Biggest Pacific Shot U.S. Increases N-Danger Zone

HONOLULU (AP)—Extension of the United States high altitude danger area around Johnston Island was seen today as a preliminary to the firing of the biggest nuclear blast of the Pacific test series.

There was no official comment from Joint Task Force 8 on the precise altitude and size of the detonation but unofficial sources said it will be from 50 to 500 times as powerful as bombs that destroyed Hiroshima.

There have been reports it will be several megatons in force. A megaton blast is the equivalent of the explosion of a million tons of TNT.

The big blast will be set off about 200 miles high, the sources said. It will be the highest and biggest nuclear shot in U.S. history and will be seen in Hawaii, 750 miles northeast of Johnston.

The Atomic Energy Commission and the Defense Department announced Saturday that the nuclear danger area surrounding Johnston Island will be extended 40 miles

For More Than 30 Years Jennie B. Wind Dies; Local Civic Leader

But Not in So Many Words Ribicoff Asks Delegates Support His Senate Bid

HARTFORD (AP)—Democratic state convention delegates report they have received letters from Welfare Secretary Abraham Ribicoff asking them to support his Senate bid—but not in so many words.

"It is most important," said the letters, dated June 8, "that the candidates we nominate and the platform we adopt carry forward the programs of the Kennedy and Dempsey administrations."

"I am most appreciative," Ribicoff continued, "of the many endorsements I have received throughout Connecticut and the many offers of personal support for the Democratic U.S. Senate nomination."

Ribicoff, who left the governorship to John N. Dempsey in January 1960 to join the Kennedy cabinet, has never formally and unequivocally announced that he is a candidate for the Democratic nomination for senator.

He has been sharply criticized for this by the only avowed candidate, Congressman-at-large Frank Kowalski.

In the letters to the 950-odd delegates, Ribicoff said: "If the delegates at our state convention nominate me, I will be highly honored. As the Democratic candidate for the United States Senate, I would campaign vigorously throughout Connecticut and for the entire Democratic ticket."

The convention opens at the Bushnell Memorial here July 13.

Connecticut Republicans rounded out their slate for the Newcomer election with the selection of five candidates for Congress Saturday.

At Westport, Fourth District Congressman Abner Sibal was chosen by acclamation to run for a second term. His Democratic opponent may be State Treasurer Donald Irwin of Norwalk, who

Seven Highway Deaths Among 8 Weekend Fatals

Accidents claimed the lives of at least eight persons in Connecticut over the weekend. Seven of them died as a result of traffic accidents.

Early Saturday morning, Robert C. Schwartzbach, 19, was killed in Darien when his sports car struck a tree and a utility pole. Schwartzbach, member of a prominent family, was a student at Yale.

The youth had attended a graduation party in Westchester County, N. Y., several hours before and had just left the home of his date in Darien, police said.

A five-year-old Norwalk girl, Margaret McBride, drowned Saturday in Five Mile River behind a neighbor's house as she tried to retrieve her tricycle from the water.

At St. Mary's Hospital in Waterbury, Miss Madeline Murray, 69, Danbury, died Saturday of injuries suffered in a one-car accident in Waterbury May 31.

Johnston, 54, of Thomaston, died of injuries incurred June 2 in another one-car crash in Thomaston.

Mrs. Florence Cotton, 41, East Windsor, was killed early Sunday when a car she was riding in went off Windsorville road and struck a tree. Her husband, Donald, who suffered minor injuries, was charged with misconduct with a motor vehicle.

Another Norwalk girl, seven-year-old Linda Smith, was injured fatally by a car Sunday afternoon while she was riding her bicycle. She died later at Norwalk Hospital.

A short time later, Joseph Wheeler, 73, East Haven, struck a car head-on on Route 1 in the center of Madison. Wheeler died in an ambulance on the way to Grace-New Haven Hospital.

At the intersection of Routes 79 and 80 in North Madison, a sports car which State Police said was driven by John C. Rogers of Forestville crashed on Sunday night. Rogers' passenger, Alan B. Couch, 22, Plainville, was killed. Rogers, also 22, was treated at Middletown Memorial Hospital in Middletown for minor injuries and released.

