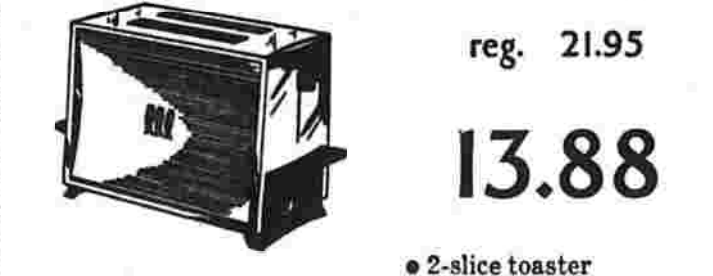

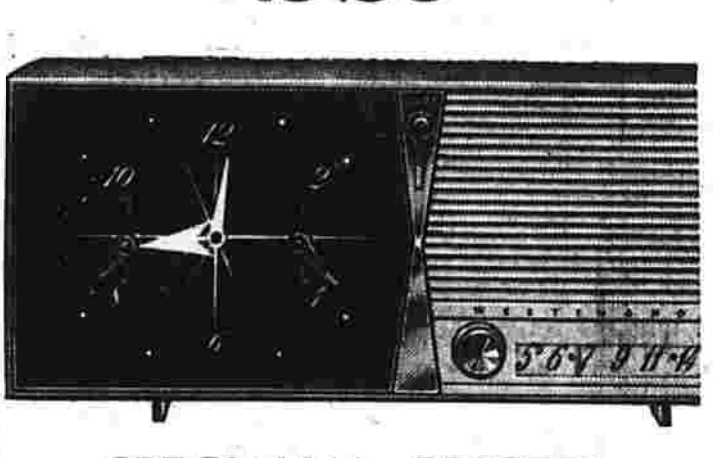

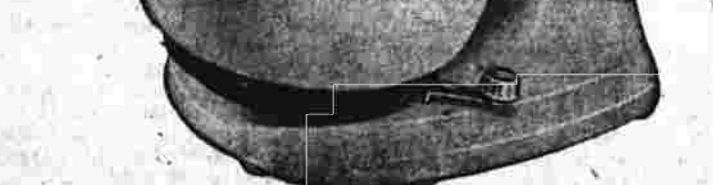

(Continued from Page One) 1. The lower of the award can appeal to a 3-man committee of executive council members. They are required to throw out any obviously erroneous award. If they consider an appeal valid, they will refer the matter to the full 25-man council. Money said he felt most umpire awards will be accepted. The pact was closely patterned after recommendations from a special disputes committee headed by Al J. Hayes, president of the Machinists Union. The final product was not so tight or tough as industrial unions wanted, nor so toothless as building trades desired. It lacked court enforcement powers but seemed, at first glance anyway, a much more effective procedure than labor had ever adopted before. The plan exempted one kind of disputes — boycotts by one union against products of members of another union. But this was considered pretty much of a moot point — because the courts have

recently taken a firm hand in enforcing such boycotts. The compromise seemed to assure smooth sailing for remaining AFL-CIO convention problems, probably including a quick smooth-over of differences over civil rights. Money was in trouble again, meanwhile, over AFL-CIO racial policies. A fellow member of the AFL-CIO Executive Council, Negro labor leader A. Philip Randolph, has been urging the federation regularly to adopt more militant integration plans. This conflict flared at convention sessions yesterday and seemed destined for further airing to-day. Randolph is peevish at a federation executive council censure statement two months ago that charged that his repeated race bias charges have helped divide white and colored workers. Randolph and Money reached an agreement to bury the censure and forget it, but Money called off the deal after Randolph condemned his conduct to the convention as "dishonorable, disgraceful, petty and cheap."

Study Planned of Appraisal

Frank Simon, president of the Manchester Country Club, and Dr. Eugene Davis, vice president, plan to study the appraisal submitted to the club of 145 acres the club wants to buy from the town. Receipts of the appraisal, made by the Carroll and Driggs firm of East Hartford, was acknowledged last night at a meeting of the club's directors. A value of \$200,000 was set on the land the country club wants to buy, all of it located on the east side of S. Main St. from the Globe Hollow reservoir to Line St. The 145 acres are part of the 199-acre tract bought by the town in 1955 from the Cheney family for \$1.8 million. Until that time, the country club had been a private club. The club then negotiated a lease with the town, under the terms of which membership would be open to any Manchester resident who wanted to pay the annual dues. This year the club is paying \$18,000 for the lease. In time the club hoped to purchase the town would be willing to sell land or negotiate a new lease to permit the club to return to its private status. General Manager Richard Martin directed the club to have an appraisal made of the land desired, Simon and Dr. Davis will study the appraisal later this week, and make their recommendations to the club's directors in January. Then a meeting will be called with the town's board of directors.

