NEW YORK (AP)—The government is overlooking the middle-aged and the old. The government has programs to protect the young and assist the last years of the old.

The government has programs to aid the manufacturer and help the farmer. Name any group in America and the government has thought up something to do for it.

Middle-aged people make up the great forgotten class of this country. Uncle Sam remembers them only at income tax time, when he puts a memorable hand in their pocket.

This governmental neglect of the middle-aged is hard enough to stand when you consider they are one of the nation's great natural resources—as important in their way as iron ore, lumber or the corn crop.

Middle-aged people hold most of the votes, pay most of the taxes, and do far more than their fair share of the national work.

If all the middle-aged people in America went on strike and did nothing but sit on their hands for a month, civilization as we know it would crumble like a fallen cookie.

Realizing their own key importance in the scheme of things, more and more thoughtful middle-aged people are beginning to ask: "When is the government going to do something for us?"

Obviously, it would be impractical for the government to provide a federal sanctuary for the middle-aged, as it has done for the whooping crane. Middle-aged people simply do not thrive in a wilderness swamp.

State Lawmakers Check Testing For Intoxication

HARTFORD (AP)—A group of Connecticut lawmakers want to Rhode Island last week, quipped some drinks, underwent examination and concluded that "chemical tests" for determining if intoxication exists is a good idea.

"I think the committee in general came back favoring such tests," state Rep. Peter A. Crombie, Enfield Democrat, told the state legislative council in his report Tuesday.

Quite a few of the members "had several drinks" the veteran legislator said and then submitted to a chemical "breath test" given in the crime laboratory of the University of Rhode Island.

But none of the lawmakers, he said, showed a reading of over .05 per cent and therefore would not be judged unfit to drive.

The experiments showed how chemical tests can protect the innocent, as well as help convict the guilty," he said. "The idea was to impress us with the fact that a few social drinks don't impair driving ability."

The measure would impose a limitation on the number of back seats stored in a population. Since this would tend to bar the door to many new such stores, existing licensees would become more and more valuable.

Hence, the legislature here has turned its back on such a measure.

Rhode Island representative Crombie said, has a chemical test law and it is working well.

He said the testing was done by breathing into a bag to get the concentration of alcohol in the breath. Checking the breath find-

The Red Sox, now 2-4 for the season, returned home today and are set to play the Yankees tomorrow.

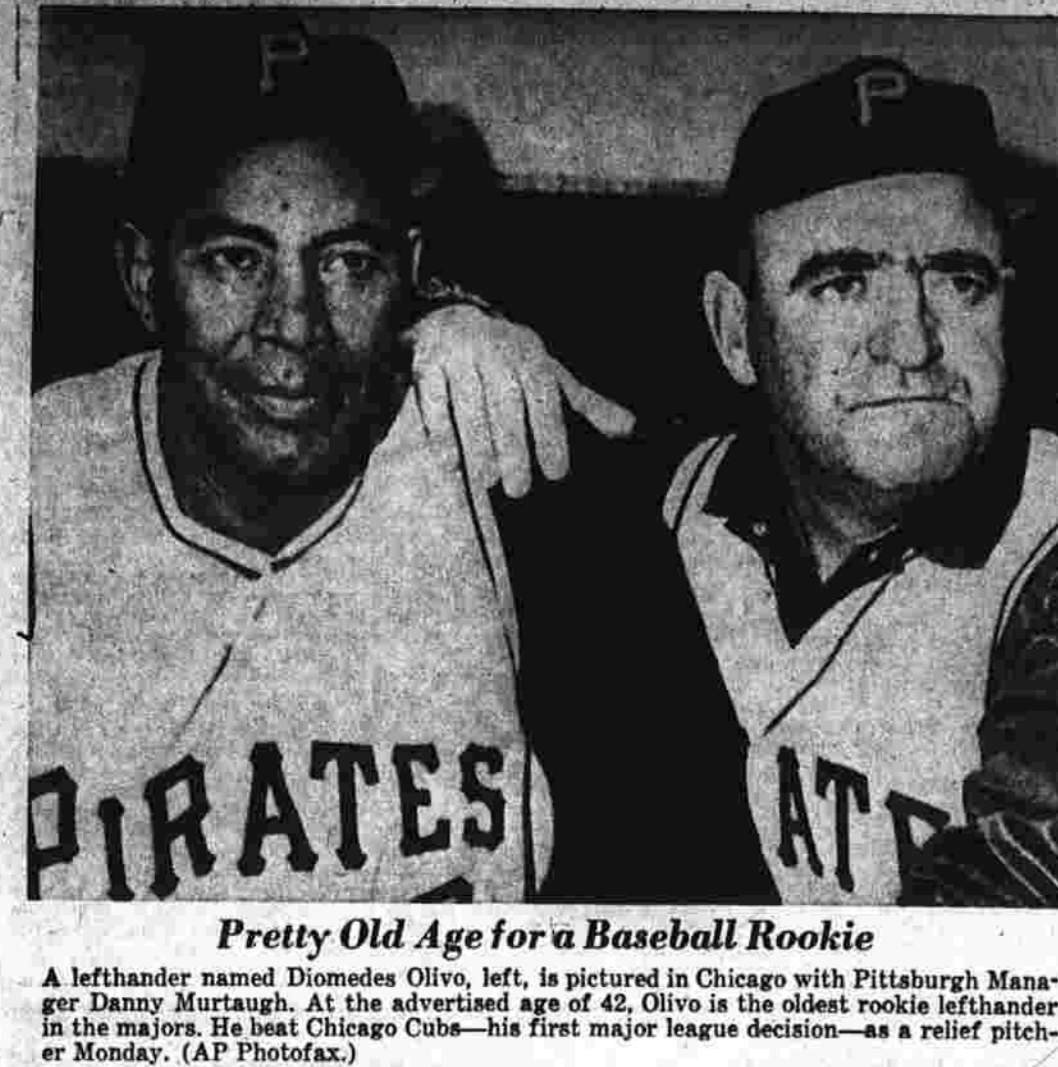
Houston Have-Not Outlast New York

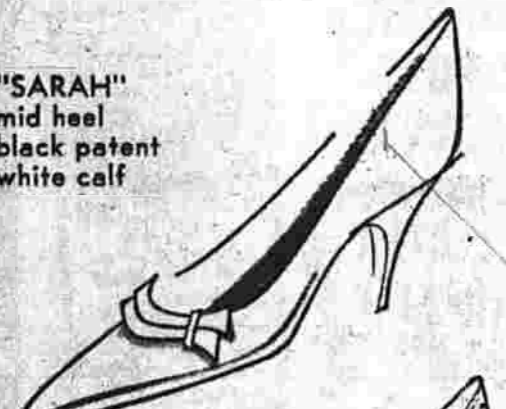
