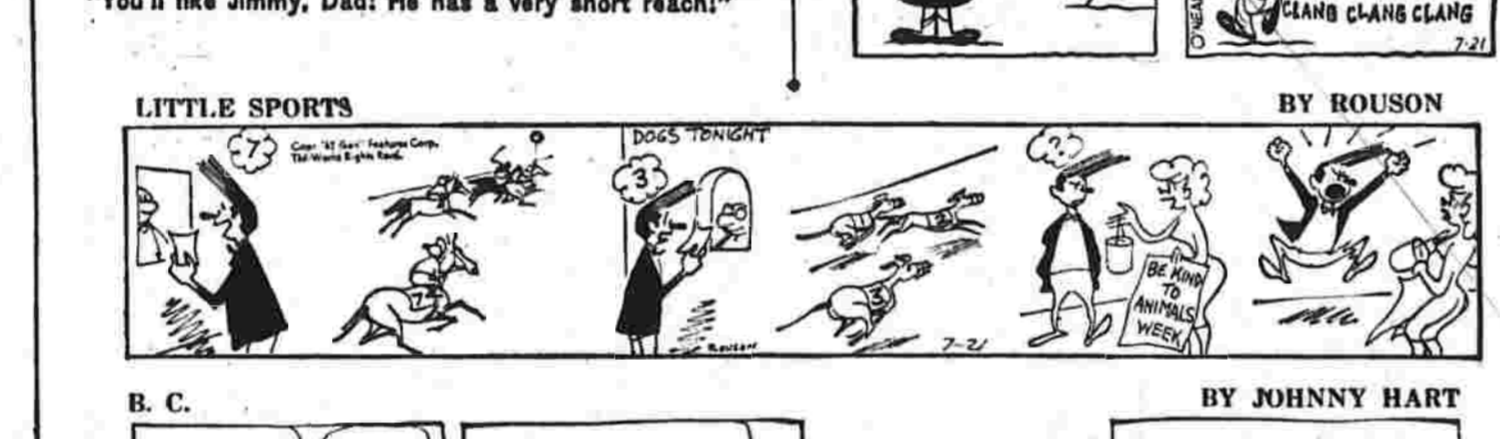
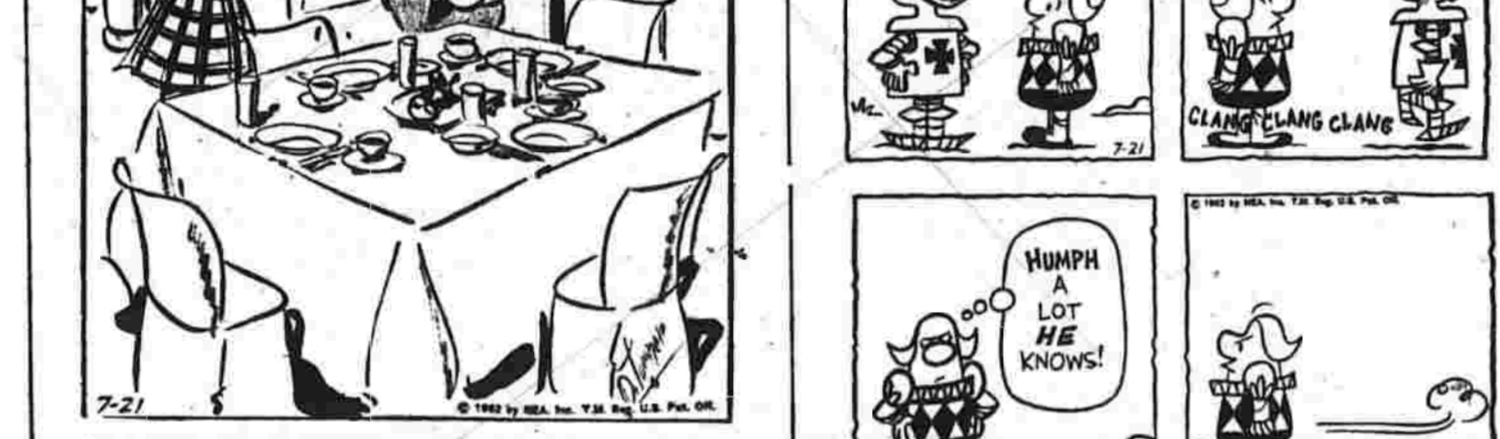

Vic Damone Stars, Hosts 'Lively Ones'

If you're a "Hazel" fan or not, its summer replacement, "The Lively Ones" starring Vic Damone as host, promises some pleasant diversion for the next eight weeks. Beginning this Thursday, "The Lively Ones" will present contemporary jazz comedy, dancing and singing. This week's guest stars will include Peggy Lee and Woody Herman in addition to a cast of regulars.