After 25 Years Duke Still Snubbed By the Establishment

One sees press photos of the Duke and Duchess occasionally on the society pages as members of the international smart set glimpsed at a Chanos or Palm Beach. Otherwise there is a conspiracy of silence about the Duke of Windsor, which is so curious about its royal subject.

The Duke of Windsor slips in and out of England almost stealthily, his movements barely noted by the press. He still quite obviously is the black sheep of the royal family.

The vendetta has in some cases been carried to extremes. For example, Clarence House recently went to great pains to let it be known that the choice of David as the name of Princess Margaret's baby was in no way influenced by the fact that David was likewise the favorite family name of the Duke of Windsor.

No. David was chosen because it was the Christian name of the late Sir David Bowles-Lyon, brother of Queen Elizabeth, the Queen Mother. It was disclosed that by no effort was made to let bygones be bygones and restore the Duke to the affection of the British people? What does the Establishment fear?

The answer, it is explained, is that the Duke in some quarters is still regarded as a moral transgressor. The Church of England, for one, cannot forgive him for having married a divorcee.

The harsh judgment of the church was summed up 25 years ago by Canon Lang, then Archbishop of Canterbury. "The king had received his high and sacred trust from God, the archbishop declared, 'yet by his own will... he has surrendered the trust.'

"Strange and sad it is," the archbishop continued, "that he should have sought his happiness in a manner inconsistent with the Christian principles of marriage."

Many Britons feel that this judgment is much too cruel to be allowed to stand, and that the Duke and Duchess should now be welcomed into the royal family fold. As the Duke, himself, has said in his memoirs, "Time has long since sanctified a true and faithful union."

Looking back after 25 years, it is hard to visualize the excitement, the bitter recriminations which the abdication touched off. But at the time, there were no neutrals as far as the ill-starred monarch was concerned.

The king either was involved in the "romance of the century," as he was the central figure of a scandal which threatened to bring the institution of the monarchy into disrepute.

Whatever the outcome of the abdication crisis, the monarchy would never again be the same, the pessimists predicted. They said the delicate fabric of tradition surrounding the royalty had been torn beyond repair. But Edward was succeeded by his brother, George VI, who in turn was succeeded by Queen Elizabeth II.

Far from suffering from the abdication, the monarchy today is stronger — and commands greater respect and admiration than it did then, most observers believe.

At the same time, the British nation appears to have been less than just to the Duke of Windsor.

"It's love and love alone that caused King Edward to lose his throne..." Thus runs a Trinidad calypso which swept the world in the wake of the abdication.

No Briton under the age of 30 today would ever have heard this calypso, nor have any independent memory of the incident which it celebrates in song. All that the present generation of Britons know about Edward and Wally is what their parents have told them.

The Windsors have been buried alive by the establishment, that curious British combination of

