**Chesse and Tomato Spread**  
1/2 pound cheddar cheese, finely grated (2 cups lightly packed)  
1/2 cup (3 ounces) drained-stuffed green olives (pitted and finely chopped)  
1/2 cup broken walnuts (finely chopped)  
1/4 cup mayonnaise  
1 teaspoon sugar  
Mix bread and tomatoes together; the cheese, olives, walnuts, mayonnaise and sugar. Spread 1 tablespoon of the mixture on a toasted bread slice, covering edges; top with tomato slice, spread tomato with 1 tablespoon of mixture. Broil until tomato is hot through. Cover and refrigerate any leftover spread.

**Grilled Chili-Cheese Sandwich**  
1 tablespoon butter or margarine  
1 slice enriched bread  
1 (1 ounce) slice process American cheese  
1 cup chili con carne  
Butter bread. Spread 3 tablespoons chili on underside of slice of bread; top with cheese slice. Cover cheese with another bread slice, buttered side up. Grill until golden brown on both sides. Serve hot.

How the Heat-Sensitive Present Itchy Skin

A Texas dermatologist now informs us that "winter itch" (pruritus or dermatitis hibernica) now comes in the summer.

What's more, he proves it rather conclusively. There is how this revolutionary change has come about.

The typical patient spends the major part of hot, humid days of heat in a refrigerated air-conditioned house, office, plant, theater or automobile.

Running from one air-conditioned place to another, the heat-sensitive person avoids outdoor sports or other activities that involve exposure to heat and humidity.

When the skin surfaces of these heat-sensitive persons begin to itch and chap and then develop redness, eczema, and scratch marks (excoriations), and heaped up scales (plaques), relief is sought in frequent hot baths or showers that cause further drying and scaling of the skin.

These skin changes may also be made worse as a result of application of a damp towel or medicated dressing, or of soaping or exposure to a rapidly moving air current.

And the condition becomes more complicated and confusing when the damaged skin is invaded by bacterial contaminants with the production of secondary infection.

Since the increased comfort and beneficial effects of an air-conditioned environment, far outweigh any adverse effects, the following recommendations should be followed to prevent the few heat-sensitive persons from suffering summer attacks of winter itch:

Arrange to participate in some type of outdoor activity each day. Preferably in the cool of the early morning or after sundown.

Take tepid baths or showers. Use little or no soap. To lather or soapy areas, apply a simple medicated oil.

Avoid direct exposure to rapidly moving air currents. But at a distance from the air conditioner. Direct the force of an electric fan away from the place in which you are sitting, working or resting.

Do not attempt to cool the skin with wet applications, especially with alcoholic lotions that tend to evaporate rapidly thus causing increasing dryness at the site of application.

When you need just a few drops of flaying for cooking, use a medicine dropper kept for that purpose.

New England News Briefs

WASHINGTON (AP)—Senate and House conferees remained at loggerheads yesterday over whether to reduce or eliminate a six per cent differential allowed West Coast shippers in bidding to construct certain government-subsidized merchant vessels.

The Senate voted to eliminate the differential in an amendment to a House-passed bill extending the 55 per cent maximum subsidy allowed for construction of merchant ships in U.S. shipyards.

Sen. Clair Engle, D-Calif., chairman of the Senate conferees, told newsmen no further meeting of the group was set.

FAIRFIELD, Vt. (AP)—Six-year-old Robert Brannon Jr. was killed yesterday by a truck near his home on State Route 1.

Police said the child darted into the path of a dump truck from behind a tractor operated by his father.

ROME, Italy (AP)—A tentative agreement reached late yesterday, covering some 2,000 military employees in seven states, will be submitted for approval to more than 30 countries' union locals at meetings to be held Oct. 10 through 15.

The agreement, reached by the teamsters and milk plant negotiators, would replace the old contract which was to expire at midnight last night. It covers employees of milk-processing stations processing and manufacturing plants in the New York City Metropolitan area.

Among the seven states are Massachusetts and Connecticut.

COVENTRY, R. I. (AP)—A single engine private plane burned last night shortly after it landed at Coventry Air Park. No one was injured.

A jury convicted Golden of embezzling \$128,000 from the bank. Judge George C. Sweney set bail for \$25,000.

CAMBRIDGE, Mass. (AP)—A 56-year-old painter was on the danger list at Mt. Auburn Hospital yesterday where he was taken yesterday after he collapsed on a water tower in Watertown.

Doctors said Peter Riccio had suffered a stroke. He collapsed while working 25 feet above ground on the tower at B.F. Goodrich Rubber Co.
