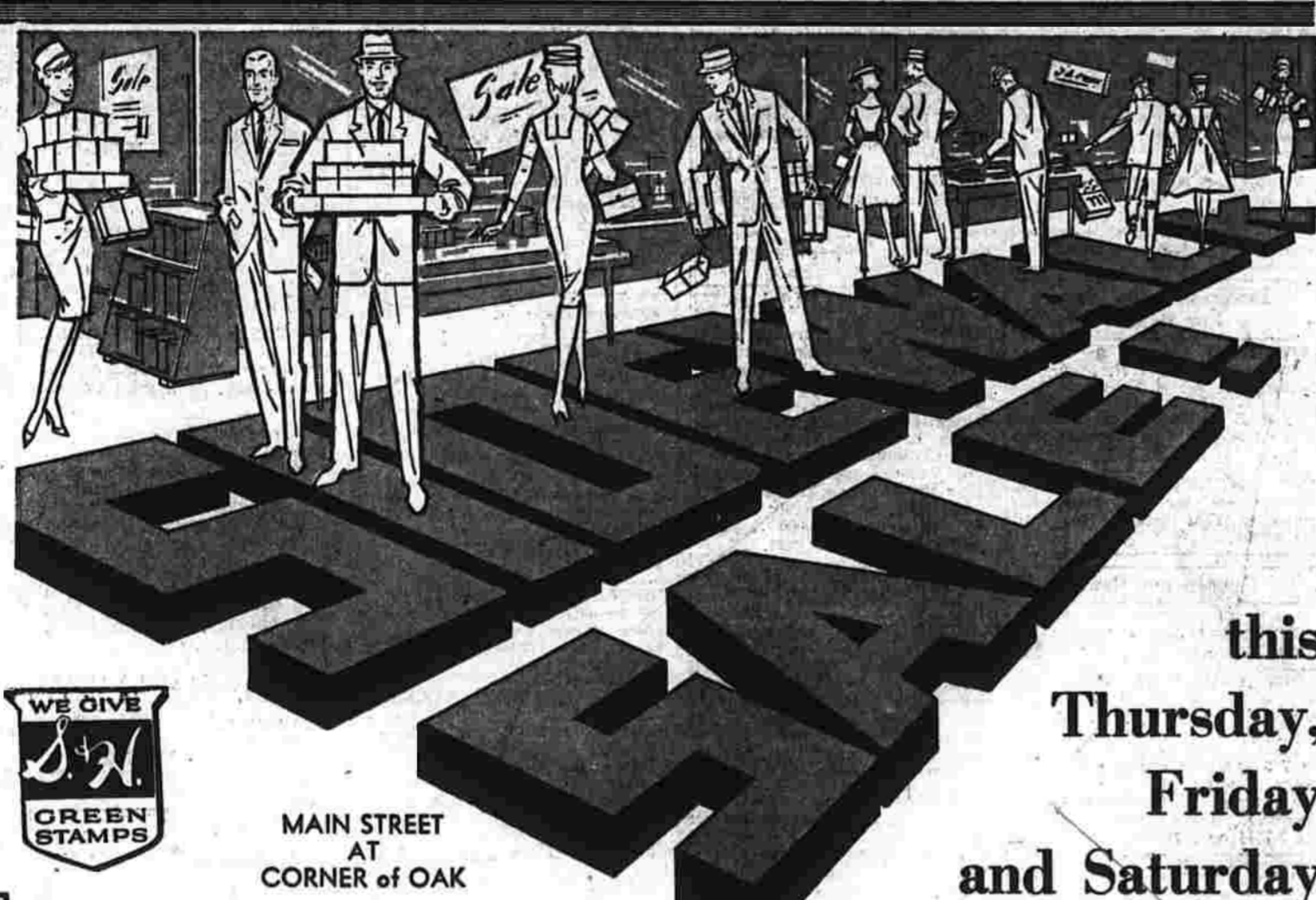

Restless

The natives—of we may be pardoned the momentary luxury of referring to our friends and equals in the world as if they were some how just a little behind us in the process of self government—were restless yesterday.

In this hemisphere, they suspended democracy and self government in the nation of Peru in favor of control by another of those military juntas so familiar to present day history in all hemispheres.