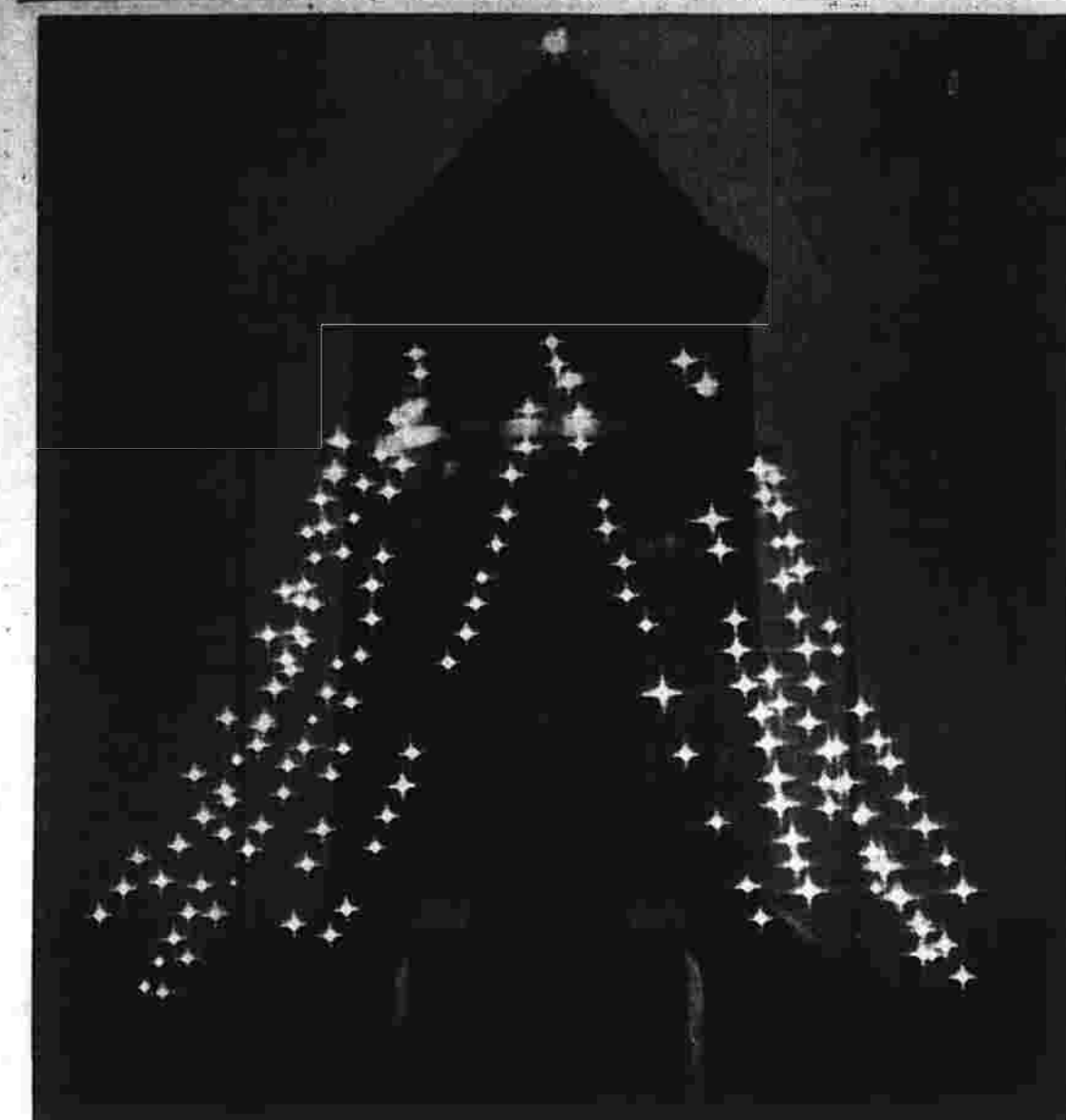

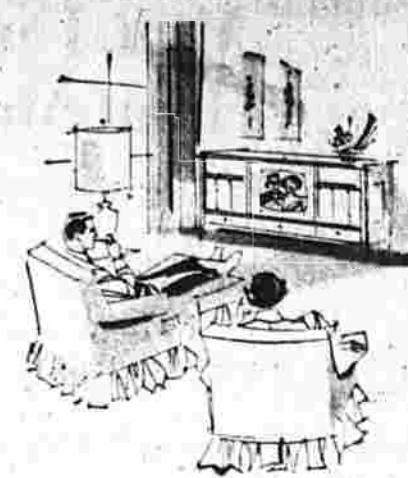

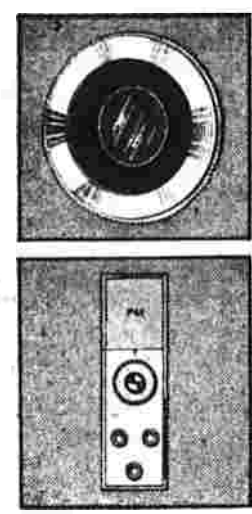

Your Pocketbook

By FAYE HENLE

Use Trust to Manage Estate Before, After Death. In this fast-moving world, people of modest means as well as the wealthy are using trusts to help them safeguard and manage their property as well as for settling estates.

Even if your total worth is not more than a few thousand dollars, you should be aware of the different types of trusts and how you might decide whether a trust would benefit you. A trust is a legal instrument and must be drawn by an attorney. It provides for the care and management of property by another. You can designate anyone as trustee, but usually the trust service is performed by a bank.

Most commercial banks are geared to perform trust services and the decisions made are usually made by a team of experts, experts in real estate, securities and taxes.

As for all services, there are charges for creating and operating trusts. Usually these fees are set by state laws. Before setting up a trust, you should seek careful advice from your lawyer, a banker, even an accountant.

You should know your exact net worth and include here any pension fund money for which you may be eligible, proceeds from insurance policies should you die.

You should look at your current tax bracket and appraise how your estate might be taxed. One of the chief reasons for setting up a trust today is to reduce the tax load both on current income and on estates.

You should appraise whether your assets are working for you at their peak and know exactly how you want your money distributed upon your death.

For you to consider, the four main types of trusts are: The living trust, one which you can create in your lifetime. You might wish to make this trust irrevocable, meaning that at the end of a set period, the property in trust will be returned to you. In some circumstances a tax advantage can be gained. An irrevocable trust means you surrender the right to end the trust. In this case you could still enjoy the income of your property during your lifetime.

A trust under your will is the opposite of a living trust. Instead you set up the machinery during your lifetime, specifying to whom you wish both principal and income to go.

You can also stipulate how you wish this property to be handled so far as the sale of real estate, securities and such are concerned and the objectives of investment such as whether your assets should be invested to produce income or capital growth or both where possible. In such cases it is best not to be too rigid in your desires since changed economic conditions over the years may dissipate your original desires.

A trust can be created to administer life insurance proceeds. A court may appoint a trustee to administer a special trust arising from litigation that is before a court.

Because of the growing use of trusts, the American Bankers Association reports many banks are exploring methods to give their customers a better understanding of their accounts - to see whether it might not be possible eventually to standardize trust statements.

