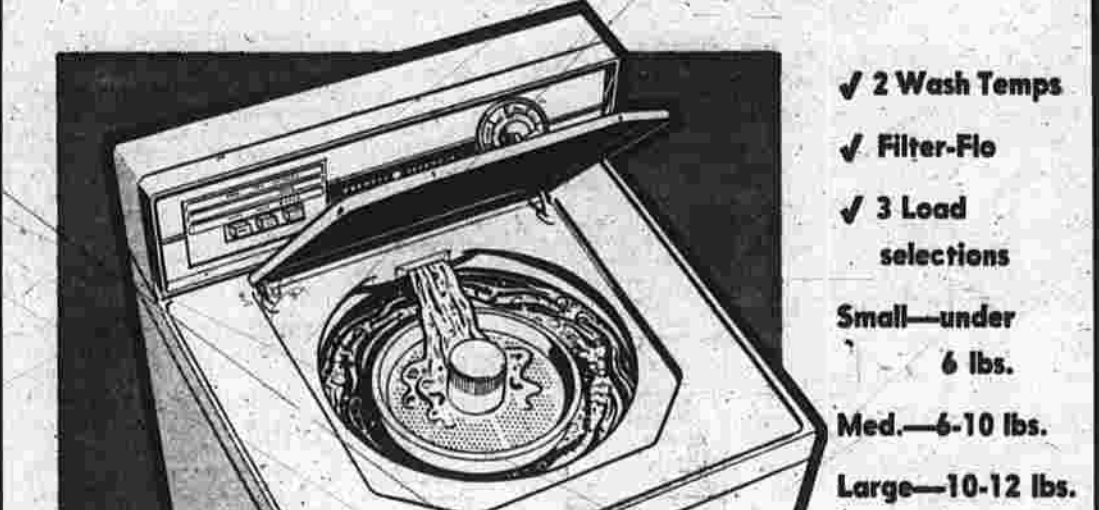

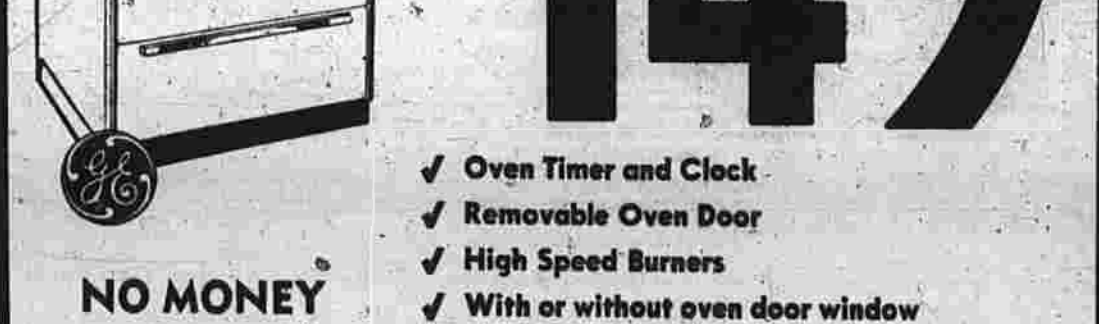

Bella Facing Strife In Regular Army

By ANDREW BOROWICZ ALGIERS (AP)—Deputy Premier Ahmed Ben Bella and his political bureau faced the threat of harassment from a new quarter today—the militant commander of the new national 45,000-man regular army.

After a five-day, well-publicized civil war, rebellious guerrillas in control of Algiers and central Algeria recognized the authority of the political bureau as Algeria's temporary government Thursday.

Ben Bella in turn put a brake on the regular army, which had already come under the colonel's command.

The least, acerbic Boumediene was accused by Premier Ben Bella of plotting to set up a military dictatorship.

Johnson Sees Advances from Pope's Council

By JAMES M. LONG VATICAN CITY (AP)—U.S. Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson called on Pope John XXIII today and afterward predicted great economic and social advances will result from the forthcoming Roman Catholic world council.

Johnson, on the final day of his 15-day goodwill tour around the Mediterranean spent 45 minutes alone with the 80-year-old ruler of the Roman Catholic Church.

Then the vice president's wife, Lady Bird, joined in an unusually long, intimate conversation that lasted about eight minutes.

Only 20 minutes had been set aside on Johnson's program for the audience of 100,000 people and the Pope enjoyed their meeting.

Johnson said later, "I was stimulated by the spiritual leadership I have seen here. I was struck by the warmth of the people and the sincerity of the Pope."