After he was questioned by police, Rogers was charged with negligent homicide and released in a \$1,000 bond.

Socialists Rap Kennedy Delay On Civil Rights

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Socialist party accuses the Kennedy administration of falling "miserably" in responding to the profound challenge of civil rights.

And, both the Democratic and Republican parties, reneged on their 1960 campaign promises in this field, Socialist convention delegates said in their own party platform for 1962, adopted yesterday at the start-up of a three-day national convention.

The platform declared the "pressing urgency" of American Negroes demanding their constitutional rights in one of the most "fresh and promising" things that has appeared on the American scene since the mid-fifties.

In the past two years, the Socialists noted, the dramatic sit-in movement has entered a new phase. It is not just challenging statutory Jim Crow, the Socialists said, but "the whole rotten structure of white supremacy with its one party system is being shattered."

To Win House Control GOP to Emphasize Stocks, Estes Case

SEATTLE, Wash. (AP)—Republicans are counting heavily on uneasiness in the stock market and the Billie Sol Estes scandal to help them win control of the House in the November election.

The House, as spelled out by members of the Republican National Committee open formal sessions today with far more optimistic feelings about the election results than they had a month ago.

National Chairman William E. Miller put this feeling into words when he told a gathering of Young Republicans: "We have the issue on our side this time. We are going to win in November."

The anti-administration feeling in the party is so strong that Miller and other committee members, revolve around what they called a lack of confidence by the business community in President Kennedy, as exemplified by the stock market's gyrations—a reputed effort by the President to enlarge executive power and a new GOP slogan that there are "too many Kennedys in government."

Fred Scribner of Maine, the committee's general counsel, said a national party survey indicates people in general "are not nearly as happy as they were with the way the country is being run."

Individual committee members reported a "hit" in Republican ranks, most of which was due to what they said was adverse reaction to Kennedy's steel price roll back tactics. Several mentioned the revelations concerning Estes' manipulations in grain storage and cotton acreage allotments in Texas as being likely to damage Democrats.

A typical report came from South Dakota committee man Carroll Lockhart, whose state was honored at a World's Fair ceremony Sunday.

"The anti-administration feeling in our state is so strong that I believe we are going to have a substantial victory there in November," Lockhart said.

Sen. Francis Case, R-S.D., was opposed for re-election in the general election by Gov. George McGovern, who quit as head of the Food for Peace program to make the race.

Savings Banks Drop Fight on Dividends Tax

WASHINGTON (AP)—The United States Savings & Loan league has broken off its battle against a withholding tax on interest and dividends—a key provision of President Kennedy's tax reform bill.

The group had been one of the strongest opponents of the withholding plan, but a Treasury spokesman said Sunday the league had written Secretary of the Treasury Douglas Dillon that it was dropping its opposition.

"The tax bill has been passed by the House and is now being studied by the Senate Finance Committee, where it is under sharp attack," the spokesman said.

The league was a principal source of thousands of letters written to Congress members by savings and loan officials and opponents urging elimination of the withholding provision.

The campaign brought a rebuff from Kennedy at a news conference May 9. He said the mail reaching the White House and the Capitol indicated a great number of people have been badly misinformed by advertisements and circulars financed by savings and loan associations, banks and other groups.

Urges All Foes Help To Revive Economy

NEW HAVEN (AP)—President Kennedy, calling for a partnership with government to pump new life into the nation's economy, accused his sharpest critics today of spouting "ancient cliches" instead of facing up to real problems of the times.

In the serene atmosphere of a Yale commencement, Kennedy declared his administration is not anti-business but made it clear that the government intends to do its part in trying to block recession and generate prosperity.

Standing under a canopy of Yale blue in the ivy-hung re-creation of the university's Old Campus, Kennedy said some of the arguments he has heard lately "sound like old records, long playing, left over from the middle Thirties."

The debate of that era was significant and productive, he said.