A pioneer in this field has devised a system that differs from most accounts for trusts to obtain a balance after each transaction. The objective: to let clients know at all times how much they own and how much income their assets produce.

And here's why: Pension and insurance costs are only two of many costs associated with hiring a new man of any age. What are your costs of recruitment, training, and termination? What is your employe turnover? How is your rate of absenteeism? Your safety record? And your productivity?

When you calculate these costs on a pre-mag basis, you'll find that it usually costs no more (and in many cases less) to hire a so-called older worker than a younger man.

Santa Must Automate To Keep Up with Times

New York — (NSA) — So what if Harry King doesn't look like St. Nick? The smart money has it that he will wind up as the country's official Space-Age Santa Claus.
King, a 37-year-old ex-mid, has picked up some novel ideas about Christmas gift giving. His scheme could inspire the biggest revolution in holiday largesse since people began hanging stockings by the chimney with care.
His brain child is known as "Automated Gift Plan." It generally is aimed at the harassed businessman confronted with the distribution of year-end bonuses to customers and associates.
King has had impressive success in selling small, glossy booklets to such businessmen and executives. Each booklet contains up to two dozen color pictures of gifts, such as watches, desk sets and golf clubs.
The exec who subscribes to "Automated" simply mails one booklet to each person on his Christmas list. The recipient then chooses one gift from the assortment. He receives his choice within 10 weeks after notifying King's New York headquarters.
"Automated" users may choose \$7.50 to \$100, depending on which of eight different booklets they buy. Of course, nothing so crazy as a dollar sign creeps into print. The recipient never knows which price range his booklet is in—unless he happens to be a subscriber to King's plan himself.
"The question I asked myself before I started up last year," said King, "was, 'How can the busy executive personalize a gift without taking the time to personalize it?' Now, instead of getting something he can't use, the person who

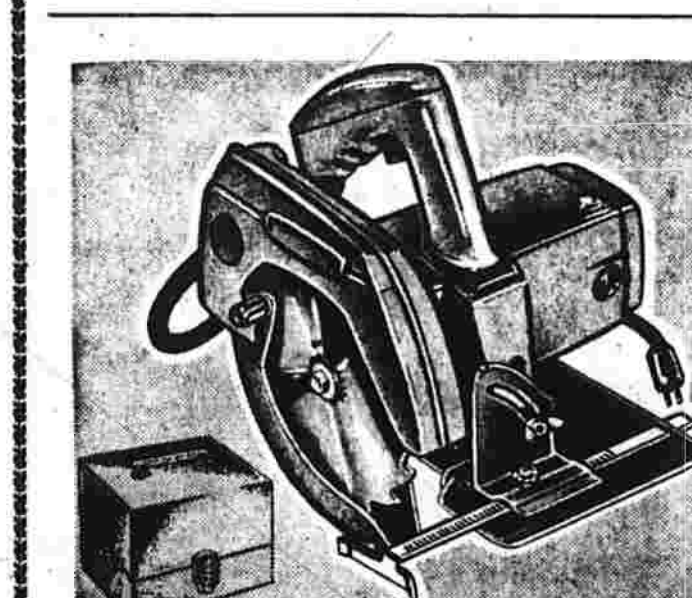

Emphasis On Health

By THE ASSOCIATED PRESS
Sweet and bitter inducements to swift learning, fast-beating fanfare heralds and the effects of high living standards on blood pressure are subjects in the medical news.

A Pail or Rap?
Various experiments have indicated that animals learn faster when they are punished for mistakes than when they are rewarded for correct responses. A combination of reward and punishment brings the best results.

But how about humans?
Dr. R. K. Tenney and A. A. Lupton of Alton, Ont., Canada, ran 60 trials on children. The kids were told to distinguish between white and black sections painted on squares. A piece of candy was the reward for a correct answer. An incorrect answer triggered a loud, unpleasant noise.

Individual children in the punishment group heard only the noise from their mistakes. The rewarded group received candy only for correct answers. Children in the third group were given a combination of noise or candy, depending on the correctness of their answers.

The results are reported in the magazine Medical Science. Unlike the animal tests, the human reward-punishment group ran a poor second. The punishment group was an easy winner and the reward group placed last.

Plastering Hearts
A New physician in a recruiting station in Los Angeles was puzzled to find heart murmurs in most of 40 per cent of the Waves he examined. These murmurs were short and soft and varied with the position of the subject and the rate of her breathing. He rarely found these murmurs in men. So he queried American Medical Association headquarters in Chicago.

An A.M.A. consultant offered this opinion: There are some indications women have more murmurs than men of the same age. But slight murmurs can be accentuated by rapid flow through the arteries. And a fast-beating heart speeds up blood flow. The consultant said:

"Young women seem to be more nervous than men of the same age. They are particularly so in large examination centers with many people involved. This might account for the increased pulse rate and, therefore, increased blood flow."

