Appraisal by Democrats Congress Record Dull Except for Trade Bill

Democratic leaders also have had to virtually write off two into law — manpower retraining, expansion of the Peace Corps, and \$600-million public works bill, and the legislation aimed at rehabilitation of persons on the public assistance rolls.

The leaders say several other important bills will be sent to Kennedy before adjournment.

Besides the trade and tax bills, they predict there will include drug regulation, a form insurance even though it is in a watered-down form and a mass immunization bill.

Administration and anti-Communist bills were dampened even though they were introduced Thursday with a House vote to send back to conference the \$2.35 billion federal aid for colleges bill.

Most supporters figure the bill now is dead, although some attempt may be made to hold another conference.

\$88,098 Paid Out To August Idle

The number of weeks of work lost to unemployment in the Manchester area during the month of August was less than half the number lost during August, 1961, according to State Labor Department figures.

At the same time the average weekly check paid to the unemployed was higher than for the comparable period last year.

Last month there were 2,574 weeks of unemployment claimed by residents of the four communities — Vernon, Rockville, Bolton and Manchester — served by the Manchester office of the labor department.

Claimants were paid a total of \$88,098 for an average payment of \$34.23 per week.

During August, 1961, there were 6,076 weeks of unemployment, amounting to a total of \$196,123. So far this year, \$1,008,948 in benefits have been issued in Manchester, compared with \$1,723,317 for the first two-thirds of last year.

funds axed from the measure by the House Appropriations Committee.

The bill was passed to the Senate on a roll call vote of 248-144. The measure drew the support of 174 Democrats and 75 Republicans.

Development loan funds took the worst beating. While the President requested \$1.25 billion, the House approved \$775 million. Thick slices were lopped off the requests for development grants, military assistance, the alliance for progress and the President's contingency fund.

The administration counterattacks begins today when Secretary of State Dean Rusk asks the Senate to approve the bill. House leaders steered clear while the three Cuban amendments were rammed through Thursday night. They evidently hope the Senate will strike them or at least tone them down.

The most restrictive amendment was offered by Rep. Walter Rogers, D-Tex. It would limit foreign aid to any country whose ships carry goods of any kind to Cuba.

Several members expressed concern at Rogers' amendment. Rep. John J. Rooney, D-N.Y., tried in vain to have the bill reconsidered. "It might cause World War III," Rooney said.

No dissent greeted the amendments by Reps. Thomas M. Pelly, R-Wash., and Herbert C. Barry, D-N.C. The first was aimed at nations whose vessels transport Cuban goods. The second would prohibit any ship that carries war material or other "economic goods" to Cuba from entering a U.S. port to pick up foreign aid shipments.

The cost of welfare payments in August was less than half the month, the department authorized expenditure of \$2,365,944, which is a year before \$4,365,350 was spent.

The largest decrease was in the family relief allocation, which was \$2,888,944 last month and \$3,818,244 this month.

The number of cases qualifying for family relief assistance was last month and a year ago.

There were no expenditures for hospital care or convalescent home care last month, while a year ago these two items were \$861 and \$830.

