Tool Firm Bares Plan for Buckland Plant

The Morland Tool Co. of Rockville, a producer of parts for a variety of government projects, will move into a Manchester plant within the next eight months.

The building will be erected on Toland Tpk., directly across from the ARA Tool and Die Co. The Town Development Commission and the Chamber of Commerce approved the relocation of the Morland Co. at a luncheon this noon.

The tool firm presently employs between 30 and 40 people, and will increase their payroll to 50 as soon as they move to their new location. With normal growth, the employment should reach 85 within a year, management estimated.

Core Manufacturing, a Morland subsidiary, may also move to Manchester within the next 18 months, increasing employment to over 85.

Town officials expressed their satisfaction at the relocation of the Morland Co. Harlan Taylor, chairman of the development commission, said at this afternoon's luncheon, "We are very pleased with the decision of Morland Tool to locate here in town, and hope they will grow along with Manchester."

Present at the affair were Morland officials Thomas DiMarco, John Lapins and Douglas Andrew, Chamber of Commerce President Fred Nasiff and Vice President John Deme. Mayor Harold A. Turkington, Planning Commission Chairman Martin Alford, Donald Anderson of ARA Tool and Die Co. and others.

Town Well Stated Morland officials decided upon relocation in Manchester after contacting with Mayor Harold A. Turkington. "We had heard rumors about high taxes in Manchester," said DiMarco, "so we checked with ARA to find out what the situation really was. We have been looking for a new location for some time, and the fact that Manchester is ideally suited for our company."

It may be enlarged up to five times its original size. A majority of their work is on contract or subcontract basis, and about 95 per cent is for government projects. Locomotive, Cannon, Pratt and Whitney, and Electric Boat in Groton are frequent customers.

DiMarco expressed his appreciation for the help Manchester officials had offered. "We want to thank the Chamber of Commerce and the town for the cooperation and the welcome that they have given us. We are sincerely pleased to become a part of Manchester."