High Living
High living may be the standard price, world over, for a high standard of living.

One of the latest studies linking these two factors was made in the Fiji Islands. The doctors found that a group of Indian men in Fijis, Fiji who enjoyed a relatively high standard of living had blood pressure higher than the local rural male population.

There is a graduation in the incidence of high blood pressure among several races of the Pacific islands that parallels the degree to which they have been influenced by western culture, said the doctors report to the Journal of the American Medical Association.

Cancer-Chasing Agents
A long list of chemicals, tars and other substances have been included as cancer-causing agents and medical scientists and public health agencies have gone to great pains to warn or protect industrial workers and the general population.

Now comes a report by Dr. Max Blumberg, Woods Hole, Mass., showing that some cancer-causing substances occur normally in soil. Soil samples taken in many New England regions far away from possible contamination from highways or industrial plants contained these agents.

One such carcinogen appeared to be a decomposition product of wood. But it also may have been formed from micro-organisms in the soil, Dr. Blumberg said.

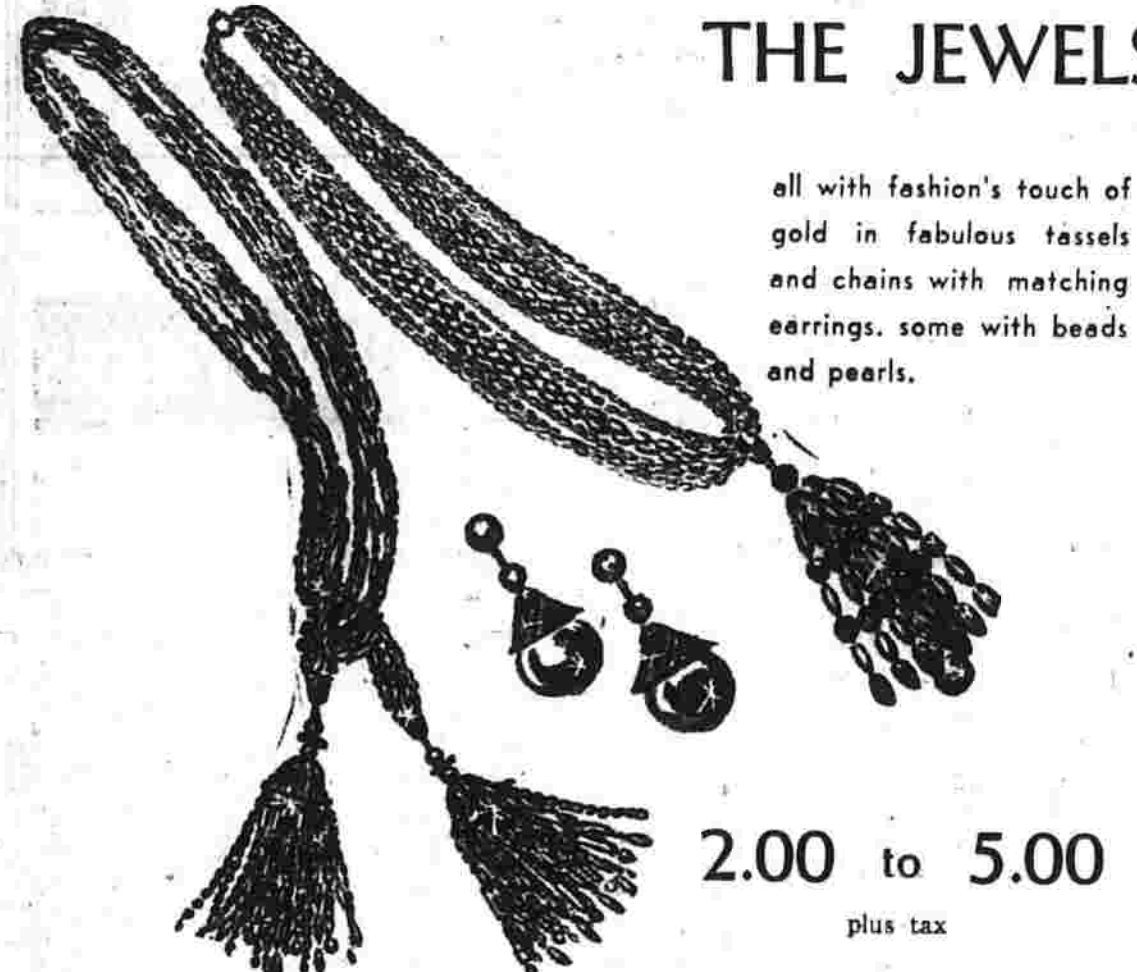

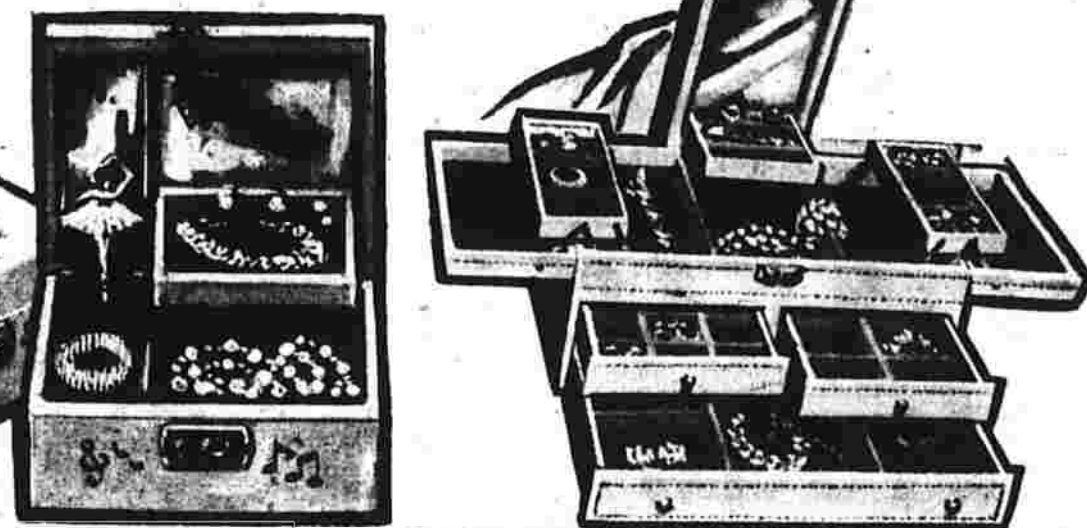