"But it took place in a different world with different needs and tasks," the President said.

"It is our responsibility today to live in our own world—and to identify the needs and discharge the tasks of the 1960's."

Kennedy received a warm welcome from the townfolk after arriving by plane from New York and an ovation from the crowd of 12,000 who sat under the elms of the tradition-steeped campus in warm, sunny weather.

He came to receive an honorary law degree, one of 14 honoraries presented at Yale's 261st commencement.

Without identifying his antagonists from the worlds of business and politics, Kennedy said debate is healthy although "up to now somewhat barren."

Serious consideration of contemporary issues should postwar western Europe to unrivaled economic progress, he said.

"But let us not engage in the wrong argument at the wrong time between the wrong people in the wrong country—while the real problems of our own time grow and multiply," Kennedy said.

Fiscal and monetary questions of the 60's can not be solved by falling back on outmoded formulas nor by political bombardment, he insisted.

He departed from his speech at one point to cite what he called conflicting economic theories being offered today.

In his prepared text, Kennedy vowed his clash with the steel industry personified by Yale alumnus Roger Blough of U.S. Steel—did not signify his administration is hostile to business. But he said the government is obliged to exercise "watchful concern" for our economic health while business and labor live up

Kennedy Glad He's Yale Man

NEW HAVEN (AP)—President Kennedy, a 1949 Harvard graduate, said he was particularly glad about the honorary degree awarded him today by Yale University.

He told graduating class at the Yale commencement in a prepared speech that a lot of his troubles had been caused by Yale men, and added: "Now that I am a Yale man too, it is time for peace."

Kennedy mentioned a recent "minor disagreement" over steel prices with U.S. Steel President Roger M. Blough of the Yale Law School class of 1931.

He said he had "had some complaints too from my friend Henry Ford, of the class of 1940."

TRAIN RAMS SCHOOL, 67 BURNED
BUENOS AIRES (AP)—A commuter train collided in dense fog today with a school bus carrying more than 100 kindergarten children, dragging it hundreds of yards. Officials said 25 persons were killed and about 80 seriously injured. One of the dead was a woman teacher aboard the bus. One of the few children to escape unharmed was a little girl who says she leapt out of the onrushing train in the fog and jumped through an open window.

BECK LOSES PLEA
WASHINGTON (AP)—The Supreme Court refused today to review the conviction of Dave Beck, former Teamsters Union president on charges of filing false federal tax returns for the union for 1950 and 1952. The high tribunal, in a May 14 decision on another appeal, affirmed conviction of Beck on a charge of embezzlement of \$1,000 from the sale of an automobile owned by the union. He was sentenced to 15 years' imprisonment on the embezzlement conviction. The sentence was pronounced in a Washington State court.

MEDICARE COMPROMISE
WASHINGTON (AP)—The Kennedy administration has invited proposals for a compromise on its health care plan for the aged. Reliable congressional sources said today this was the gist of an hour-long session Secretary of Welfare Abraham A. Ribicoff held with the House Ways and Means Committee behind closed doors. Ribicoff told the committee, it was understood that President Kennedy is adamant on one point only—that the health plan for the aged is to be handled as an extension of the Social Security system, financed by an increased payroll tax.

One Dead, 219 Hurt As Speeding Train Plunges Off Curve
MISSOULA, Mont. (AP)—A Northern Pacific luxury train shot off a mountain curve in western Montana Sunday, killing a child and injuring 219 of its 350 passengers.

Of the 219 persons injured, 151 were treated and released. Sixty-eight were held for further treatment and observation. Still others, taken to a Missoula hotel to await further transportation, complained of bumps and bruises but did not seek hospital aid.

Only two of the 17 cars remained on the rails in the derailed train, which may cost the railroad \$1 million.

The other 15 cars of the Seattle-to-Chicago North Coast Limited catapulted down a 100-foot embankment 15 miles northwest of Missoula.

Two of the olive-green passenger cars plunged all the way to the bottom, coming to rest in a ditch along U.S. Highway 93 and 10A.
