cause genetic changes. If you live at an altitude of one mile, as in Denver, you are hit by twice as many cosmic rays as persons at sea level.

"We will breathe radioactive gases from radium and thorium in the ground, and in rocks, in cement and in brick, about you constantly with X rays."

All of this unavoidably adds up to an average exposure of about 300 millirem of radiation in 30 years of living. Röntgenians are a measure of radiation intensity. An officer X ray of the chest exposes you to 1/10th to 1/20th of one roentgen.

A 5 per cent increase in radiation due to bomb test fallout means that in 30 years the average person would get exposed to about 1 1/2 of a roentgen more.

But there are other important considerations beyond this (Tomorrow: Fallout and effects on heredity).

Visiting Nurses Are Angels in Navy Blue

By DOBIE BELZING

Checked the house, looked into the room after the new addition to the family was brought home from the hospital.

The baby had not been fed or bathed, and she was completely unorganized. The young mother was nervous and distraught to the point of tears. The nurse who had come to offer advice and assistance, could not quite cope with the handling of so young a child.

Suddenly the door bell rang, and a member of the Manchester Public Health Nursing Association (MPHNA) came in to offer her professional services. Within a matter of minutes, what seemed to be an impossible situation was completely organized. The baby, her mother and mother-in-law were well regulated atmosphere.

This is one of the very important services offered to the residents of Manchester. A courtesy call sponsored by the Manchester Memorial Hospital is made by the MPHNA the day after the mother discharges from the hospital. More than one new mother has referred to these nurses as "angels in navy blue."

The MPHNA has been active in Manchester for years. Originally, it was located in a house across the street from the hospital. It moved into its present quarters when the hospital wing is now occupying complete blocks.

Mrs. Rachel Barnes, supervisor of nurses for MPHNA, stated that the association feels very fortunate in being so closely identified with the hospital. Referral patients meet the nurses and become acquainted with their duties before leaving for their homes. Only patients at the hospital have the privilege of discussing their needs with the visiting nurses.

Started Milk Station

Five hospital-sponsored clinics are staffed by the MPHNA. The well baby and pediatric clinic, for children from infancy to 17 years of age; a medical and surgical clinic, a tumor clinic, a chest clinic, and an obstetric clinic.

During the first World War, many young men were unable to pass the physical requirements necessary to become a member of the armed services. Mrs. William Cheney and a group of volunteers felt that proper nutrition and supervision of children's health would result in healthier adults. They started a milk station in a house adjacent to the hospital. Infants and children were weighed, given milk when necessary, and their physical conditions checked. The mother was the forerunner of the well baby and pediatric clinic now held the first and third Tuesday of the month at 9 a.m.

Children attending the clinic for the first time are given a complete physical examination. On subsequent visits all their medical needs are catered to. This includes immunization shots and vaccinations. All clinics supported by Manchester Memorial Hospital, and staffed by the MPHNA, are open

patients have highly praised the comfort they have given them and their families have been most grateful for the saving in expense.

Nurses on the MPHNA are available to any family in town where there is illness and a temporary need for such articles.

Classes for expectant mothers are held each Wednesday at 2 p.m. at the Manchester Memorial Hospital. The MPHNA offers a First Aid course which will start this month. Information may be obtained regarding this class by calling the office of the MPHNA in the hospital.

A widowed mother of two teenagers was stricken with a crippling disease. Word of her plight was brought to the attention of the MPHNA which investigated her needs and offered the loan of a bicycle to her. The family accepted and she found that they can care for their mother in a more professional manner.

The bed, together with many other articles needed when there is illness in the home, may be found in the Loan Closet maintained by the MPHNA.

The contents of the Loan Closet have been donated by individuals and organizations in the community, and may be borrowed, free of charge, by the people of Manchester.