There was a legal president in office; he was arrested; there had been a legal election whose result the army did not like; the legal election was cancelled; the troops with all this in mind, coupled with similar recent developments in Argentina, and with present political disorder in Brazil, such development tends to subvert and mock the idea that this hemisphere has any real firm unity in democracy which may present as a living alternative to the dictatorship currently being operated in Cuba.

As for the United States, in taking the lead in holding off the matter of diplomatic recognition for the new regime in Peru, as if it realized the time has finally come to stop pretending it could either promote or preserve democracy in this hemisphere by playing ball with any military junta which comes along. This policy may be better late than never; it is late.

In the Near East, in the nation of Iran, a regime which looked good and hopeful and which was at least supposedly trying to do the right kind of thing has succumbed, at least temporarily, to the pressures of those who do not care for social and economic change. Premier Ali Amiri, the reputedly honest and sincere public servant who has been trying to break up some of the feudalism of Iran, quits office with public inference that we could have been of more help to him than we were.

That inference is disputed in Washington, but what cannot be disputed is that, wherever the blame, the situation in Iran now veers once more from the effort toward democracy into a condition of traditionalism and statism which some of our friends to the East may now attempt to seignior.

In both instances, in Peru and in Iran, lands of ancient cultures and ancient glory, long submerged in feudalism based on peonage, try to find their way into a 20th century sun. We try to help, and do help, not always with perfect fact, not always with the right kind of help, not always with and through the right people. Along with our imperfections goes the best political intelligence of the ordinary people involved in such countries; they are not necessarily quick to prefer the intelligences of democracy; they are not easily trained to use and hold and defend the democratic processes.

It is often all too easy for those whose privilege rests on the continuing banishment of democracy to create and control strategic crisis and chaos.

This has been essentially what has been happening in Peru and Iran—that the entrenched order has been creating, and controlling more crisis and chaos in order to turn back the advance of democratic possibilities. The strategy works for a while, and then the blood of mob violence and revolution—in favor of a democracy, the mob itself will then soon forget—can take over. Our good efforts, abroad, wherever we can, it is to assist this almost ceaseless cycle of surge and repression at a peaceful, reasonable pace, where reasonable means no compromise toward progress without violence.

Rockville-Vernon Fire District Zoning Study Promises Variety of Changes

Broad outlines of a federally sponsored study for the Vernon Fire District's zoning commission have been furnished, and it seems one of the study's recommendations will be for a more change of some commercial land on Rte. 30 and 83 to residential use.

This much was indicated today by Charles Brown, commission chairman, in reviewing the scope of the study to be done by Technical Planning Associates of New Haven, consultants for the commission.

Other zone change possibilities, which may be used at public hearings to be held by the commission in the spring and early summer, also were commented on by Brown.

Under the study, geared to implementation of the zoning ordinance in the master plan, it is probable that more land will be zoned for residential use than industrial zones, Brown said.

It also is contemplated that the present C1 and C2 commercial zones into the new commercial zone designations of CA, CB and CAY zones, Brown said.

Interstate Trailer Area

Other efforts seem likely to be toward the Interstate Trailer Area at Vernon Trailer Park area in the community plan, Brown said.

He added there are no recommendations along with the zoning ordinance, but the study will include a review of the Bolton Lake neighborhood and proposed changes in the zoning ordinance.

Reds Urge Ban On Spread of Nuclear Arms

GENEVA (AP)—The Soviet Union indicated today it would withhold nuclear weapons from China if the West did likewise with West Germany and other Atlantic Allies.

Soviet Deputy Foreign Minister Valentin Zorin told a committee of the 13-nation disarmament conference in Geneva today that the United States, Britain and France in a firm pledge to stop the spread of nuclear weapons.

He said the four nuclear powers should undertake commitments not to supply atomic arms or military nuclear data to any other country, or to which does not possess them. These countries in turn should pledge not to add nuclear weapons and not to transfer them to other countries.

Zorin bitterly attacked West German military and civilian leaders who are pushing for a nuclear arms race. He said the West German proposal is "a piece of blatant war propaganda."

Britain's Sir Michael Wright said the Soviet proposal is "a piece of blatant war propaganda."

