Partners are a necessary evil. They never know the value of their cards, and you have to be very stern with them to keep them from playing too far out of line. Whenever I get to thinking about the wisdom of partners, in general I recall a hand that came along in 1952.

Take a good look at the West hand. Surely you disapprove of West's final pass. You don't have to say why. Just see what happened.

West led the jack of diamonds, dummy covered with the queen, and I won with the king in the East hand. (I had to make my self the hero of this story, but my journalistic oath compels me to tell the truth in this column.)

I continued with the ten of diamonds and then tricked to the ace and the deuce of hearts. My partner won with the king of hearts and led third heart forcing dummy to ruff.

Not knowing how to proceed, declarer tried to run the clubs. I ruffed the third club with the ten of spades, and South over-ruffed with the jack.

South next ruffed his last heart with dummy's other trump and led a fourth club from dummy. I ruffed with the seven of clubs, and South over-ruffed with the nine.

By this time South was down to 10-3 of spades. He cashed the king, but west was not able to win two trump tricks with the 6-4 of clubs.

"oward," I snarled at my partner. "You had two natural trump tricks and you didn't have the nerve to take them."

Emphasis On Health

An astronaut's way of feeding babies, a medical passport, and potential risks in lollipop rewards are health news items.

Babies and mothers are promised a divide from the space age.

Astronaut John H. Glenn Jr. ate from a plastic squeeze tube, squirting food into his mouth, during orbit. Now, the same idea is being developed for newborn, easy-feeding of babies during travel by car or plane, or on picnic. Similar food tubes are equipped with a clear, plastic, hollow-stemmed spoon attached to the tube.

Just the right amount of fruit, vegetable or other food can be squeezed into the spoon. A hermetic seal in the neck of the tube is punctured when the spoon is squeezed onto the tube. Tube and spoon are disposed of afterward.

A baby food company is testing the squeeze tubes, originally developed by the American Can Company for feeding astronauts in weightless conditions of space flight.

Medical Passports

To ensure proper emergency medical treatment at home or abroad, you can carry a medical passport listing essential information which a doctor or hospital should know about your own health. The pocket-sized document can contain data on treatment for a heart condition, for diabetes, epilepsy, or other disorders, as well as giving your blood type, allergies, and results of X-ray and laboratory studies.

Published by the Medical Passport Foundation, Inc., New York, the passports are provided to physicians and hospitals at cost.

Lollipop Reward

You may be setting an unwise precedent in rewarding or bribing a child with a lollipop or cookie, says Dr. Morton B. Glenn of New York City.

Food regarded as a reward in childhood or as a bribe could tend to encourage obesity. "The harassed mother who says to her 2-year-old, 'If you'll be good, I'll give you a cookie,' is probably starting to habit that could ultimately result in her child's having a shorter life span as an adult" due to obesity.

Woman in New Japanese Cabinet

Miss Tsunayo Kondo, 60, was a surprise appointment to the new cabinet named today by Japanese Prime Minister Hayato Ikeda. She was made state minister in charge of the Science and Technology Agency and the Atomic Agency Commission. Miss Kondo is the second woman ever to hold a Japanese cabinet post. Drought Enters Fourth Week in Northeast States

A northeastern drought that is drying up farm land and toasting pastures here has entered its fourth week with mounting pleas for governmental assistance.

Some showers were predicted for parts of the afflicted area today, but many farmers insisted that even excessive rainfall could not undo damage already done.

In Pennsylvania, as federal disaster areas and is considering the plight of eight other counties in that state.

Eight New Jersey counties have been declared federal disaster areas. Farmers in a 24-county area of New York State are clamoring for similar treatment. The 24 counties represent more than seven million acres and include 38,000 of New York State's 80,000 farms.

A federal disaster area declaration makes it possible for affected farmers to obtain aid in the form of low-interest loans and permission to use lands retired in the soil bank.

Several small towns in New Jersey have placed mill controls on domestic water use because of low reservoirs. No community, however, is reported to have a dangerously low water supply.

In New York City, no measurable precipitation has fallen for 21 days, approaching the record of 27 days set Sept. 1 through Sept. 27, 1951.

The 17 rainless days in July topped the previous July mark of 16 set in 1951.

A New York City official said the city is in no danger of a water shortage, but "that doesn't mean we have water to waste."

In New Jersey, Gov. Richard I. Hughes awarded federal aid aimed at relieving a drought-caused feed shortage that he says is swelling hay prices to black market proportions.

"The drought in some sections of New Jersey was rated even worse than it was in 1957, considered the worst drought year in the state's history."

Business Mirror

NEW YORK (AP)—Like a coy maiden the economy still doesn't say yes and it doesn't say no.