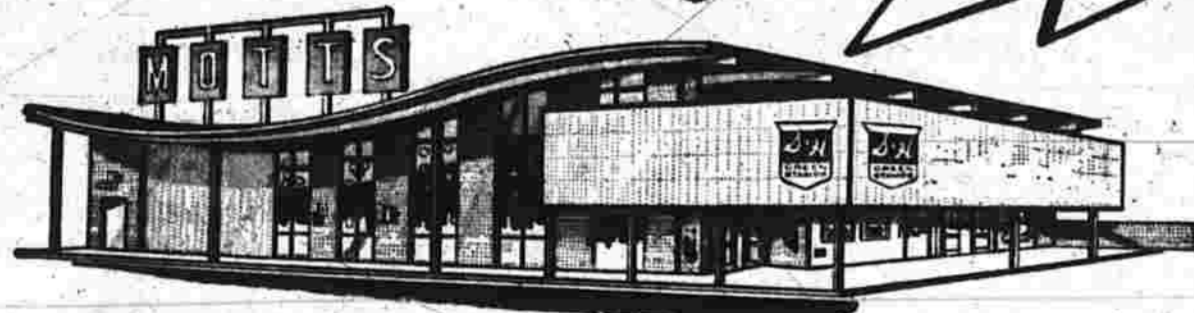

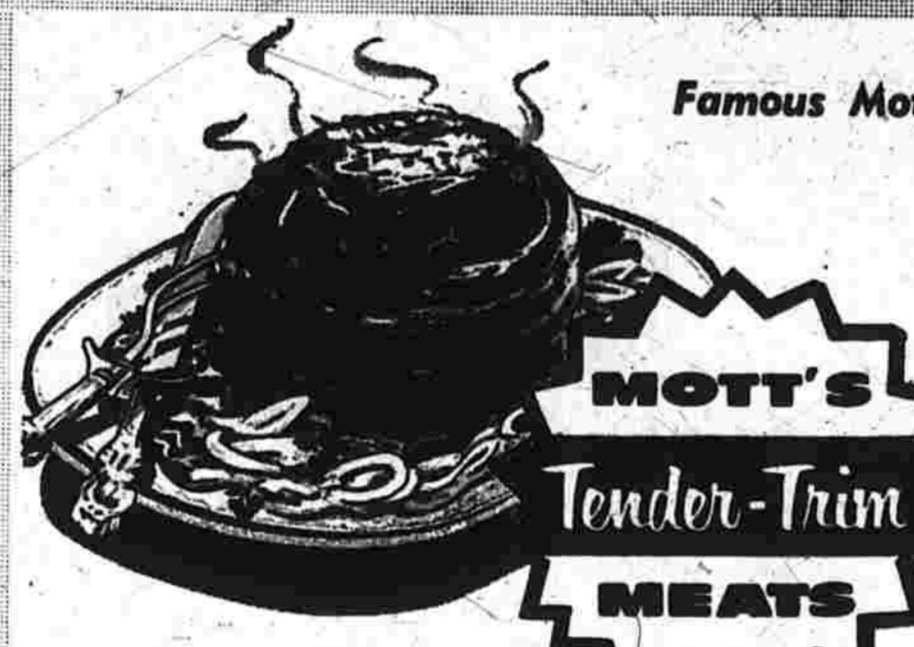

"Originally," Michaelis says, "we planned to take Dana with us, although he was only five years old then, we felt it would be a valuable experience for him if he were to go."

"Unfortunately," however, we were away by friends who told the boy might get sick. At the last minute we cancelled his reservation and left him home.

But it seems Nehru was expecting the young boy. When Michaelis and his wife first met the prime minister at a tea in New Delhi, Nehru's first question was "Where is your boy?"

Michaelis answered: "We felt it best not to bring him this time. He is at home."

Nehru replied: "We would have taken good care of your son."

When the Michaelis returned home, Nehru presented them with one of two gold wreaths given to the prime minister on his previous birthday by the children of India. The wreath was for Dana.

During the next two years, Michaelis and Nehru corresponded. When Nehru arrived in the United States last year for the 15th U.S. General Assembly session attended by numerous heads of state, the prime minister invited Michaelis and his son Dana — to breakfast at New York's Carlyle Hotel.

Dana and Nehru exchanged few words but, throughout the five minutes the Indian leader conversed with Michaelis, he kept his arm around the boy.

"Hugging me or holding my hand," Dana says. "He is a very nice man, a kind man, a grandfatherly man."

"I think he liked me."

As they stood talking in the hotel room, Dana looked up and noticed that Nehru was not wearing a hat. In all photos Dana had seen of the prime minister, Nehru always wore a hat. So the boy said: "Mr. Nehru, why don't you wear your hat? It's so becoming."