U of C Asks 31% Hike In Budget

HARTFORD (AP)—The University of Connecticut, figuring on more students, more faculty and more expenses, today filed spending requests calling for a 31 per cent hike in its general fund budget.

The hefty budget document asks the legislature for \$20.4 million for the coming biennium beginning next July 1. That is \$7.1 million more than the big institutions' spending over the present two-year period.

Construction funds for the new medical-dental school to be built in Farmington are not included. This money request will likely come in a few months when details are available.

The general fund budget, supported by taxes, is only part of the University's spending chart. There is an additional \$25 million for services financed by federal and private grants, other gifts and income from dormitory rents, dining halls and other non-educational facilities.

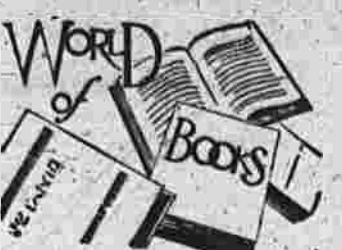

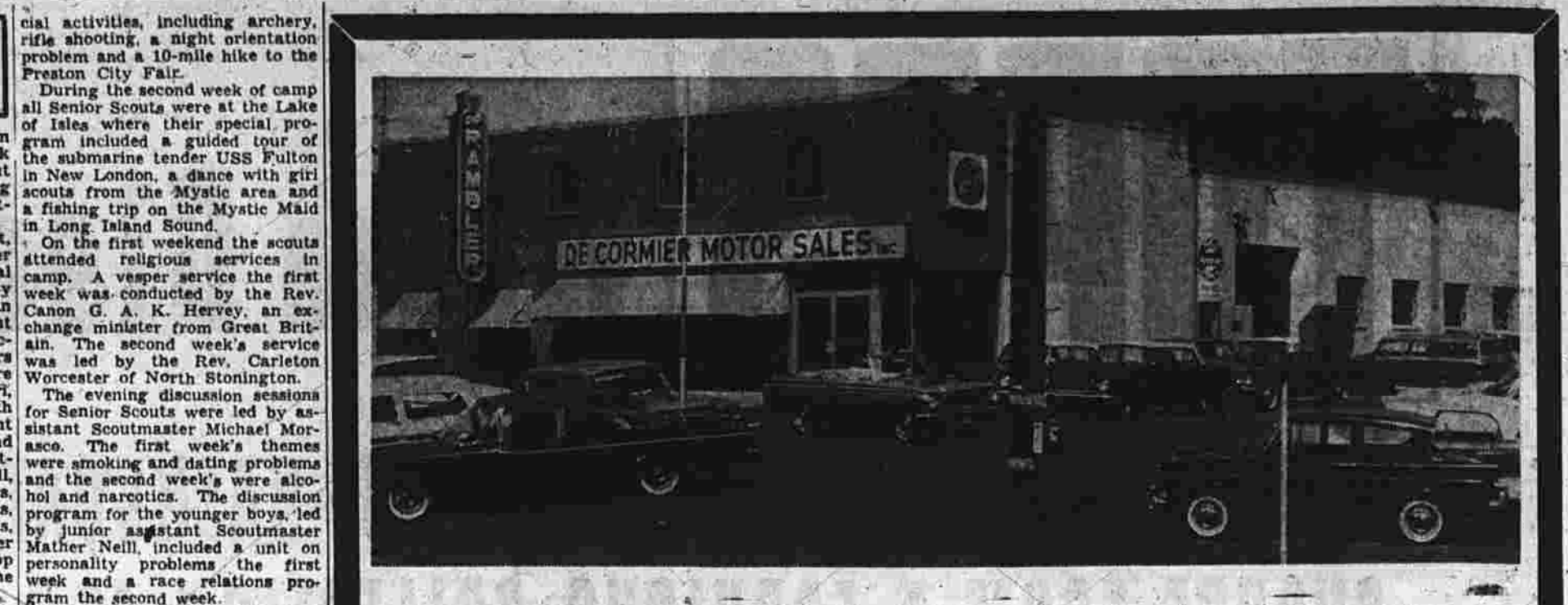

Barry Says Off-Year Vote Needless Cost

Off-year elections would cost taxpayers an "unnecessary" \$20,000 to \$30,000 every two years, says Atty. David M. Barry, Democratic candidate for the board of directors. 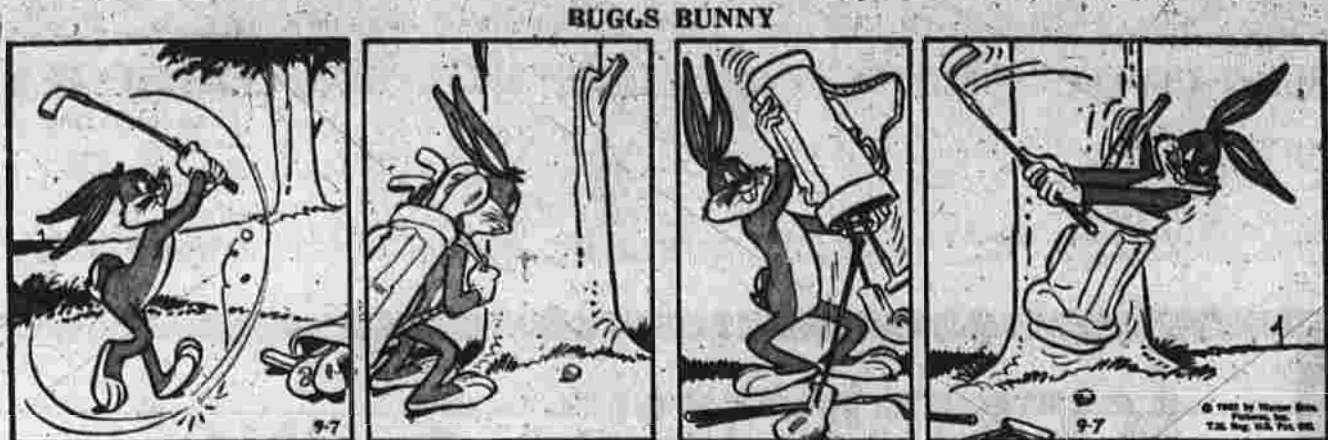

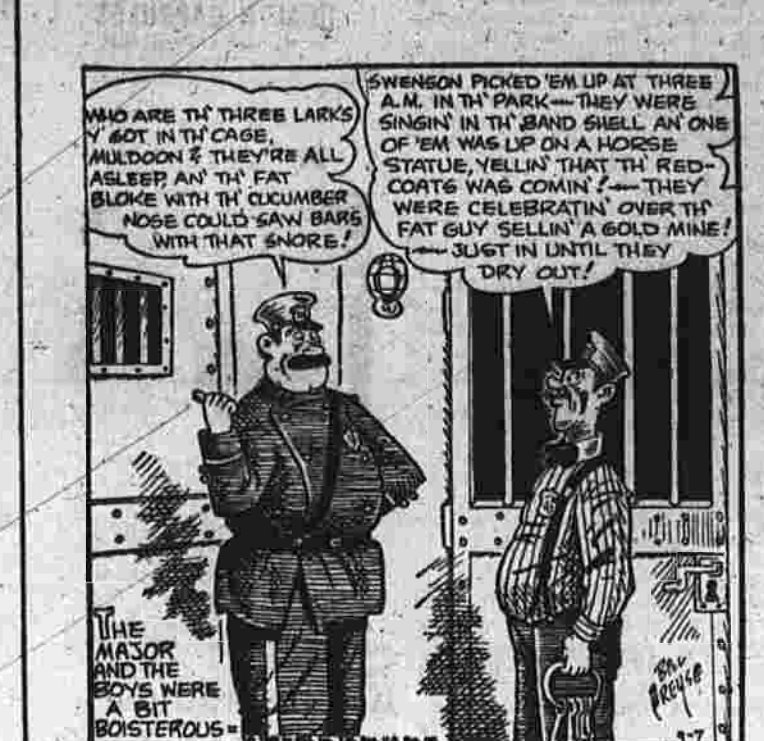

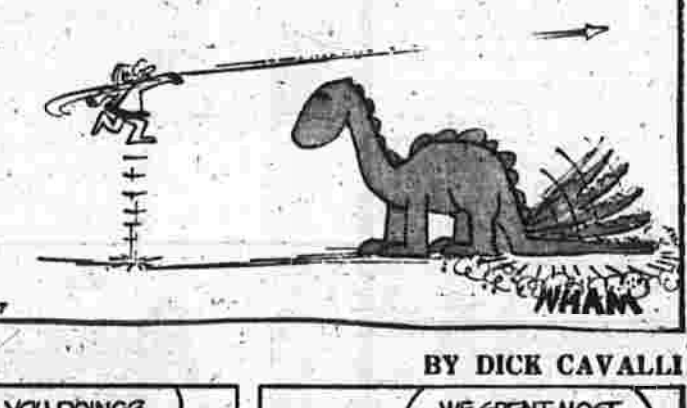
