Board Meets to Approve
Closed Session Decisions

An emergency meeting of the board of education has been called for tonight at 8:30 in the school library. Mrs. Claire Warfel, board representative said last night. Mrs. Warfel said the board plans to formally approve the cuts in costs of the proposed school which were made at an executive session Friday night.

At a meeting with the public building commission this week, Philip Liguori, school superintendent, said the board plans to eliminate several items from the specifications for the school, but that these pieces of equipment can be added later in the operating budget after the school is open.

At a public meeting Monday night, members of Bolton Congregational Church approved the proposed \$18,000 budget for 1963 but sent two items back to the executive board for reconsideration. It was recommended that the item for the pastor's car allowance and the budget for youth work be increased. Another meeting will be necessary to decide on those items which they have not reconsidered.

Will Kennedy Reply To Criticism by Ike?

(Continued from Page One)

Connecticut is thought to offer fertile soil for Kennedy's efforts. Democrats now hold four of the six House seats and hope they can pick up another.

Ribicoff, who quit Kennedy's cabinet to make this race, is matched against Rep. Horace Sessy-Brown Jr., while Gov. John M. Dempsey is defended by Sen. against Republican John Altop.

Kennedy's plans called for speeches in Bridgeport, Waterbury and New Haven.

He's due back in the White House tonight.

Thursday: an open date politically.

Then comes the roughest week yet, with a whirlwind trip to Cleveland; Springfield, Ill.; Chicago; Milwaukee; St. Louis; Albuquerque, N.M.; Las Vegas, Nev., and Seattle.

That adds up to seven states in three days—campaigning in the jet age with a vengeance.

NEW HAVEN (AP)—Connecticut Democrats put out the welcome mat today for President Kennedy, their hopes high that he would put fire in their campaign.

Kennedy's three-hour swing through the state today will include political speeches at Bridgeport Airport in Stratford and later in Waterbury and New Haven.

The President can expect hand-bling welcomes at each of his stops, all traditionally Democratic industrial areas.

The party leadership has taken pains to produce a huge and lively turnout for Kennedy. One object is to eclipse former President Dwight D. Eisenhower's appearance at a nighttime Republican rally in Hartford Monday.

It was Connecticut that gave Kennedy a plurality of 21,000 votes in the 1960 presidential election. And it was Connecticut that gave him some of his first supporters for the presidency.

Two of those original boosters, Abraham Ribicoff and Democratic State and National Chairman John M. Bailey, will be at Bridgeport Airport in Stratford for Kennedy's arrival (4:30 p.m. EDT).

In addition to Ribicoff, Kennedy's former welfare secretary and now the party's senatorial candidate, the welcoming group will include Gov. John N. Dempsey, the gubernatorial candidate, and the rest of the state ticket: Sen. Thomas J. Dodd, D-Conn.; National Committeeman John M. Golden of New Haven; National Committeewoman Beatrice Rosen of Waterford and other Democratic luminaries.

After a speech at the airport, the Kennedy motorcade will drive up the Naugatuck Valley through Shelton, Derby, Ansonia and Naugatuck, winding up on the Central Green in Waterbury for another address (6 p.m.).

Turning south the presidential party will head for New Haven by Route 69 for Kennedy's final speech on the New Haven Green (7 p.m.).

He will depart by plane from New Haven airport.

The New England Committee for Nonviolent Action, a pacifist group, says it will try to picket Kennedy's appearance on the New Haven Green to protest this country's resumption of nuclear testing.

Blind Man's Plea BRIDGEPORT (AP)—Mayor Tedesco today "guaranteed" a Bridgeport blind man "one moment with President Kennedy" to make an effort to "end discrimination against the handicapped by U.S. Civil Service," when the president makes a campaign visit to Bridgeport Airport at 4:30 p.m.

Mayor Tedesco said that he would personally escort Edward L. Lemoin, 38, of 1851 Central, a dark room technician in Bridgeport Hospital, to the President so that he can give the chief executive a letter explaining his problem.

Lemoin, blind since an accident when he was seven, charges that he has taken four Civil Service examinations... never achieving less than an 81 grade... but has never been awarded a job. Lemoin holds a BS degree from the University of Connecticut in business administration.