India Claims Full Control Over Portuguese Enclaves

Portuguese troops along the enclaves will resist to the end. But the Indian Defense Ministry announced today that it believed Portuguese enclaves were also light. He said more than 1,000 Portuguese troops had surrendered from Belgium, the Indian command center just outside Goa, said the Indian commander. Lt. Gen. J. N. Chaudhury, head of the Indian flag in Nova Goa, the Portuguese colonial capital, about 9 a.m.

The report said a large crowd of Goans cheered as the flag went up celebrating the end of 4 1/2 centuries of Portuguese rule. Nova Goa was the last reported pocket of resistance. An Indian spokesman said the enclaves had been taken only after the Portuguese had offered only minor resistance, and an Indian official said the Portuguese had been offered to leave.

The spokesman claimed a large number of Goans were to be brought to Portugal. Nehru reportedly replied that India had waited 14 years since its independence from Britain and Portugal to change their determination to hang onto the enclaves. He said the decision to give up the enclaves was made only after the Portuguese had offered to leave.

Heralding Homes

House Played Historic Role

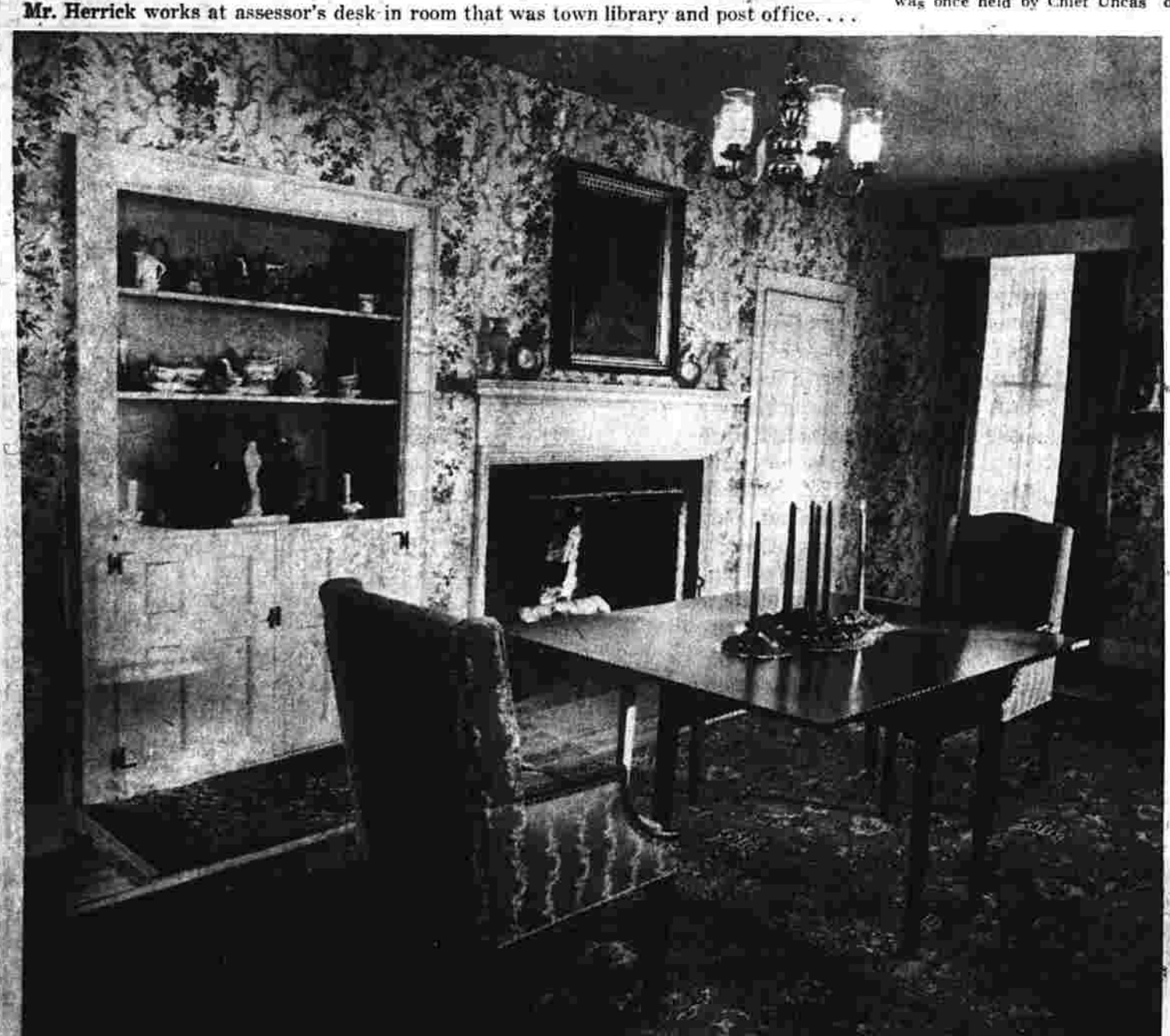
The colonial home of Mr. and Mrs. E. Pierce Herrick, 1827-1894, Bolton, is distinguished for its Palladian window and its role in Bolton history.