The clear cut answer to what it's going to do, which could settle the question of a tax cut now or later, still eludes the statisticians—and apparently the policy makers.

Business statistics for the most part continue to be higher than a year ago. Many are higher than the previous month. But the gains are far from impressive. And to many persons they are downright disappointing.

Part of the trouble is that just being better than last year doesn't satisfy the planners who have set higher goals for the economic growth rate. Business must be paid faster to take care of unemployment in other life. It's an American trait to be restless if everything isn't always bigger and better.

Part of the problem is the unyielding economic institutions. A large portion believes that the year as a whole will be a good one, if not spectacular. But as large a group fears another recession is being invited. The American mind is not ready to accept the marked slowdown in the monthly increases of the chief business statistics.

Warning for Public
And the break in stock prices—though variously explained—is looked upon by a majority of the general public as a warning of possibly less prosperous times ahead.

Yet in June personal incomes rose to a record high. There were gains in retail, wholesale and service industry payrolls. The disturbing factor was a slight drop in manufacturing payrolls. And this made the increase from May to June the lowest for any month since January.

Industrial production also rose to a high in June. But the gain over May was so slight as to be unnoticeable on most charts. Acting as a hedge against a strike or Ford strike. Production of most other goods continued to rise.

The Ford work stoppage is over and auto production and sales still look quite healthy.

The steel downturn, although basic and disturbing, could be due to an earlier buildup of inventories as a hedge against a strike or price increase, followed by a cutback as users lived off these stocks.

A drop in retail sales in June from May also worries the month. But retail sales still are ahead of a year ago, and only a few see June as necessarily setting a trend.

New orders for heavy machinery and other capital goods have fallen—often a forerunner of a downturn in industry. Now how businessmen are watching to see if new tax incentives, just granted still pending in Congress, will revive this form of business spending.

But in all the present uncertainty these things seem clear:

1. The economy hasn't ground to a halt, but it isn't growing fast enough to please most planners in or out of government.

2. Businessmen are uneasy and

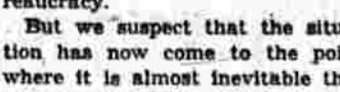

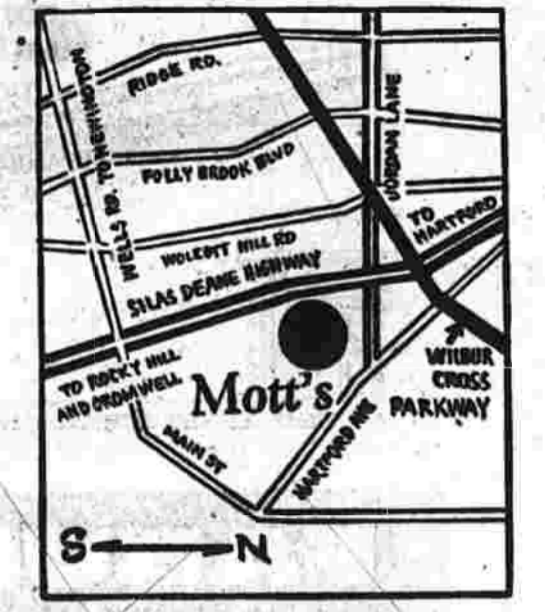

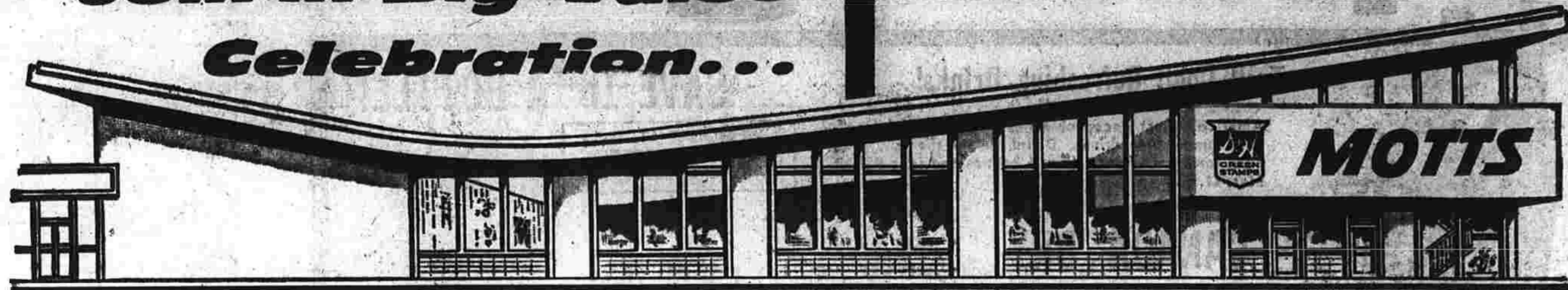