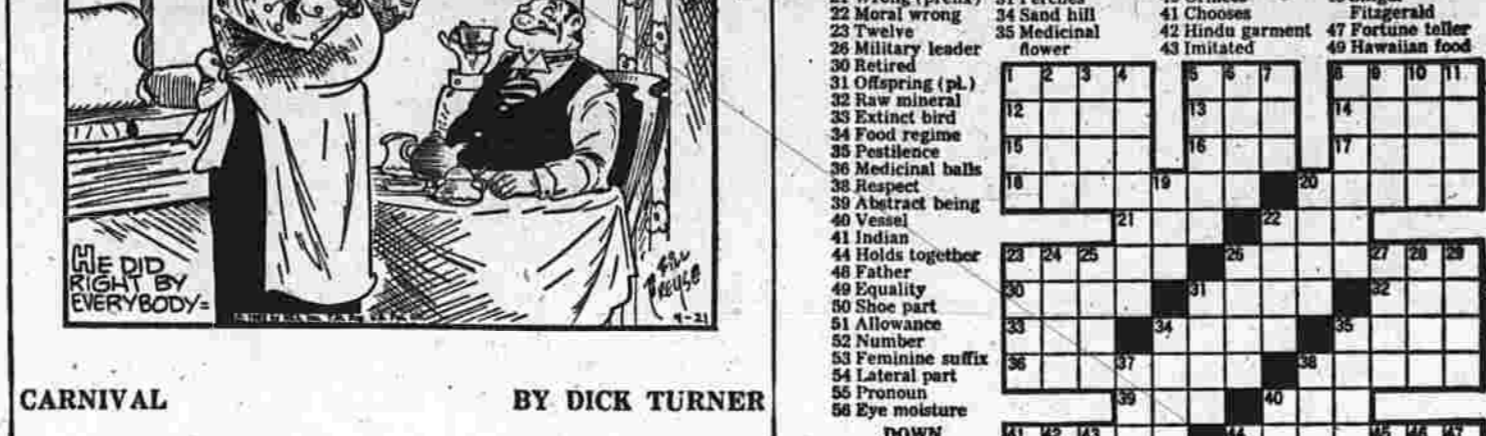

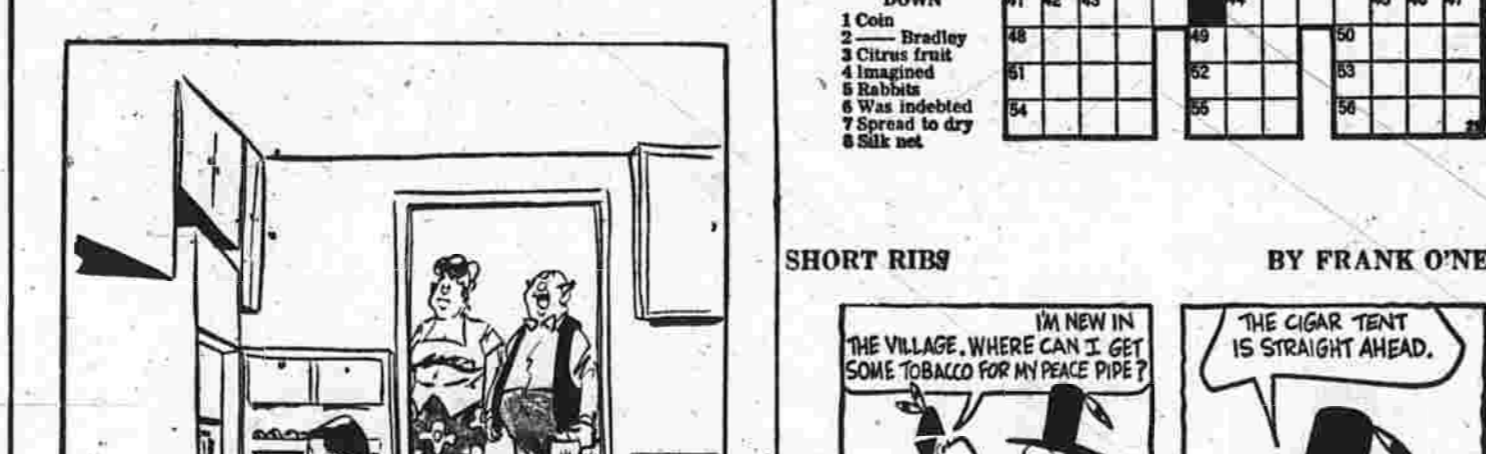

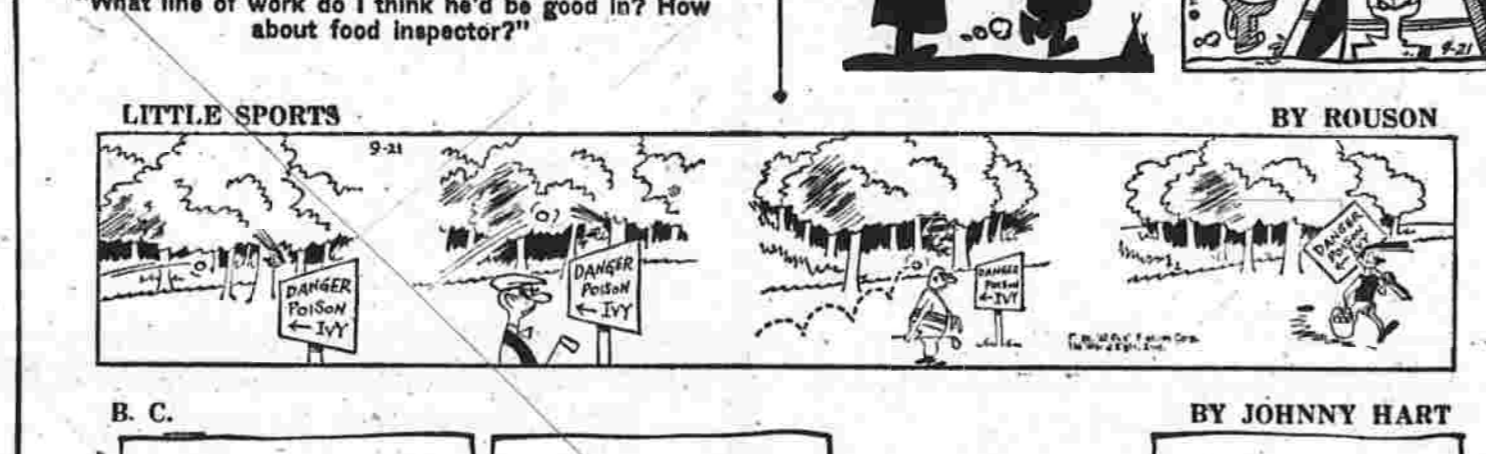
