WASHINGTON (AP)—President Kennedy today ordered 1,800 U.S. Marines into Thailand, and the Defense Department said U.S. military forces there will be built to about 5,000 men.

The announcement made plain the U.S. forces will go into battle if the Communists in neighboring Laos cross the Thai border.

"These forces are to help insure the territorial integrity of this peaceful country," the President said in the dispatch of Marines to Thailand.

In a follow to the announcement, Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara said the U.S. military force in Thailand would be given a new overall command and increased to about 5,000 men.

The buildup will include the 1,000-man Army battle group already in Thailand. To this will be added the Marine battalion of about 1,800 men, from the 7th Fleet. The Marine contingent also will have its own technical air units.

Indonesia Aids Troops Snared On New Guinea

HOLLANDIA, West New Guinea (AP)—Four Indonesian transport planes supported by two Mitchell bombers dropped 40 or more paratroops and supplies into West New Guinea at dawn today to help the United States military forces in the jungle south of the village of Fakrak, in westernmost New Guinea.

The two other transports dropped supplies to about 50 paratroops and supplies into West New Guinea April 27 and accounts were being checked by Dutch, marine and Pappan volunteers about 16 miles north of Fakrak, the communists said.

It was believed the paratroops came from Indonesian Communist forces driven off—apparently by naval guns—but that two C-119 transport planes succeeded in dropping at least 60 paratroops and supplies into the jungle south of Fakrak, in westernmost New Guinea.

The Dutch said the paratroops were dropped in the area of Fakrak while the supplies were unloaded north of the village in the general vicinity where the first contingent was dropped April 27.

A spokesman said none of the four was shot down. There was no report of contact on the ground between Dutch forces and the Indonesians.

