. "At 6, I decided I wanted to be an actor — maybe because of some feeling of rejection. Not rejection by the folks who adopted me — I was adopted when I was a week old — because I was their only child and the house was full of love. But some kind of rejection."

"Anyhow, I'm trying to say that where I grew up, the movies were the only kind of theater I knew. I saw the stars and knew they were loved and respected. To me, actors meant movie actors. I had never heard of Broadway — except for references to it in movies."

"So when I grew up, my thoughts were automatically centered around Hollywood. I ran away at 15 to Hollywood. I came back home when I realized it was futile, but I went there again after I was in the Navy for a few years."

So Holliman is a complete Hollywood product. And his point is that if you think he's a good actor — which he is — Hollywood gets the credit.

### Molly's New Role Could Be Cousin

Gertrude Berg, who made the character of Molly Goldberg a modern folk figure, is back in television in the role of a woman who could be Molly's first cousin.

Mrs. Berg plays a grandmother named Sarah Green who enters college as a freshman in a new comedy series, "Mrs. G. Goes to College," Wednesdays (9:30-10 p.m., CBS-TV).

Mrs. Berg herself struck the inevitable comparison between Sarah and Molly, a character she played first in 1929 on radio and later for five years on television.

Here is how she sized them up: "Sarah Green is perhaps a little more worldly. She had a little better education than Molly, and less of a hard time financially over the years. Sarah, you might say, is Molly's uptown cousin."

As she did with "The Goldbergs," Mrs. Berg again will write for the show in which she stars, creating the characters she loves.