For many years, Bolton's post office and the town library were located in this home near Bolton Center. The post office sign, counter and case of postal boxes is intact in the attic, and Mr. Herrick performs his work as one of three town assessors in the same room that housed the town library for 28 years.

The two-story nine-room home is also noted for the artistry of its Christmas arrangements and decorations created by Mrs. Herrick. She also prepares Christmas arrangements for sales at the Bolton Congregational Church and for the Manchester Garden Club, and has been an exhibitor in garden shows.

The Herricks, fourth owners of the home built in 1809 by Jared One, purchased the property in the fall of 1920. While still living in Hartford, the Herricks spent summers at a cottage in Andover which they owned from 1927 to 1941. During these years, they often admired the historic home which was later purchased.

Part of their 85 acres of land, which extends west to Clark Rd., was once held by Chief Uncas of

The Mohicans, the Herricks were told by a town historian. To preserve an unobstructed view of the house faces to the east, the present owners purchased a lot across the road.

The front doorway is enhanced by a fan window. Two Georgian urns at the front entrance are filled with evergreens at Christmas. The door knocker bears a likeness of Ceres, goddess of grain. All previous owners of this home were active in the Grange.

In the center hall is a low wedding chest of Scottish origin with a head of wood carved on the front, and a grandfather clock which belonged to Mr. Herrick's family in New Haven.

To the left of the center hall is the formal parlor. Above a small fireplace are oil portraits in a simple style by Estes Salisbury Field, of two of Mrs. Herrick's ancestors in the Lester family. Each is seated at an opposite end of the same love seat. Also in the parlor are a molodian, crystal chandelier and a chandelier, drive flowers mounted on velvet in oval frames, and a 30-inch circular lift-top table.

The front room to the right of the center hall is the library. The post office was established here in 1825 with Saul Alford, second owner of the house, as first postmaster. It was later moved to Mrs. E. K. Williams' general store in a wing of the present Weldon Miner home and returned to its first location about 1919 with Miss Adelia N. Loomis as postmistress.

The Bolton Free Library was moved from the Williams' general store in 1887 to the home of the third owner, Deacon Charles N. Loomis. His daughter, Miss Loomis, was librarian here until 1943 although the library was moved from this home in 1915 to the community hall.

Other downstairs rooms are a large formal dining room, first floor bedroom, and in an ell at the rear a country kitchen. The chimney was rebuilt for the large kitchen fireplace, the only one which the Herricks use. The downstairs rooms have 9 ft. 4 inch ceilings, a foot higher than those upstairs. Upstairs rooms still have original wide board flooring.

The Herricks have made no basic structural changes to the original house. They installed central heating, plumbing and water, and in the library, boxed in duct work with paneling and added cupboards along the front wall. One 40-foot long timber extends across the front of the house, and eight-inch beams are the main supports in all the rooms.

Focal point at the front of the upstairs hall is the Palladian window with keystone arch outlined by rope molding trim and flanked by two smaller windows. Small storage rooms were converted into a dressing room and bath, and a closet was opened up to connect them with the master bedroom. There is a gallery of family portrait miniatures in the connecting passageway.

