Niceties of Civic Life
The Rockville City Council's bi-monthly meetings are generally straight Damon Runyon, and Monday night's affair was no exception until the Chamber of Commerce threw a stone wall among the aldermen.

Demutally asking council approval of a handful of upcoming chamber programs, Mrs. Doris V. Thompson, manager, explained one project is to paint white the long stone retaining wall along E. Main St. It would have a "brightening effect," she said.

The first reaction came from John T. Oriowski who said, "I don't want to be rude, but if you paint that wall white, it'll get all dirty from slush and snow plowing in the winter. It won't look nice."

In a brief, emotion-charged speech, Clarence J. McCarthy said Mrs. Thompson had made "three good suggestions" which should be implemented for the beautification of the city. Besides painting the wall, Mrs. Thompson proposed putting benches at the center bus stop and flower boxes on the curbs.

But painting the wall white was too much for the assemblage.

When Mayor Leo E. Flaherty Jr. said "Wait a moment, I think we've offended Ed Lavitt's taste," the meeting went from Runyon to Wright (Frank Lloyd) in a trice.

Said Lavitt, the city's attorney, "Nine thousand architects will be spinning in their graves. Painting stone just doesn't speak of stone. He shook his head sadly."

Thomas J. McCusker suggested that the painting could be done by inmates of the Towland Jail, but he added, "once you've painted it, you're stuck with it."

Although he admitted a white wall would get dirty quickly, Bernard F. Gross said it could be "hoaxed off once in a while." He said the painting might be done by public spirited people.

"There's no accounting for taste," moaned Lavitt. He invoked the names of architectural giants, Wright and Mies Van der Rohe.

The aldermen approved the other two chamber projects during a breathing spell, then returned to the wall. Most of them favored painting it, if not the whole face of it, at least the top.

But the team of Oriowski and Lavitt, a surprising combination, was hard to overcome.

"I'm sorry," said Oriowski, "but I'm just against it period."

"Maybe we could paint a pile of

stones or bricks somewhere else and see how it looks," he offered.

"Sure," said Gross, "there's a wall in front of my house."

"I move we form a committee to study it," said Gerald Allen suddenly.

Before others could muster a counter attack, Flaherty pounced on Allen's suggestion, quickly named Allen, McCarthy and Oriowski to the committee.

"Ohhhh, no," groaned Oriowski, "not me, your honor. I'll just end up having another fight with Clarence. I don't know about Allen here."

"Okay," said Flaherty hastily, "I'll appoint Tom McCusker to the committee."

Then Runyon returned. But, by that time, the meeting was a shambles, the participants were pooped and spectators had collapsed with laughter.

Story of Christ in Art Scheduled Tomorrow

With the approach of Easter, the time of rejoicing each year when the Christian world celebrates the Resurrection, NBC's Project 20 will present "He Is Risen" which concludes the story of Jesus that began with the widely acclaimed program, "The Coming of Christ."

To quote from Richard Hanser's introduction to "He Is Risen", prefacing the events of the half-hour color presentation to be seen tomorrow, Palm Sunday, 8:30 to 9 p.m., NBC-TV:

"Behold! said Saint Paul, 'I show you a mystery.' And in the story of Easter—in the Crucifixion and Resurrection of Jesus Christ—mankind cherishes one of its most profound and moving mysteries. The Resurrection has, indeed, been called 'the central fact of all history.'"

Project 20's chief writer, Hanser, weaves a program of splendor from the words of the Bible itself. The narrative will select from the Scriptures the word-of-mouth report among the people when Christ's ministry began:

"A great prophet is risen among us—Jesus of Nazareth!"

Thus the Savior makes His appearance and the story continues, with dramatic depiction of Jesus' teaching, preaching, praying.

The magnificence and compelling beauty of great paintings of the 15th to 18th Centuries will be used to depict the climactic episodes of mankind's supreme story—the Agony in the Garden, the Last Supper, the Crucifixion and the Ascension. The narration will again be spoken by Alexander Scourby.

Original Score

Project 20's musical director, Robert Russell Pennett, has prepared an original score for "He Is Risen," to be conducted by him. One of producer Hyatt's special roles — an art in itself — is to

explain every detail of camera movement, optical effect and film cutting to create the illusion of "still-pictures-in-action," a technique which Project 20 has perfected for television.

Research director Daniel Jones and his assistant, Rhoda Grady sought out the 300 paintings with the cooperation of more than 50 museums, art galleries, churches, and other sources in a dozen countries. Among the painters are Rembrandt, Titian, Van Dyck, Van Eyck, El Greco, Rubens, Velasquez and many others.

Won Three Awards

The first program, "The Coming of Christ," has been shown in more than 10 countries and won awards at three international festivals in 1961, the only American television program to do so. Then broadcast for the first time over the NBC network, it was seen by more than 31,000,000 people in this country and achieved the highest rating of any half-hour television documentary ever shown. When it was repeated on December 20, 1961, it drew an even greater audience.

In preparing "He Is Risen," the same reverence and dedication which gave "The Coming of Christ" such stature is again evident. The program will devote special attention to such episodes as the following:

Bob Wolff
NBC Sportscaster
Versatile sportscaster Bob Wolff
is a three-letter man in the NBC
sports lineup. During the past
year, he has been an NBC broad-
caster for big baseball, football
and basketball games. In the com-
ing months, he'll concentrate on
baseball when he and Joe Garagiola
are the commentators for
NBC-TV's Saturday and Sunday
"Major League Baseball" games
(blacked out by stations in ma-
jor league markets).
Although only 41 years old,
Wolff is a 15-year veteran at re-
porting big league baseball play-
by-play. In 1947 he became one
of the TV-radio announcers for
the Washington Senators and con-
tinued with the team last season
when it became the Minnesota
Twins.
He was selected three times—
in 1956, 1958 and 1961—from the
ranks of the big league baseball
broadcasters to be a World Series
commentator. After the Series
last October, his other assign-
ments on NBC included the Blue-
Grays and U.S. Bowl post-season
football games, two games in col-
lege basketball's National Invita-
tion Tournament and several of
the "NBA Pro Basketball" con-
tests.
Wolff's versatility in announc-
ing sports includes a variety of
events from Madison Square Gar-
den in New York, such as hockey,
basketball, the National Horse
Show and Westminster Kennel
Club Dog Show. He has covered
professional and collegiate foot-
ball on television and radio, han-
dled the play-by-play for differ-
ent sports of the University of
Maryland and Navy, and during
the past two football seasons was
the sportscaster on another net-
work's post-game scoreboard
shows.
Wolff was fortunate in being on
hand to cover two of the classic
games in sports history—both at
Yankee Stadium in New York. One
was Stan Larsen's perfect game in
the 1956 World Series and the other
was the 1958 National Football
League Championship Game, an
overtime thriller.
Wolff began his broadcasting
career while at Duke University,
where he won Phi Beta Kappa
honors. After graduation in 1942,
he spent four years in the Navy
during World War II. He met his
wife, Jane, while stationed at
Camp Peary, Va., where she was a
Navy nurse. Both attained the rank
of lieutenant.
During his many years with the
Senators (Twins in 1961), Bob
often worked out with the team
and became a favorite batting
practice pitcher. "I guess they

he says.
