Diplomatic informants said Gizenga is directing a mutiny against the central government authority in Kinshasa, the Kivu provincial capital of the secessionist province of Katanga.

Informants were reported to have created serious disorders in the North Katanga city of Albertville.

A spokesman for the U.N. said it intends to put down lawlessness by force if necessary.

Diplomatic sources said the left-wing politician set himself up in Kinshasa last Saturday, leaving his former stronghold at Stanleyville in the Oriental Province to one-time allies who now adhere to the Leopoldville government.

Gizenga, who once accepted the post of vice premier in Premier Cyrille Adoula's Central Government here, made his declaration open and apparently final yesterday when he forced two of his former allies, Gen. Victor Kasongo and Christophe Gbenye, out of Kinshasa in fear of their lives.

Mutinous soldiers at Kindu refused to hand over 13 Italian air planes they had arrested on a Belgian Saturday.

Landlord Gbenye had gone to get the Italian fleet.

Gizenga's defiance of the United Nations was reported one day after U.N. investigators came to the mission—in another development which said that in all probability Lumumba and two of his aides were killed last January in the presence of Katangese secessionist leader Moïse Tshombe.

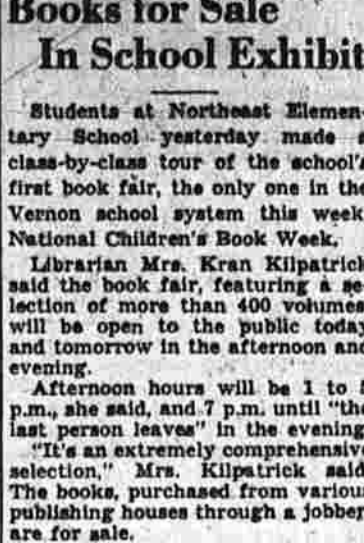

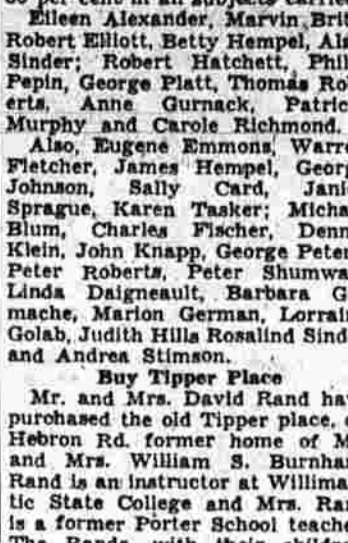

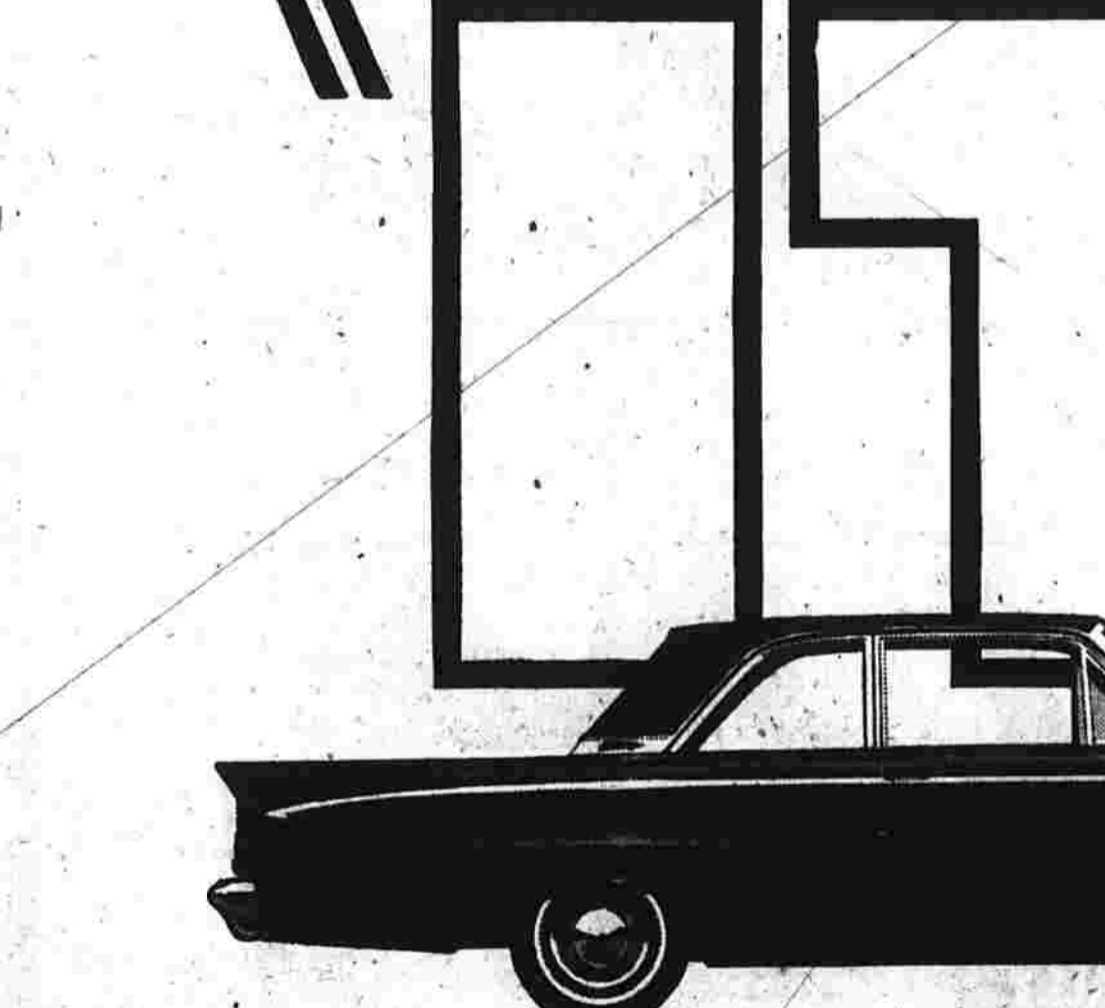

Emphasis On Health By the Associated Press Intelligence, a new technique to avoid scars from burns and healthy executives figure in the medical news.

Intelligence Factor: When older people stay healthy and vigorous, there does not seem to be any decline in their intelligence with the advancing years, says Dr. Robert W. Klemmner, Washington University psychologist. He gave intelligence tests to persons aged 65 to 80. He found no evidence for the idea that in a normal and steady intellectual decline with the years. But in those who were seen to die, regardless of age, the tests picked up a sharp drop in performance.

Burns Without Scars: For severe burns, a Belgian plastic surgeon uses a void new technique which he reports avoids scars and deformities. Under anesthesia, Dr. Jean Leclere of Brussels, Belgium, burned a rat's skin with a high-temperature cauterizer. A month after the scalding, the skin has been restored, and is nearly all hair.