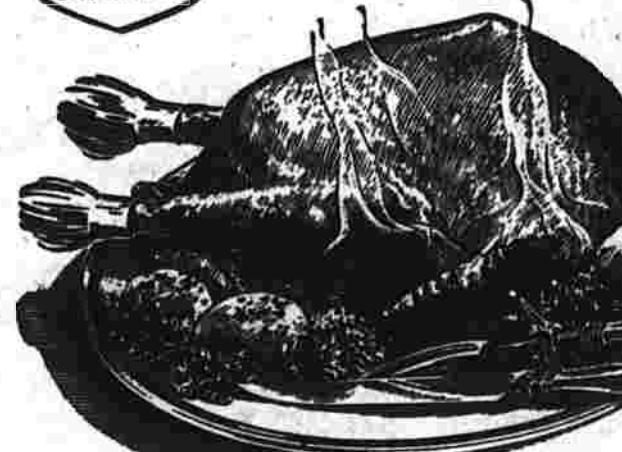

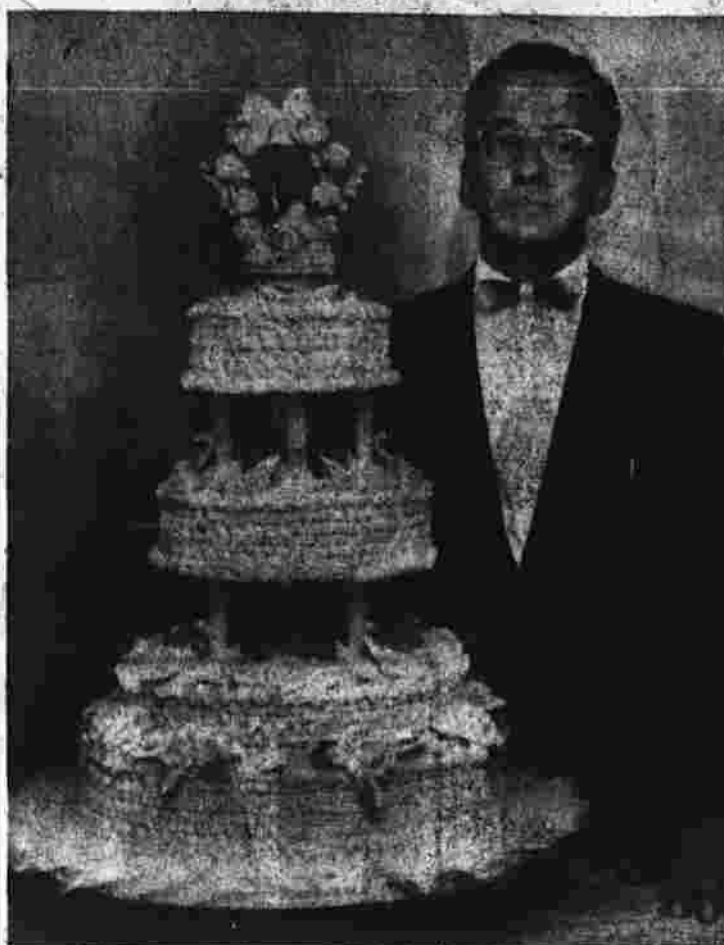

Wedding Cake
 8 packages seedless raisins
 5 tablespoons baking soda
 3 1/2 quarts boiling water or cherry juice and water combined
 2 1/2 pounds citron (diced)
 5 cups drained marshmallows
 1/2 cup cherries
 2 1/2 cups all purpose flour
 1 level cup vegetable shortening
 7 1/2 pounds sugar
 1 1/2 cups (unbeaten) eggs
 7 1/2 cups walnut meats (chopped)
 4 tablespoons vanilla
 4 teaspoons salt

Put dates and cut with raisins, with citron and halved cherries. Sprinkle soda over mixture and pour boiling water or water and cherry juice over all. Let mixture cool. Cream shortening and sugar in separate bowl. Add eggs, nut meats and vanilla and beat until thick mixture and mix well. Stir in flour and salt that has been sifted twice. Bake at 225 to 250 degrees until toothpick or cake tester can be drawn out. Line pan with waxed paper and remove as soon as possible after taking cake from oven.

The wedding cake weighed about 30 pounds and was used by a friend. Pan and oven big enough to hold cake layers had to be borrowed from friends.

Two bread mixer containers were used to mix the ingredients which were divided equally in each. The baking time varied due to the difference in the tiers.

Frosting

Beat until frosting spreads easily. Libby has been making fruit cake 21 years from a recipe that he developed himself. It makes it in smaller quantities for holidays and special occasions.

Enforceable Pact Needed Kennedy Forecasts 10 N-Nations by '70

 Asked how an agreement signed only by the current nuclear powers would deter other countries from developing nuclear weapons, Kennedy said: "It is our hope that the signing... will arrest the spread and not make it essential." He added: "but it is only a hope."

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Kennedy says there is no evidence of Russian troops in Cuba and any invasion by U.S. forces would be a mistake.

The President emphasized, however, that the United States would support under the Monroe Doctrine any takeover of a country in this hemisphere by an outside power.

More questions were asked about Cuba at the President's news conference Wednesday than on any other topic. Two developments apparently stimulated the news conference.

One was the recent arrival in Havana of an unusual number of Communist bloc ships carrying cargo, some of it unloaded secretly, and an estimated 3,000 to 5,000 Communist technicians. The other was the shelling of a Havana hotel last Friday night from two small boats manned by Cuban students in exile.

The President was unamused when some reporters laughed at his statement "I am not for invading Cuba at this time." He hastened to add that no secondary meaning should be given his remark and that he would consider an invasion a mistake.

An unsuccessful U.S. backed invasion of Cuba by exiles was attempted in April 1961 and 1,100 prisoners are still in Cuban prisons.

Kennedy held to the viewpoint expressed last week, that the United States has no evidence Soviet troops have landed. However, he said it is quite probable some military technicians from Communist bloc countries are in Cuba.

As for the shipment of Red supplies and technicians, the President indicated they were motivated by a failure of Communist economic policies in Cuba and a desire of other Communist nations to arrive at a complete disaster there.