According to producer Barry Shear, "It is not a variety show." Shear, who also will direct the program, says, "When the young people of today grow up and tire of rock 'n' roll, they turn to other entertainments, some of which are very sophisticated. We'll take our viewers out on location to the places where the young set of today, 'the lively set,' goes. Our off-beat approach won't stop there, either. Vic Damone, who will host the program, will seldom introduce a guest in the regular way. Our introductions and transitions between performers will be done with audio-visual devices.

"We'll present some entertainers who are nationally known and also some who are best known to a special group of aficionados. We're looking for a special quality of entertainment, not just for famous names.

"Locations for some of the original spots will include such West Coast spots as the UCLA campus, Malibu Beach, Hollywood and Vine with the Capitol Record Building in the background, the new baseball stadium in Chavez Ravine, and Mulholland Dr. in the Hollywood Hills. Some of the locations will be actual, others will be recreated in the NBC Burbank studio."

Vic Damone, possessed of a dynamic baritone voice, today is, in every sense of the word, one of the top stars in show business. Many of his supper-club bookings are made two years ahead, and his recording career is booming like never before.

But Damone, like so many show business personalities, had his ups and downs before reaching his goal in the entertainment world.

In 1949, Vic was an overnight sensation when he made his Hollywood debut at the Mocambo on the Sunset Strip. The Hollywood trade papers and downtown dailies carried ecstatic reviews of Vic Damone's performance. "A great new star," said one; "The young singer drew waves of applause from Hollywood's usually blasé first-nighters," said another.

Abe Lastfogel, head of the giant William Morris talent agency, came to Damone's dressing room after the show and said, "Lad, you're going places."

On the strength of his success at the Mocambo, MGM signed Vic

to a movie contract and he made four films, "Rich, Young and Pretty," "Athena," "Hit the Deck," and "Kismet." Artistically, the pictures were nothing to shout about, but they did well at the box office. So did Damone. He continued on the night club circuit, boosted to even greater prominence by his million-selling single, "Mye Breaking My Heart."

But something happened. Vic's rocket to the top slowed down. There were no more movies, no more hit records, few top club offers. What happened?

"I was to blame for everything," Vic says now. "I used to get all tied up when I went out on stage to sing. Actually, I didn't like what I had become. But I've since learned—the hard way—that

you've got to have respect for yourself and for what you're doing. I didn't then, I do now."

Maturity is also a vital factor, Damone believes. "When you're young, it's pretty easy to let all those superlatives go to your head. And when that happens—you're in trouble."

Eleven years after his Mocambo debut, Damone came back to the same spot—then known as the Cloister—and since that April night in 1960, he has been making come true all the glorious things that were predicted for him in 1949.

In September 1961, he signed an exclusive contract with Capitol and recorded his first LP two days later. After its release in January 1962, the album, "Linger Awhile," came an overnight best-seller. Sales of the album in the first month were four times greater than any of the albums in the same period.

Damone gives credit for the resurgence in his career to a new approach to everything. The new approach can be summed in four words: "I take it easy."

Telstar Sends Abroad News Parley, Concert

Live television coverage of a portion of President Kennedy's news conference and a concert at Mount Rushmore in South Dakota will be included in the American broadcast Monday, July 23, which will mark the first live television exchange between the three American networks and European broadcast organizations.

The program will be transmitted to Europe via Telstar on the 123rd orbit of the communications satellite, starting at about 3 p.m. EDT. It will be followed by a European program which will be relayed to the United States by Telstar on its 124th orbit, starting at about 6 p.m. EDT. Each of the broadcasts will be approximately 15 minutes in length, and each will be seen live on the three American networks.

The concert at Mount Rushmore will feature the 350-voice choir of the Mormon Tabernacle of Salt Lake City. The coverage will mark the first live network TV pictures of the 60-foot heads of Presidents Washington, Jefferson, Lincoln and Theodore Roosevelt carved in the mountainside by sculptor Gutzon Borglum.

The American program will be produced by the news departments of the three networks—ABC News, CBS News and NBC News. The production staff numbers about 300—including correspondents, cameramen, producers, directors, engineers and technicians. The program will use 50 cameras in Washington, Mount Rushmore and other locations around the country. Three of the correspondents who will appear on the program are Howard K. Smith of ABC, Walter Cronkite of CBS, and Chet Huntley of NBC.

The producers of the program, Ted Fetter of ABC, Fred Friendly of CBS and Gerald Green of NBC, plan to show American life and some American events as they are at the time of the broadcast—in the first use of Telstar for the kind of immediacy and reality that is expected to be a prime function of satellite TV broadcasting.

Commentary on the program will be in seven languages—English, French, German, Italian, Swedish, Dutch and Spanish. The English audio will be transmitted by the satellite. The others, each spoken by a newsmen fluent in the language, will be sent to Europe by trans-Atlantic telephone circuits.