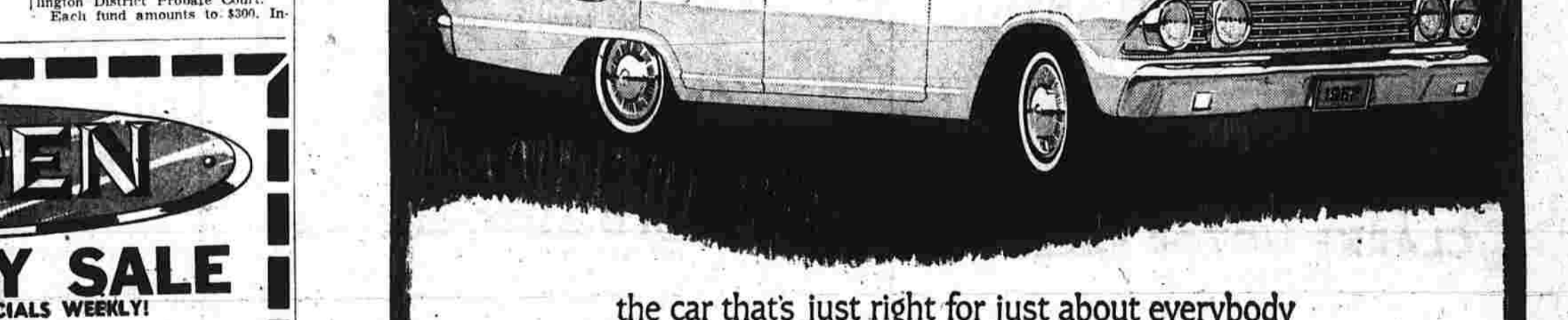
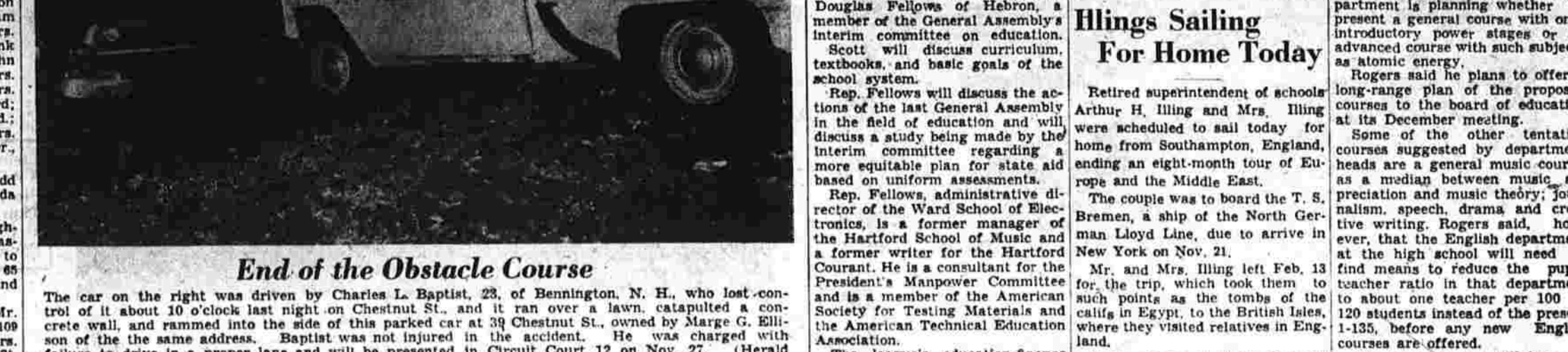
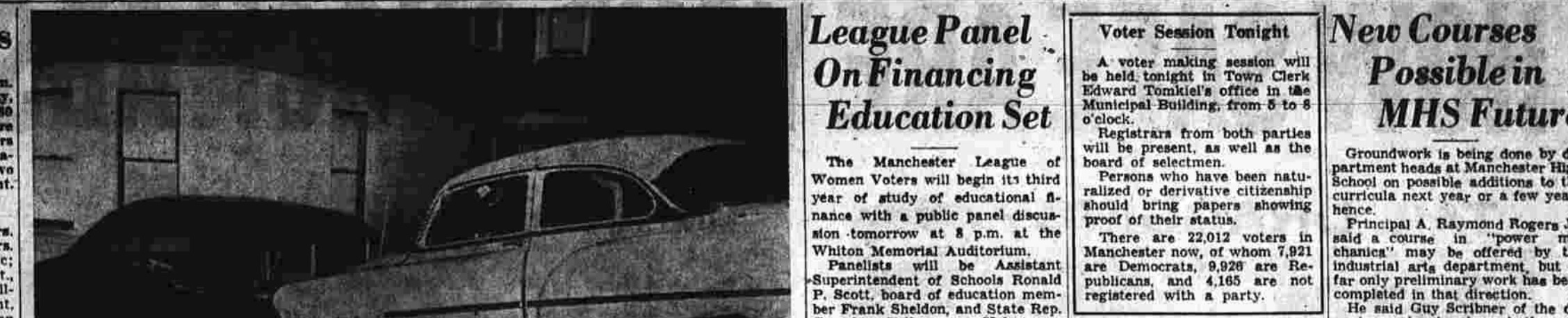

Packer Truck Bought, Joins Trash Pickup

The packer truck that the town's garbage collection contractor wanted has been bought, and it is already speeding the collection of rubbish this week during the annual fall rubbish collection, according to a spokesman for the public works department.