Emphasis On Health

 A drug to combat colds, a question about high protein diets, and a study of mental stress and tooth decay figure in the medical news.

An anti-virus drug, nicknamed ARCB, often can prevent and suppress respiratory infections of the common cold type, a Swedish physician reports.

In tests in an industrial plant, ARCB was credited with reducing absenteeism from colds by 50 per cent, when workers took the drug at the first sign of symptoms. In another experiment when it was taken as a preventive, the incidence of colds was reduced by 30 to 40 per cent, says Dr. John Haglund of Koppar, Sweden.

Earlier studies had found the Swedish-developed drug effective in protecting against influenza, he says.

A High Protein Diet
 A medical research team takes issue with the idea that a high protein diet allows the body to store up reserves of protein, useful later on if disease strikes or you have to go hungry. Such diets are being recommended for that reason.

There is no scientific evidence, from rat experiments, that the body can bank protein, reports Dr. L. Emmett Holt Jr., and Elias Halko Jr., and Charles H. Kalk, A.B., New York and Baltimore. The person recovering from illness often develops protein. Short-term studies have not uncovered any harmful effects from eating more protein than the minimum actually needed, but that doesn't rule out the possibility there could be long-term effects, they say.

Worry and Teeth
 Mental stress can erode someone's teeth more than you suspect, it is reported by a dentist. Dr. Philip R. N. Sutton of Melbourne, checked records of hundreds of people and found that an outbreak of tooth decay frequently followed times of great mental worry or stress. But he says the findings thus far are only suggestive, not conclusive.

Adenauer Told Macmillan for United Europe

LONDON (AP)—Prime Minister Harold Macmillan revealed today previous assurances of Chancellor Konrad Adenauer of Britain's wholehearted interest in working for European political unity after West German leader had expressed some doubts.

Macmillan ordered publication of part of a private letter he wrote Adenauer last month. Adenauer, in a television interview Tuesday night, had expressed reservations about British participation in a West European political union.

Publication of Macmillan's private letter, described here as unprecedented, underlined a growing closeness between the two statesmen on the issue of Britain's future role in the continent.

French President Charles de Gaulle also has been seen privately cool to British entry in the Common Market, although both he and Adenauer have checked publicly they want Britain in.

Adenauer said in the television interview that as a German and a European he greeted Britain's eventual membership in the economic union of West Germany, France, Italy, Belgium, Luxembourg and the Netherlands with sympathy. But he mentioned that it had never been discussed that Macmillan should also be a member of the European political union.

Adenauer said Macmillan told the British House of Commons July 17 "British membership in the Common Market is a political union of Europe as well as a letter he wrote me four days later."

Macmillan said quite the contrary—obviously because his ministers were of a different opinion.

Adenauer apparently had second thoughts about accusing Macmillan of inconsistency. The interview was filmed in advance, and the director of the West German station which broadcast it said the Bonn government requested him to delete that portion of the film. He said he refused but left it out of the text of the interview or distributed to the press.

Macmillan's letter said the British government had been working with sympathetic interest the efforts of the six Common Market nations to move toward greater political union.

He assured the letter continued, "that once the Brussels negotiations on Britain's bid to join the Common Market are successfully concluded, we shall wish to join wholeheartedly in this task."

The British Foreign Office said there was no conflict between what Macmillan wrote Adenauer and what he told the House of Commons in the House. Macmillan said that he always has been clear that membership in the Common Market involved political implications, but that Britain would have to judge, step by step, how far to go.

Macmillan has pushed Britain's bid to enter the Common Market despite sharp opposition at home and throughout the British Commonwealth. The Brussels negotiations were adjourned last month until after the end of the week developed on British efforts to get assurances for markets for Commonwealth agricultural products.