The remote pickups for the American program will be coordinated in New York. From there the program will be transmitted by television lines to the ground station at Andover, Maine, which will beam the signal to Telstar. The communications satellite will then re-broadcast it to ground stations in Europe—one at Goonhilly in Cornwall, England, and the other at Lannion in Brittany, France. From these two points the program will be transmitted by television lines to the 16 nations in the European Broadcasting Union—Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Great Britain, Italy, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Norway, Portugal, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, West Germany and Yugoslavia.

Ray Wilson

For those who haven't eaten a press pass—don't. NBC News cameraman Ray Wilson ate his press pass while standing in a hot, steamy jungle in the Congo, and he strongly recommends more palatable fare.

But the act probably saved his life. Wilson and a group of other white newsmen were captured by a band of Katangese soldiers. They were carrying United Nations press passes, a possible death sentence for the unpredictable Katangese were extremely hostile to all UN sympathizers.

"It was a large thing, about this big," Wilson said, indicating about eight inches by four inches with his hands, "but it was fortunately printed on fine paper. I quietly wadded mine and put it into my mouth as we were being searched, and I managed to swallow it. It was quite an experience."

Wilson is 22 years old, a soft-spoken, blue-eyed Englishman who has been with NBC News a year and a half. He has been covering the Congo and most of Africa for four years and has a wound to prove it—a small but not insignificant brown scar on his right shin. He had been filming a jeep filled with Katangese soldiers when UN troops opened fire. When the firing ceased, he found six bullet holes in this jeep, only one of which resulted in a wound.

"I was going to send my trousers in with my expense account sheet," Wilson said, smiling, "so the company would know I was in the thick of things."

He has been in the thick of things so often during the past few years, he has become an expert on riots. "You develop a sixth sense about riots after a while," he said. "You kind of know when the bricks are coming without having to look."

He was born, reared and educated in Birmingham, England. In 1965, at 16, he joined the Birmingham Post as a cameraman. After three years, he worked brief-

Hollywood on TV

HOLLYWOOD (NEA) — What Hollywood needs, says Lee Marvin, is a return to old-fashioned ta-ra-ra-boom-de-ay! — and no one can deny he's the fastest draw with a zip-it-up gun since Humphrey Bogart. He has popped off about everything from some of the "insipid" plots television gave him as Lieutenant Ballinger on "M Squad" to what he thinks of certain actors and actresses, to Hollywood's lack of interest in merchandising movies once they are complete. He arrived in Hollywood in 1961 when television started to drain all the colorful life out of the old town, and he laments: "I'm sorry I missed all the madness and the fun." But he can't be accused of not trying to keep them from taking in the sidewalks at 9 p.m. He's a fellow who wants to keep the home fireworks burning. Other Saturday night, he hosted a party for the touring Old Vic company and it was a swinger. It started at midnight and it was mad," he tells it. "I finally collapsed and went to bed at 9:39 a.m. But the last of the guests didn't leave until 2:30 Sunday afternoon. There was none of the old, 'And what do you think about Frailty, thy name is woman?' Everybody lived it up, and I bet some of those Englishmen still have hang-overs." The television treadmill — on which Lee does most of his work — keeps people so busy they don't have time to be themselves. It hasn't cramped the style of Lee Marvin, ex-Marine night raider, who is a character and admits it. It's surprising, in a way, because he's one of the best actors in the business today. An "actor's actor," they call him, but he's better than that. Audiences don't usually dig actor's actors, but they dig Marvin, who says acting gives him an "exhilarating feeling." He was in a series of movies before television pinned a star on him, but the biggest movie impact of his career just came as the year's meanest heavy in "The Man Who Shot Liberty Valance." What John Ford saw in his performance — a rugged, prematurely grey man, big enough to stand up to John Wayne — just won him another role with Ford and Wayne. The two of them will be toe-to-toe again this summer in a James Michener south sea story. "I haven't read the script yet," grins Marvin, "but it's a comedy about a couple of fellows who fight it out once a year." About Ford, his new idol, he's as outspoken as on any subject you'd like to discuss. "He gives you 15 ways to play a scene," Lee tells it, "and if you go his way he's happy. But his directions are so light they are earthshaking. Like telling me one day: "This is the first time I've filmed a stage coach holdup, so you're going to have to help me." Subjects come and go because Lee Marvin likes to ramble. But, his key lines you don't ever forget. Like why certain stars demand such high salaries: "They are expensive," snaps Marvin, "because they fall so often." About men in space he says: "Maybe the Pilgrims will go to the moon instead of Massachusetts this time," about criticism, "Everybody is a greater second guesser than a first guesser." He will even give you a comment when you wonder if Richard Burton will marry Liz Taylor. "Why?" asks the obstreperous Lee Marvin. Hugh O'Brien stars as a young business executive who passes as a dedicated career man, but who in reality gambles and drinks away his company's money, in "Up Jumped the Devil" on the "Dick Powell Show" Tuesday, July 24 (NBC-TV 9-10 p.m. EDT.
