Izvestia Publishes Kennedy Interview

There would be nothing that would disturb the relations between the Soviet Union and the United States.

On another important point of East-West conflict, Kennedy told the Russian editor:

"If we are able to achieve an agreement on cessation of nuclear tests, that would bring other agreements on disarmament."

Kennedy granted the exclusive interview last Saturday in Havana, Cuba, and it was published in Moscow today. The White House thereupon released a transcript.

The interview took up 10 solid columns in Izvestia, a fact the White House took as an indication it had been carried in full despite the fact that the interview was never before given publicly in the Soviet Union.

The White House said it had received a preliminary report that the first 45 pages of the text as given out were reproduced in the Moscow press.

The first section apparently included the reference to an effort to communicate the views of the two nations.

Throughout the 8,000 words the exchanges read more like a debate than a question-and-answer session such as an American newspaper would have with Kennedy.

At times Adzhubel sharply disagreed with Kennedy's views.

Once he said the Soviets would be happy if Kennedy would admit that U.S. "interference" in Cuban affairs was a mistake.

Kennedy apparently attached great importance to his meeting with Adzhubel as a way of getting his views across to the Soviet people. He made these points of U.S. policy mainly in response to questions raised by Adzhubel, but sometimes in making his own Adzhubel's own contentions.





Cape Canaveral, Fla., Nov. 29 (AP)—Space chimp Enos, his intended 3-orbit trip cut to two because of trouble with capsule systems, parachuted safely into the Atlantic 500 miles southeast of Bermuda today.

Two destroyers, the Stormes and the Compton, steamed toward the landing area as several aircraft took to the search for the capsule.

The capsule landed at 1:28 p.m. (EST), three hours, 21 minutes after it rode an Atlas rocket into the sky from Cape Canaveral at 10:07 a.m.

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration reported radio signals from the capsule indicated the chimp was in good condition when he landed.

A P3M search aircraft sighted the capsule as it parachuted toward the water and seven minutes after the capsule hit, the plane reported that it was floating upright.

The two ships were about 30 miles from the floating capsule and steaming toward it. They expected to arrive at 2:40 p.m. (EST).