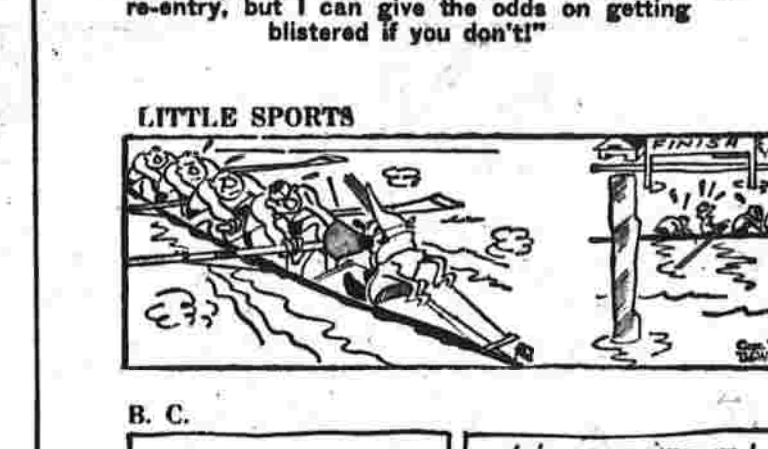

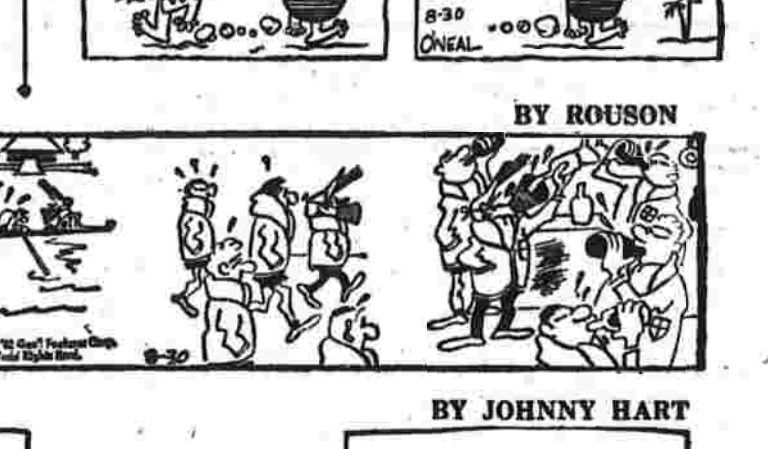
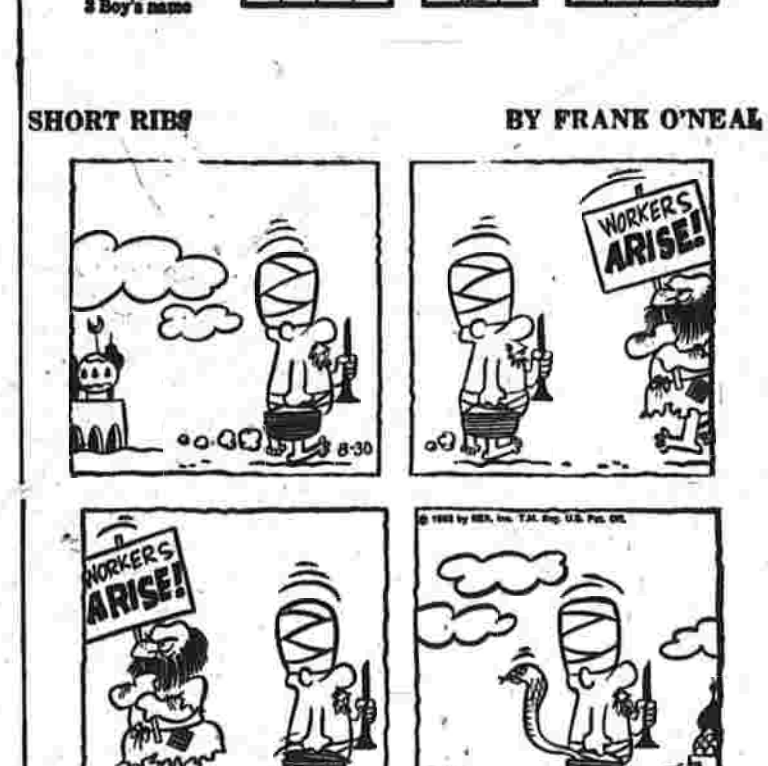
