As You Like It

There's a good musical at the University of Connecticut this week. It's "The Fantasticks." It has three actors in the leading roles who have performed their parts either in New York or Boston. It has a fine supporting cast, the result of a summer of work by a good troupe. And it has some smooth music.

The story is about a boy and girl who fall in love, thinking that their fathers object. The father has schemed to have the children fall in love and pretends to oppose it by building a wall between their properties so the lovers would have difficulty getting together.

Removal of the wall removes the excitement, the lovers discover, and the boy goes off to find excitement.

Richard Curry plays El Gallo, a character of opera by a good troupe. He is a good actor, his physical appearance and bearing, his stage presence and vitality are perfect for the part. His voice, while it did not match the crispness of his acting, was easy to listen to.

Alice Cannon as the girl is pretty, vivacious and a good actress. She tends to overact just a little, but maybe she can't help it, losing herself too much in the part.

She should decide now whether she wants to concentrate on music or opera. She is a good singer, her voice is not flexible enough to proceed to the other, but in her case it seems Paul Giovanni as the boy is a good actor, good.

Henry Sutton as the girl's father and Daniel Walker as the boy's father are delightful. Douglas Fisher as a doddering Shakespeare is hilarious, and so is his addicid Bill Strete as a miser.

Stephen Harrison gives competent support as the mute prop man. There were some interesting blocking effects directed by Charles H. Hines, which were smoothly enough executed that they did not distract the eye. Frank W. Murray, who plays the boy's father, did the set, and Stanley Barzilai, who plays the girl's father, suggested a muted lighting effect, including a muted lighting effect, a piece of painted or stained paper.
