Rockville-Vernon Council Rejects Proposal To Change License Code

Rockville-Vernon council members have unanimously rejected a proposal to amend the city's licensing code for plumbing, electrical and steam-fitters, but have left the door open for a possible increase in license fees.

The rejection came after a public hearing last night at City Hall where 20 to 25 plumbing and electrical contractors vigorously opposed the amendments.

But the proposed changes would have established license fees ranging from \$10 to \$25, according to the amendments.

In turning down the amendments, council members indicated agreement with Mayor Leo B. Fidelity Jr. and the city engineer, Edward J. Hart, that there was no evidence presented at the hearing in support of the changes.

Tradesmen took exception to the hearing and proposed amendments. Several speakers said any proposed changes should have been discussed with the business community.

Mrs. Blanche Goodchild

Mrs. Blanche Goodchild, new director of nursing at Crestfield Hospital, has been a nurse for patients ranging from convalescing to critical.

At Crestfield, she serves 60 patients and supervises 63 nurses and about 20 nurse aides, and as a child, she took care of her six sisters and three brothers when they were ill. A few members of her family were involved.

Mrs. Goodchild was named director of nursing at Crestfield last month. She had been a part-time staff nurse there since a day in September, 1960 when administrator Francis P. Dall'Amico named her as his administrative assistant.

Her administrative experience includes the position of charge nurse and work in the supervisor's office at the Hartford Hospital, where she worked from 1953 to 1958.

And administrative work is what she likes best. "There's so much satisfaction," she says, "in teaching nurses and seeing them pleased they know something new."

During her two years at the Institute of Living, Mrs. Goodchild's patients included nursing 200 film in Clara Bow, actress Dana Andrews and playwright Elliott Ness.

Mr. Nugent she says, "Every time he plays wiff on Broadway, I'd get him as a patient."

One of Nugent's visitors was Robert Montgomery, actor, director and producer, she remembers.

Mrs. Goodchild trained nursing at the Marlfield Medical Center in Newark, N. J., from which she received a nursing degree in 1941. For a year after graduation she did ambulance duty at the center, before entering the Navy Nurse Corps as an ensign.

She was stationed at the U.S. Naval Hospital in Hampton, N. Y., and was assigned to the chief nurse's office. It was during this time that she became interested in rehabilitation work, because many of her duty was with amputees from the war.

In 1944 she was promoted to lieutenant (jg) and transferred to the Bureau of Naval Personnel, U.S. Navy Department in Washington, D. C. There she was in charge of out-patient Navy personnel. In June 1949 she was discharged with the rank of lieutenant (jg).

In 1950, she took a course in rehabilitation at the Rocky Hill Veterans Hospital in Rocky Hill, Conn. She says she has "seen some wonderful results" at Crestfield. Now there are "at least five patients walking around that needed rehabilitation."

Crestfield has a "pleasant atmosphere" which keeps the patients happy.