The attic is a veritable treasure trove for antiquarians. Here reposes the former post office with boxes, counter and penny work case, along with a Bolton Center Cider Mill sign, a desk and books from the North School, costumes of yesteryear, antique high chairs, carriages, furniture and collection of early tin and woodenware.

Restoring this house has been a delight to Mrs. Herrick who continues a tradition of former owners by serving as a member of Bolton's library board. Mr. Herrick, a native of New Haven, is a graduate of Ohio Northern University, college of mechanical engineering. He was production manager of the Colt Firearms Mfg. Co. for 31 years until his retirement in 1945. He is a charter member of the Hartford Area Assessors' Association, and is proud that Bolton has aerial survey maps for assessment purposes.

rest by the Central government last spring when he walked out of the round table conference of Congolese leaders at Leopoldville.

U.N. officials said the talks would be secret and Bunche, other U.N. aides and Gullion would act only if the Congolese asked them to. A U.S. diplomatic source indicated Gullion is not trying to act as mediator but is only "facilitating" the talks.

U.N. troops were reported in control of Elisabethville, Tshombe's capital, and the defenders who had battled with U.N. troops there since Dec. 8 appeared to have melted away into the countryside. But the Congolese and their white officers were reported planning guerrilla resistance in the bush.

A U.N. spokesman in New York announced that Acting Secretary-General U. Thant had ordered a cease-fire throughout Katanga for the duration of the talks between Tshombe and Adoula but that U.N. troops would still move back if attacked.

Most diplomats in Leopoldville had little hope of a lasting agreement between Tshombe and Adoula. They said the two hold unalterably opposed positions and speculated that Tshombe might decide to continue his resistance to the Central Congo government from exile abroad.

Reports from Elisabethville told of heavy fighting around the headquarters of the Belgian-owned Union Miniere Company yesterday, but Katanga troops appeared to have withdrawn from all sections of the city.

However, a white officer in the Katangan Army said, "We don't mind. We are planning our campaign on the basis of the U.N. occupying Elisabethville. Believe me, the war has just begun."

From Brussels, Belgian Foreign Minister Paul-Henri Spaak called a protest to Thant, calling the fighting around the Union Miniere headquarters "pure reprisals" with no military objective.

The U.N. reported heavy fire came from two machine gun positions in the hospital of the mining company.

The Belgian consul-general in Elisabethville, M. Vandewalle, protested to the U.N. that some U.N. soldiers had massacred Belgian civilians.

Gen. K. A. S. Raja, commander of U.N. forces in Elisabethville, announced that he had ordered his troops not to break into houses except for such "sufficient reason" as to quell sniper firing. He ordered disciplinary action for offenders and said that "under no circumstances shall women and children be molested."

In London, British Foreign Secretary Lord Home told the House of Lords that the U.N. faced the danger of a war in the Congo "which could spread into months and years" and that the U.N. role there could reach the stage where Britain would withdraw its support from the United Nations.

Lord Home declared that the U.N. officials had major emphasis on efforts to maintain peace and security to acceleration of independence movements and an end to the violence.

Pulbright, a candidate for reelection next year, said on a brief Washington visit that he was enraged by the U.S. policy in the Congo.

He said he was not satisfied with the U.S. policy in the Congo and that he would like to see a probe of U.S. Congo policies.

Dodd said whether he agreed with former Republican Vice President Richard M. Nixon that President Kennedy's policy had created an incredible mess in the Congo.

Dodd replied that he didn't believe "President Kennedy's policy at all."

"It was the U.N.'s mismanagement of its Congo responsibility," he said. "I regretfully was supported in my view that the President doesn't desire to destroy Katanga or Tshombe."

Asked if he thought the State Department acted independently of the President, he replied that "I sometimes wonder if the President gets the accurate information."

Sen. Frank J. Lausche, D-Ohio, another foreign relations committeeman, said in a separate interview that he believed the U.N. force which has battered their way into Elisabethville in the Katanga area, have been acting illegally by interfering in the internal affairs of the Congo.

Unlike Dodd, who has praised Tshombe as one of the leading anti-Communists in Africa, Lausche said he was not taking sides in the Katanga president's controversy with Congo Premier Adoula. Dodd has said that Adoula's government is subject to strong Communist influence.

Sen. Jacob K. Javits, R-N.Y., said yesterday he is supporting the U.N. actions in Katanga because the alternative "confrontation" between the Communist bloc and the free world in a tense spot in the Congo would represent a grave danger to world peace.

But Javits said that critics of the U.N. position should not ignore in any settlement. He said there must be "good faith" participation in the Adoula government by provinces "administered by the local Katanga administration."

He added that Katanga and other provinces should be given "substantial autonomy," and that Adoula must see to it that the human rights provisions of the U.N. charter are enforced.

French peasants put a bean into the cake mix, and the finder of the bean, when the cake is baked and cut, is "King" for the evening. He then chooses a "Queen" to be his consort.

In the French towns, a china doll is substituted for the bean.
