Mrs. Edward J. Pekar, 44 Highview Rd., South Windsor, perks up her summer menu by including Yam-Flourpate Bake to complement cold meats and salads. She usually serves it with baked ham, and often makes it for cold weather buffets and parties.

Yam-Flourpate Bake

4 1/2 to 5 cups mashed cooked or canned yam potatoes
1 1/2 cups sauce (1 cup) pine-apple tidbits
4 cup buttered margarine or butter
1 teaspoon salt
26 small marshmallows
4 cups cheese or nut meat halves

Combine yam potatoes, pine-apple with yam, butter and salt. Place half the mixture in buttered one and one-half quart casserole. Top with the marshmallows. Add remaining yam, pine-apple mixture. Arrange pecan halves in center. Bake in moderate oven (350 degrees) for 30 minutes or until heated through. Top with remaining marshmallows. Bake ten minutes longer or until marshmallows are lightly browned. This recipe serves eight.

NEW YORK (AP)—The everyday drills of life and death were going on as usual at St. Mary's Hospital in Brooklyn, N.Y., when the fire broke out.

Everybody knew what to do, and they did it with cool heads. The hospital's fire safety chief, Charles Botwick, in explaining yesterday's successful evacuation of some 200 patients, says that the hospital's 300 employees got out unscathed.

The evacuation was as simple as a night's sleep.





Mahoney Hits GOP Actions On Swim Pool

Democratic Director Francis Mahoney has accused the Republican majority of showing a "lack of interest" in the renovation problems of Globe Hollow.

The majority initiated a \$20,000 appropriation July 16 to line the entire pool with well cement and bubble to aerate the water, and regrade a nearby slope which had been sliding into the pool.

"In the winter I suggested they fix Globe Hollow," he said. "They talked in terms of \$100,000. We were the winner. Of the 1961-62 fiscal year budget from \$85,000 to \$70,000 to \$60,000, they cut \$15,000. They could have found another \$5,000 that budgeted for being Globe Hollow a few weeks before the election."

Apparently the matter plan of renovation of the bath-house, F. Shea Jr. did not include the renovation of the pool until now, Mahoney said.

"This board hasn't done anything on its own," he said.


