




Benjamin Soloist Wednesday Night

The first concert of the season by the Manchester Civic Orchestra will be heard Wednesday evening at the high school.

Founded last year and jointly sponsored by The Herald and Station WJHF, the orchestra comprises nearly 70 instrumentalists, residents of Manchester and surrounding communities.

Barry Benjamin, member of the Hartford Symphony, will be soloist in the 3rd Horn Concerto by Mozart. He is a member of the Hartford Conservatory of Music faculty, and was previously a member of the Coast Guard Academy Band at New London.

His wife, Jeannie Benjamin, is the new concertmaster of the organization, and will likewise be featured in one number, together with several other "first-deck" personnel of the orchestra. The selection is the Brandenburg Concerto No. 2 by Bach, with which the program will be opened.

John Gruber, Herald music critic and soloist, who conducts the orchestra, explains that this work is seldom performed, because, as originally conceived, it contained a part for high, antique trumpet, unavailable on today's instruments.

A modern trumpet has been designed to replace the old one, but the local orchestra does not have a performer on this instrument. Consequently the part will be played on clarinet, as transcribed by Mr. Gruber. This was the customary procedure, all through the 19th century, when there were no instruments of the trumpet family capable of playing the part.

Schubert's "Unfinished" Symphony, Saint-Saens' Prelude to "La Deluge," and the ever-popular "Marche Slave" by Tchaikowsky will round out the program. Gruber says that the orchestra is showing marked improvement over last year, and that it is becoming more flexible both in tone and rhythm.

Tickets for the performance are available from any member of the orchestra, from members of the high school band, and at Ray Bell's Music Shop on Main St. They will also be available at the door the evening of the performance.

# Old Fashioned Humor On Bob Newhart Show

With more and more sick, sick comics infecting so many facets of the entertainment field today, it's most refreshing to see that the television industry is at least trying to clear the atmosphere. Down to earth good old fashion Yankee humor with a spicy tinge of the satirical flows over the air waves each Wednesday night 10-10:30 p.m. NBC-TV in the person of Bob Newhart on "The Bob Newhart Show."

It's wholesome humor, presented in classical style, by the fellow next door.  
NBC's programming deserves a star this season for presenting two nice guys back to back. Following the Perry Como Show, Bob Newhart could not have been scheduled in a more ideal spot.

Despite the fact he has been on the entertainment scene for less than three years, Bob's income by the end of this year should reach the quarter million mark. Pretty good for a guy who less than four years ago was discouragingly working away as an accountant—and a poor accountant at that he readily admits. It was his distaste for the job that motivated him to put extra efforts into his attempt to become an entertainer.

Now drawing on his unhappy experience as an accountant, we laugh with him as he explains, "That I know I could never get anywhere as an accountant for I believed if you came within a dollar or two, you were doing all right."

Fortunately, he doesn't take the same attitude in the writing and developing of his routines.

"I've spent as much as a month on one monologue," Bob says, "Very often I may work for hours on end and then have to walk away from it."

It's easy to see from this why Bob is a comedian and not an accountant.

Bob owes a good deal of thanks to a discerning disc jockey in Chicago who became so enthusiastic about Bob's material and delivery

that he brought him the attention of Warner Bros. Records. As a result, his first album was released in April 1960. By the end of that year the album and its sequel "The Button Down Mind Strikes Back," reached best seller sales brackets.

He first drew national TV attention in 1960 when he appeared on

the Emmy Awards program from Hollywood featuring two of his recorded monologues.

NBC has been after him to do a television series, but at first Bob was reluctant. A succession of nightclub dates, however, quickly changed his mind.

"Although I'm a bachelor waiting for the right girl to come along, nightclub life was not for me. There's no home life. After the performance there's usually nothing to do but return to the hotel or motel all with the same lousy pictures," said the diffident satirist.

"It was my dislike of night club life plus NBC's coming through with an offer I couldn't refuse that

sold me on the television series," Bob said with a smile.


"I've been promised no sponsor interference, and I've gotten an excellent time slot, right after Perry Como," Bob continued.

Of course one major problem in doing a TV series such as Bob's is keeping pace from week to week with fresh, entertaining materials.

"I will not be able to write all my material as in the past, but a regular show will open up new areas for me. The shows will be built around me, not on me. We will be able to do sketches with guest stars etc.," Bob explained.

Roland Kibbee, who has worked on movies and at one time wrote for the late Fred Allen is the chief writer on the show aside from Newhart.

Bob says his youngest sister is his best audience; his mother, the toughest. Now on network television, his family of admirers is countless.

## New Panel Game To Debut Jan. 2

"Your First Impression," a new panel game show in color, will make its debut on the NBC-TV Network Tuesday, Jan. 2, 1962, it was announced today by Robert Aaron, director of television daytime programs for the network.

Two of the three panel members will be Dennis James and George Kirgo. The third, a woman, will be announced later, as will the name of the moderator.

The new half-hour color broadcast, which will originate on the West Coast, will be seen Mondays through Fridays in the noon (EST) time spot in place of "Truth or Consequences," which will move to 12:30 p.m. "It Could Be You," now seen at 12:30, will go off the air.

"Your First Impression" is a guessing game in which three panelists, aided by a moderator, try to identify a mystery guest from a "possible" list of five people of the same sex. Clues to the name of one hidden guest will be provided by asking the unseen person to give first impressions, or word associations, when presented with a single word (such as "home," "almighty" or "childhood") or with an incomplete sentence ("My biggest fear is...").