Zorin said that preparations are being made for the start of the disarmament conference in Geneva on Aug. 12. He said the conference will discuss the disarmament of nuclear powers.

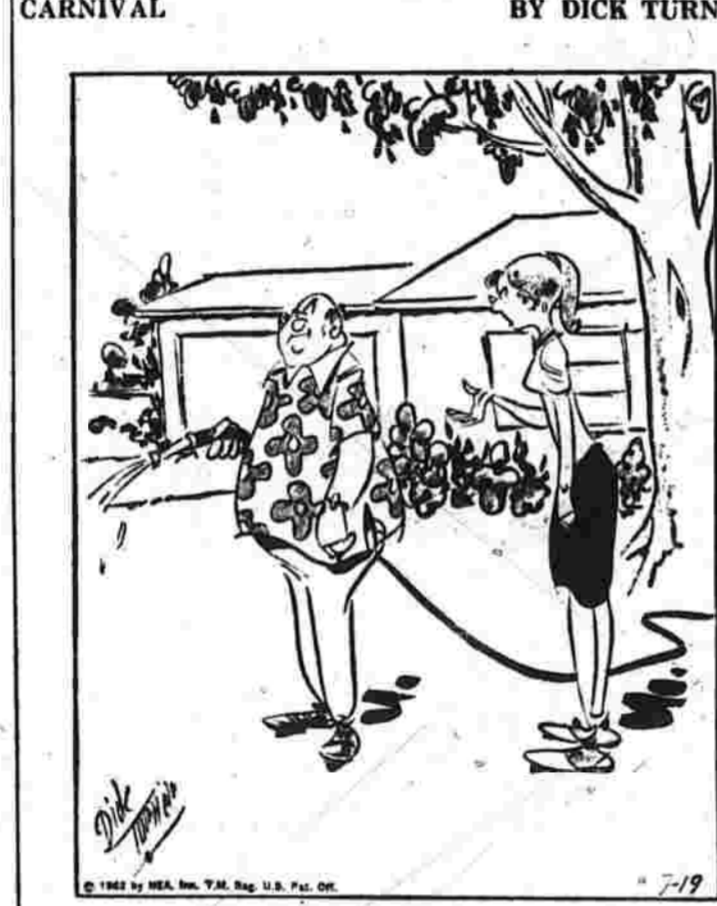

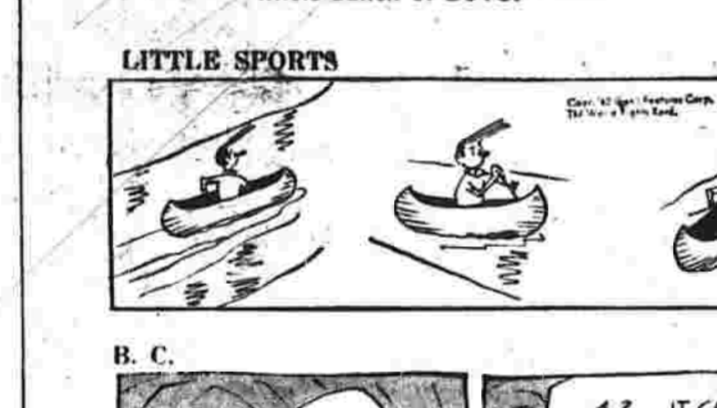

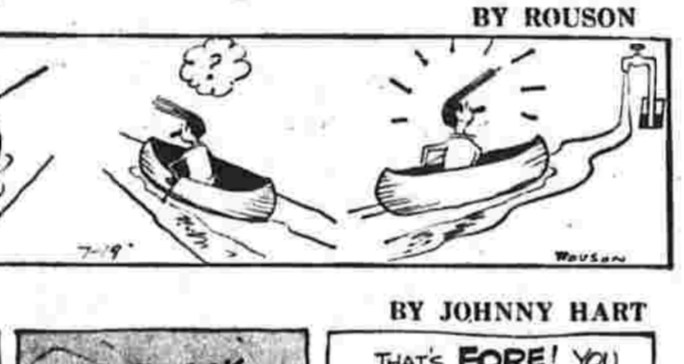