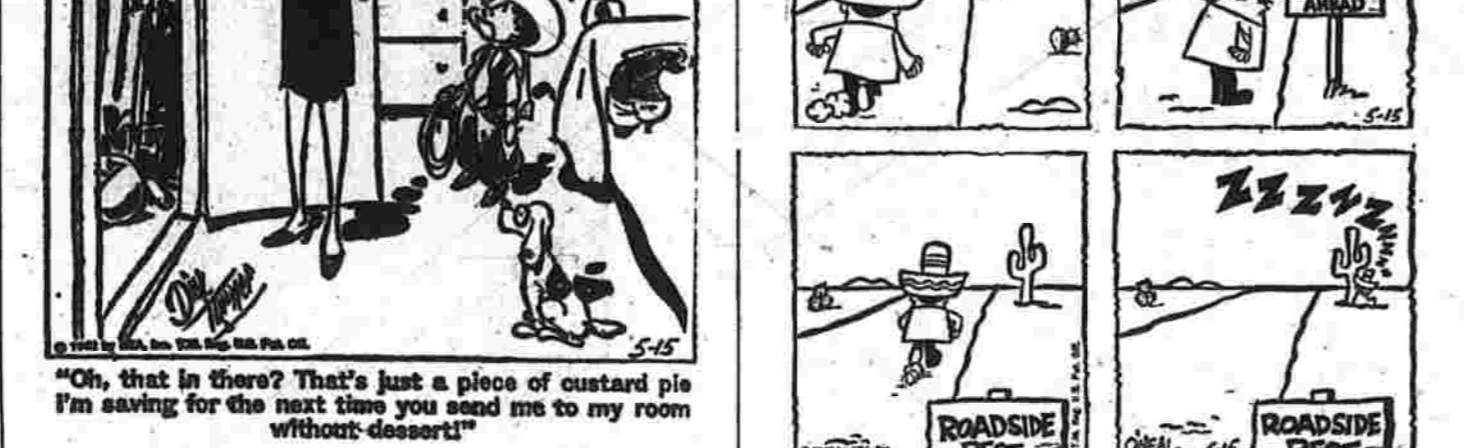
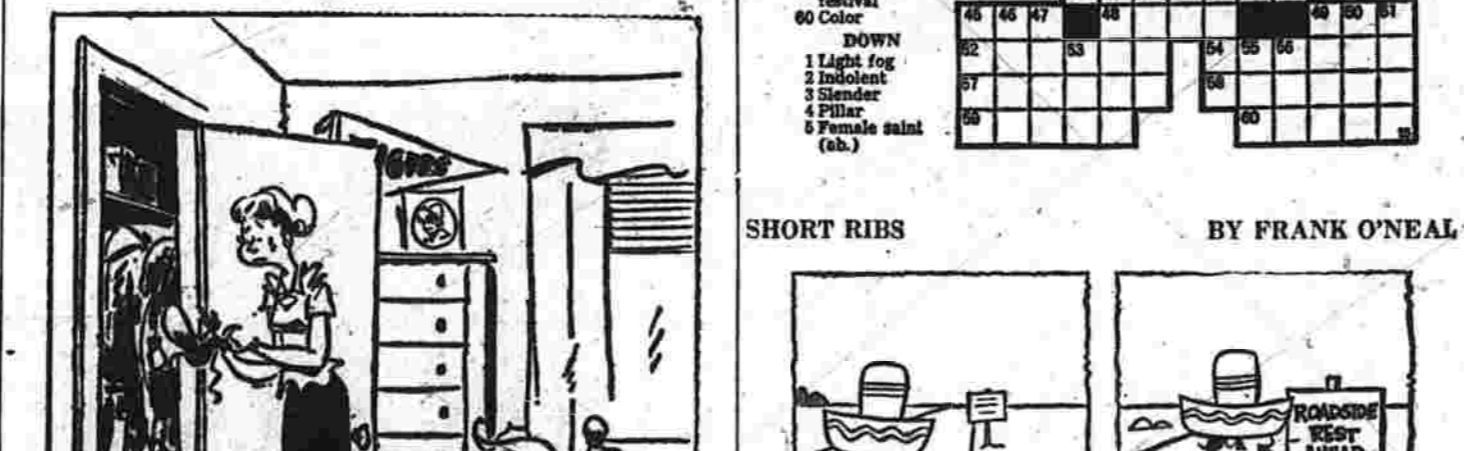
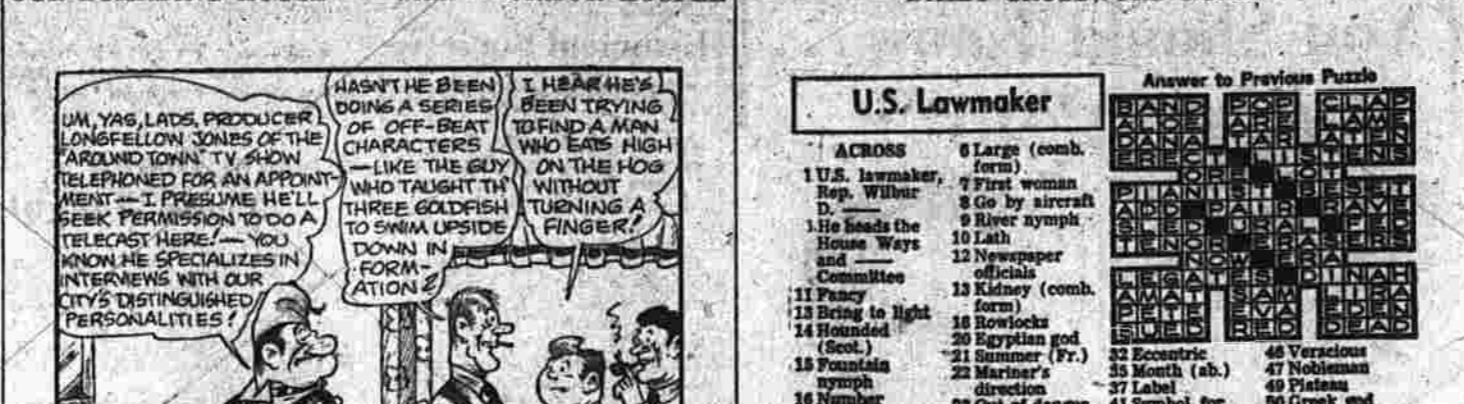
