The United States bears the major burden, Kennedy said, and has the right to explore possibilities of improving the Berlin atmosphere. Recalling Winston Churchill's dictum that "it is better to say, 'see than to say, war,'" Kennedy said:

"I shall continue to say, 'see and see if we can produce a useful result.'"

The President dealt this way with other inquiries:

Reunification — He thought a treaty concerning his father once had made to him about "Madame" had meant the night U.S. Steel announced its price increase. But the comment, which he repeated that night had to do only with steel's activities, not all business, he said. And as for the steel men, "that's past. Now we are working together, I hope."

Civil Rights — Kennedy urged the Senate to vote away a Southern filibuster against a bill of the administration says will stop the use of literacy tests to prevent Negroes from voting.

Nuclear — Only after very careful scientific deliberation, he said, will the United States set off a nuclear test in space. The government is studying whether a space blast would disturb the Van Allen radiation belt and hamper scientific discovery.

Gets Science Grant
DONALD F. WARREN of Andover, a science teacher at Bennett Junior High School, will study geology at a summer institute provided by the U.S. Geological Survey at the University of Maryland.

The institute will be held from June 25 through Aug. 9 at the university's geologic field station in the Northern Rocky Mountains.

Warren will go on a three-day trip to Yellowstone National Park and a five-day tour of Glacier National Park. A tour of Butte, Mont., copper mines is also planned. Guest lecturers will discuss various fields of geology.

Vending Machines Striving For More Soft Drink Sales

By SAM DAWSON AP Business News Analyst NEW YORK (AP)—Highly-styled vending machines are coming to the aid of the soft drink industry. You might think Americans are all but saturated with carbonated beverages now. Not so, says the industry. They could and should drink a lot more this summer, especially if it's a hot one.

And when they can spare time from their fierce rivalry, the producers and bottlers, both giants and regional ones, look for more ways to make you realize you're parched and make it easier for you to quench that thirst.

The vending machine industry's drive to place a second number of new gauges almost everywhere you can think of could be the answer to the bottlers' prayer. There are dispensers that look like the furniture in the sophisticated decor of doctor and dentist

offices. Other lively spots for machines, fancy or not, are boating marinas, country clubs, public golf courses, gas stations, even alongside the highway.

The vending industry predicts it'll sell 100,000 new machines for 1966 and 1967. It placed about 500,000 units on location, including the old standby. The Can Manufacturers Institute says that 110,000 units of steel were used in soft drink cans last year, a gain of 31 per cent over 1965.

And the carbonated beverage industry says its sales, in whatever container, of from a tap at the counter, rose from a billion dollars in 1950 to \$2 billion last year, and should top that in 1967.

Coca-Cola puts its sales, including orange juice and instant coffee, at \$337 million. Pepsi-Cola

But this year distribution perhaps is getting the most attention—along with increased advertising and promotion campaigns with Coca-Cola, Pepsi-Cola and other bottlers planning record sales.

One way or another, the industry is going to get you to drink more—soft concoctions, that is. But one thing that neither mechanization, science nor promotion genius can control is the weather. For the soft drink industry, this summer had better be hot.
