was any real evidence against Luciano.

Luciano was an ambitious young man who finally tripped himself up by his own greed. He had just turned 34 years of age in 1934 when he put Luciano on trial as boss of all organized vice in New York.

The man called Lucky "the most dangerous and important racketeer in New York if not in the country."

The trial followed as a British-ordered Christmas Island. The testimony of one of the chief state witnesses, a madman who answered to the name of Cockey Pyle.

Lucky took the stand to admit he never denied an honor roll in his life. He took bows for bootlegging, gambling and narcotics—but denied that he was a racketeer in female form and he insisted to his dying day that Luciano was "the only thing I never did."

Sent to prison in 1935, Luciano was released in 1946 after 11 years behind bars by Dewey. He returned to New York and was deported to Italy. His underworld empire was left in a state of confusion. Luciano's last wish was to be buried in his hometown of Sicily.

Spokesmen for the government say the Mafia Corporation and Los Angeles, California, are the last remnants of the Mafia. Luciano's death is a blow to the Mafia because he was the one who kept the Mafia from going away.

The Mafia is a worldwide organization of Italian-Americans. It is estimated that there are 100,000 Mafia members in the United States. Luciano was the last of the real racketeers.

Dick Powell's Career Covers 30-Year Span

He started to croon and wound up a tycoon! This brief sentence sums up Dick Powell's remarkable career in showbusiness.

From part-time singer with college bands to president and co-founder of the huge Four Star Television Corporation spans a 30-year period for Powell that includes stardom in motion pictures, radio and television.

With the advent of his new full hour action-adventure-suspense series, "The Dick Powell Show," on NBC-TV Tuesdays (9-10 p.m. EST), Powell utilizes his versatility as the program's weekly host, executive producer and star of every third episode. In this week's episode, "Squadron," Dick stars as Col. Luke Harper, an air force colonel who fights to keep his men functioning as a unit when the enemy threatens the group with extinction. Pat Conway and Joanna Moore also star.

Having assembled an impressive roster of top stars, writers and producers for his new show, the venture has paid off. The critics have acclaimed the Dick Powell Show as "first rate... the show to watch... Dick Powell's a pro."

This is the stature Dick Powell has achieved in a business notorious for its ups and downs.

During more than a quarter of a century in show business, Dick Powell has been a concert singer, master of ceremonies, a musician, an orchestra leader, a singing motion picture star, a motion picture director, a stage director, a television actor, a dramatic motion picture actor, and a producer of feature and television films.

Born in Mountain View, Ark., Richard Ewing Powell attended public schools and Little Rock College in Little Rock. In college he began singing with a church choir as well as with local dance orchestras.

In 1932, Powell signed with Warner Bros. and went to Hollywood, Dick's screen debut was in

"Blessed Event," starring Lee Tracy and Mary Brian. Powell played a down-and-out handleader.

"I got a shock when I read the script," Dick recollected. "I spoke one word, 'hello,' to Lee Tracy."

But Dick sang three songs in the picture, and in a way that sent the Brothers Warner scurrying for scripts premised on movie musicals. It was the start of a cycle of musicals never equalled before or since. During the next few years, Dick did such memorable movies as "42nd Street," "Gold Diggers of 1933," "Flirtation Walk," "Shipmates Forever" and more than a score of others.

These boy-gets-girl pictures brought patrons flocking to the box-office even in the midst of the depression. After more than 40 movies of this type, Powell found himself famous as a singing hero, but unable to break through the type-casting barrier to meatier dramatic roles.

Sherry is now a red-haired 19 with a startling resemblance to a young Susan Hayward, just as saucy and bidding for the same kind of movie honors.

Three years ago Sherry left the Thomas show via a script in which she took off for college. What really happened was that Sherry had grown out of the role. Since leaving the show three years ago she... well, flabbergasted is a condition we've always reserved for income tax refunds. That was before Sherry slipped into a booth at the Brown Derby wearing a slinky low-cut gown and one of those floppy peek-a-boo black felt hats.

It was also before Sherry told us about her TV life with Danny. "Danny was wonderful," Sherry said, but she shuddered about what went on behind his back while she was playing his daughter.

Rusty Hamer (who is still on the show) was only five when Sherry played his sister and they were a typical brother-sister act off-camera. "He was a little monster," Sherry laughed, but she wasn't laughing at the time it happened.

"Because I had been in motion pictures I was considered a pro and treated like an adult. Rusty was treated like a baby. Some boys! One day he hid a nail in a board under a sheet and said, 'Sit down, Sherry.' I didn't sit down but Danny's daughter, who was visiting the set, did, and they had to give her a tetanus shot."

But for what Sherry learned on the show — comedy timing — and what she earned — "My mother invested the money for me in several buildings," she is grateful.

She's also thankful that Danny's show took her through the awkward age, permitting her to continue acting, because acting is her life. She had appeared in only a movie with John Wayne just before she joined the cast of the Thomas TV show. Now, via telefilms (she's playing a big role in "Gunsmoke" in January) she's headed back into movies.

She says, "I know I can bet. I've been acting ever since I was five."

But the image of Sherry as Danny's little daughter hangs on in some Hollywood quarters. "When my agent mentions my name," Sherry reports, "some directors and producers shrug and say, 'Oh, sure, Danny's little TV daughter.' But they sure are surprised when they see me now."

Having taken the thought right out of our head, Sherry ordered coffee and reached for a cigaret. It's late, folks. Real late, in fact.
