 Apparently by almost mutual impulse, the various candidates of the 1962 state campaign took the opening of the month of August as a good time for them to begin their direct approach to the good people of Connecticut. Needs Only To Be Formalized
 We can imagine the mixture of scorn and horror certain to greet the suggestion made at the St. Louis meeting of the American Psychological Association for the use of television as a substitute for the psychoanalytic couch. But we would say that there is little reason for scorn, and for that matter, no particular reason for horror either. The television medium has certain built-in advantages. And we are not certain it would not prove to have a certain humanness and gentleness of approach impossible for a mere unaided human being, no matter how many degrees he had hanging over his office couch. Television would be able to get right to its remedial work, not needing to spend any great preliminary time gaining the confidence and trust of its patient. People will easily believe and trust what they see on their silver screen. There are people who know better who still insist on believing in the authenticity of wrestling matches, and who have even less trouble committing themselves to the supposed realities of other well-staged television entertainments. In fact, one might say that the entire history and approach of television to date has been toward the moment when it would become a medium which would be presenting planned mental therapy, instead of merely haphazard mental therapy, to all its viewers, absent patients.

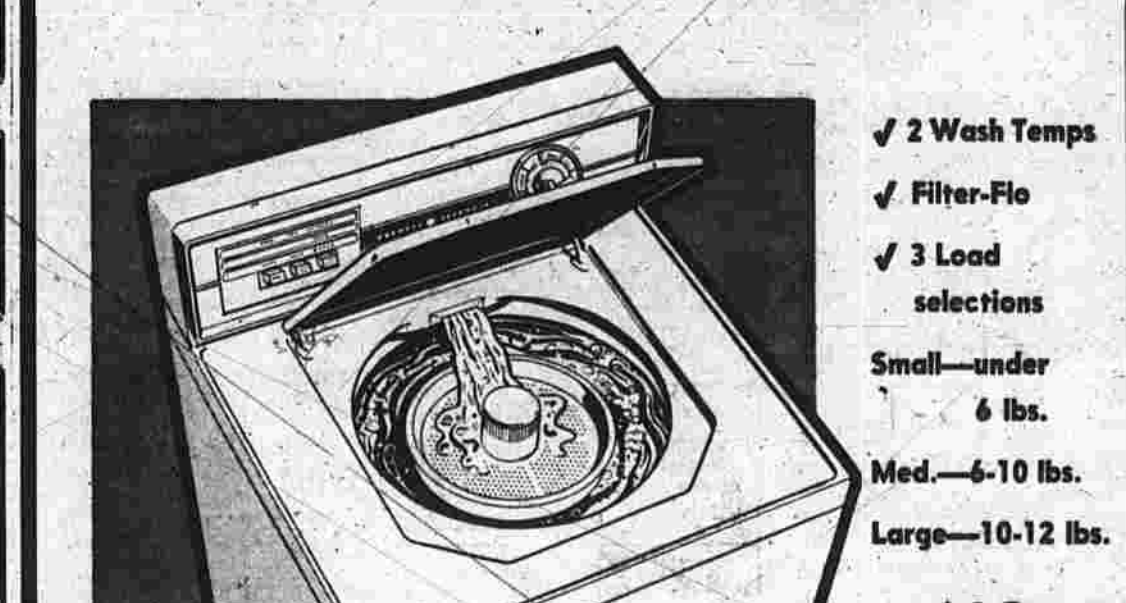

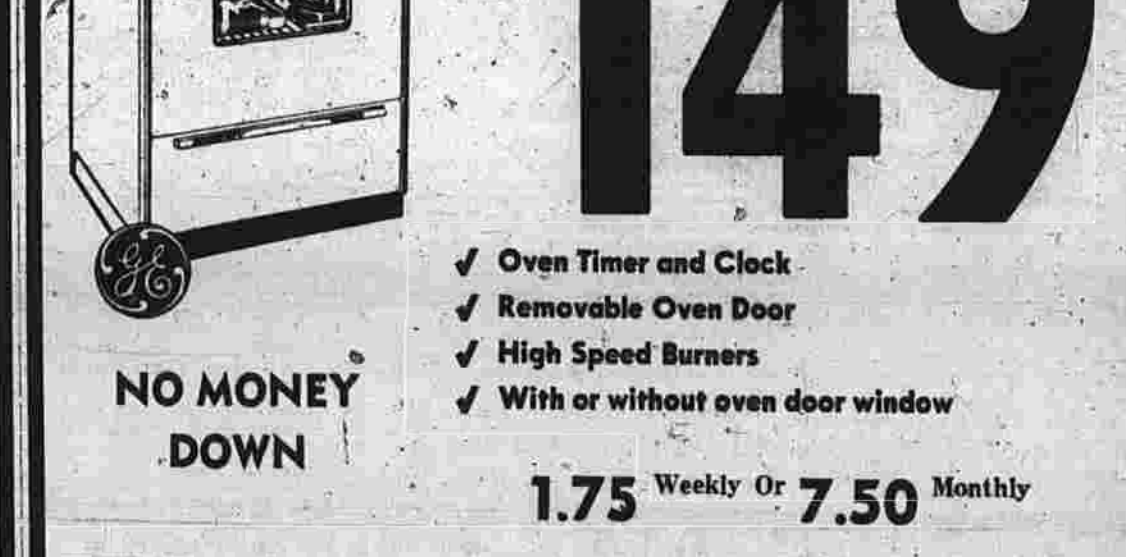
