By HARRY KELLEY WASHINGTON (AP)—The Kennedy Administration last night, Assistant Secretary of Labor Jerry R. Holleman admitted, saying he had accepted \$1,000 from the indicted Texas financier. In a letter delivered to President Kennedy, Holleman revealed the gift from Estes—whose wheeling and dealing with two congressional committees and by four grand juries in Texas. He had taken the money from Estes, a friend for 10 years, because he was having trouble making ends meet on his government salary of \$10,400 a year.

U.S. Test Reported Anti-Sub N-Missile

## Romper Room Unfazed By TV Attrition Rate

One of the most intriguing television shows is Romper Room, a children's program which defies classification. It is on live in 93 cities every day, yet it is a syndicated show. The explanation is that the Baltimore headquarters every week sends 93 packages of material to each of the 93 cities. Every city does the same thing at the same time, only with a different Romper Room teacher and, of course, different children.

Romper Room has been operating in this way for 10 years. A program official says they once turned down a big offer from CBS

to become a true network production.

"We felt we shouldn't be on the network," the Romper Room man explained, "because part of our success and charm is that the teachers are local girls, who speak the local vernacular, and so are the children on each city's show."

Peculiarly, the 93 teachers—including some who speak Spanish in Puerto Rico and French in Canada—are all employed by the local stations, although they are trained in Baltimore. They are under contract to the Romper Room headquarters, but are paid by the stations themselves.

The sponsors are local, too, but the national headquarters sets the tone for what types of sponsors should be accepted. If a local teacher feels that the station is using an objectionable sponsor, she contacts Baltimore and the pressure comes from the main office. Once Romper Room took the program off in one city where the station refused to drop an objectionable sponsor.

Ten years ago, the airwaves were full of children's programs. Today, there are few, but Romper Room remains strong. They think one reason is because they combine the best features of local and national television.

Vincent J. Donohue is one of those who look back fondly on television's good old days. He was one of the directors who made it an exciting medium. There aren't many of them around any more.

You look at this veteran and you're suddenly struck with a reminder of just how young television is. Donohue still looks like a college boy, yet he was director of shows that are only vague memories—the Chevrolet hour of half-hour live drama programs, a summer comedy series starring Menasha Skulnik, a Sunday afternoon children's program which starred Gabby Hayes telling stories of American history (acted by people like Eva Marie Saint and Rod Steiger for \$75 per program). Of course, Donohue also did the Philco and Robert Montgomery Presents drama shows.

"Those were good days," Donohue says. "They were days when a play like that recent 'That's Where the Town Is Going,' which had Jason Robards Jr. and Kim Stanley as the stars, would be just another play, not a special."

And what happened to those days? One clue is contained in Donohue's recollection of the last Philco show which he directed and the first Playhouse 90 which he directed.

"The last Philco show," he says, "had a budget of \$13,500 for above-the-line costs—script actors, set and so on. Right after that, I went directly to the coast to start Playhouse 90, and the budget for

above-the-line costs on that was \$100,000."

As costs mounted, sponsors and producers had to go to film—where they could recoup some of the costs by selling residual rights—and the days of live, exciting, adventuresome television drew rapidly to a close. It was a case of strangulation in a noose of film.

Donehue switched to the stage. He is currently at work on the preliminary plans for the next Mary Martin show, which bears the working title, "Come One, Come All." The music is by Arthur Schwartz and Howard Dietz, and Donehue says he thinks it is "the best thing they've ever done." He admits there is some book trouble now, but that's par for the course.

Donehue's work, at the moment, is so involved with detail that he feels a sense of frustration.

"I said to my secretary yesterday," he says, "I thought I was in the arts. I've been so taken up with little details, I might as well be a bookkeeper."