Five packer trucks, instead of the usual four, are on the road today. In addition, two pickup trucks operated by town highway division men are collecting un-packerable rubbish for a total of eight trucks on the road. All rubbish will be picked up by Friday night, said the spokesman.

The board of directors last week authorized the public works department to buy the truck, and waived the requirements for bidding to permit the immediate purchase of the packer truck from the Equipment Service Co. of Hartford for \$24,000.

A representative of the contractor, the E. J. Haverly Co., today picked up maps of the town showing where five routes could be established, instead of the present four routes.

The contractor told town officials last month that unless five routes were established, he wouldn't be able to make combined collection of garbage and rubbish unless the town bought the extra packer truck, he said.

The agreement on the basis of five routes was made in August between the town and the Haverly Co. Town officials were upset a couple of weeks ago when Haverly drew to their attention the fact that the truck hadn't been purchased and as a result no experimental route had been set up.

This present collection of garbage alone by the Haverly Co. is supposed to be a three-month trial period for combined collection of garbage and rubbish, beginning Dec. 1.

Now, however, the combined collection has been postponed until at least Feb. 1, and probably March 1.

The Doctor Says

 A team of heart specialists, writing at the Los Angeles College of Medical Evangelists and the John Wesley County Hospital under the auspices of the National Institute of Health, have issued a "Graded Activity Program for Safe Return to Self-Care after a Myocardial Infarction (Coronary Thrombosis)."

The purpose of this program is to avoid the harmful effects of prolonged bed rest; to restore the patient's self-confidence, in his ability to take care of himself; to provide electrocardiographic monitoring, to prevent "unsafe levels of activity."

The following modification of the program may be used for hospitalized patients by the investigators. It is tentatively suggested for those patients who come by their own physicians. It is to be followed on the third and fourth days after the attack and proceed gradually, as outlined below.

Activity Level 1 (In bed). Wash face, brush teeth, get breakfast. Move with assistance from bed to chair, and vice versa. Rest 15 minutes.

Activity Level 2 (In bed). Repeat each of the following exercises 10 times. Lying flat, take deep breaths. Move shoulders in all directions. Sit up on elbows 6 times with knees stiff. Raise left leg 5 inches with knee stiff. With leg in this position, raise right leg 5 inches with knee stiff. With right leg in this position, raise left leg 5 inches with knee stiff. Then the other at knee. Sitting at edge of bed, move shoulders in all directions. Bring hands together over chest, extend each leg 5 times.

Activity Level 3 (Out of bed). Sit at bedside on sponge bath. Put on robe and slippers. Walk forward and return 10 times. If comfortably accomplished, repeat 10 times.

Activity Level 4 (As level 3, but substitute trousers for bedsheet and increase length of walk to 100 feet).

Activity Level 5 (Repeat 5 but substitute shoes for slippers).

Activity Level 6 (Repeat 5 but increase length of walk to 150 feet and down 3 or 4 steps. If comfortably accomplished, visit other rooms on same floor).

Here are safeguards that must be observed:

- Do not start the program or advance from one to another level without the knowledge and consent of the physician-in-charge.
- Do not walk until you feel tired or dizzy, or until you have some faintness or lightheadedness following the acute attack.
- Allow at least 20 minutes for the heart to recover more than a single activity in any one day.
- If you omit activities on weekends, do not walk more than 100 feet or your pulse rate exceeds 100 per minute.
- Do not count on completing the program in less than four weeks from the date of the original attack.