He and his "seeing eye" dog "Cien" will be driven to the airport in a police vehicle by arrangement with Mayor Tedesco.

'Ribicoff Day' NEW BRITAIN (AP)—The group of New Britain delegates to the Democratic convention who supported Congressman Frank Kowalski for the U.S. Senate nomination will invite Abraham Ribicoff to a breakfast Oct. 25.

Ribicoff defeated Kowalski for the nomination and is now opposing Republican Horace Sessy-Brown Jr. for the seat.

Philip Cannova, chairman of the New Britain delegation, said most of the 22-member delegation attended a meeting last night and voted to send Ribicoff the invitation.

Cannova said the invitation was being made "because we are good Democrats." He said the visit would be designated "Ribicoff Day" if the candidate accepts.

Kowalski forces fought a primary to win all 22 delegates to the convention after the town organization endorsed 11 delegates for Kowalski and 11 for Ribicoff.

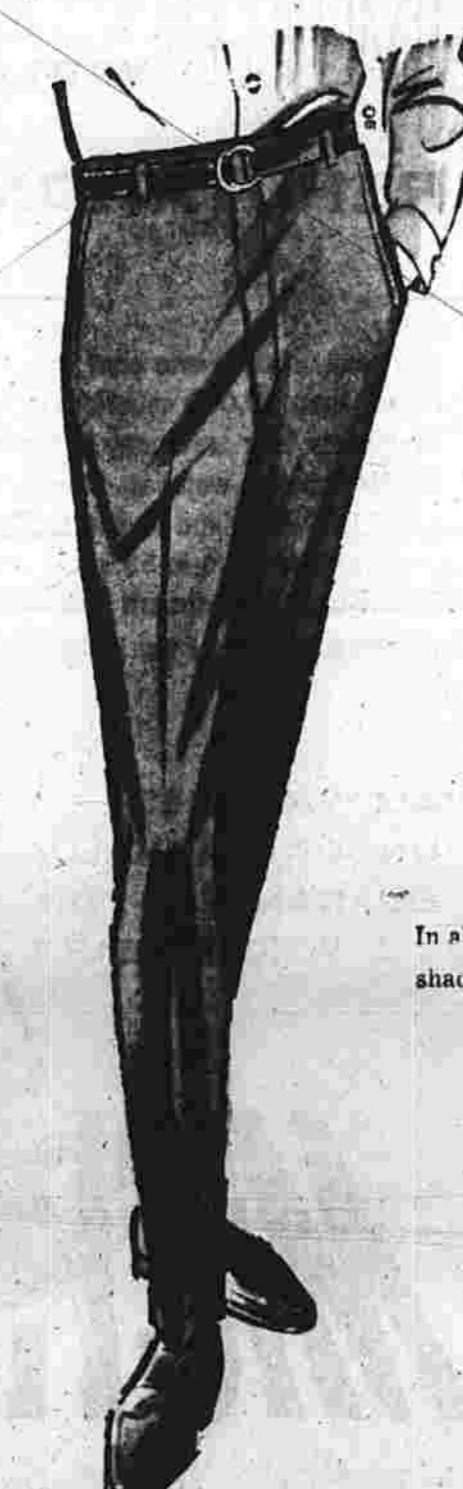

 President Romeo Betancourt of Venezuela, the fellow who despite some original tendencies which seemed pretty much to the left, has developed into one of the most tenacious practitioners of democracy in this hemisphere. He is currently peched on a dilemma which, the matter what the dictionary says, can only be described as having at least three prongs.
 His tenacity in holding to the principles of democracy has produced for him the apparently undeviating enmity of that same Fidel Castro, who after the manner of his revolution in Cuba, couldn't wait to go down and tender his homage to President Betancourt. Now Castro, himself far from his own original revolution, is busy trying to wish and plot Betancourt out of office. And there have been three plots against Betancourt in the past year, with Castro being given, perhaps somewhat too generously credit for all three.
 Faced with the prospect of continuing efforts on the part of his domestic Communists, who are talking signals from Castro, to create violence and revolution against himself, President Betancourt also finds two alternative courses of responsive action being pressed upon him.
 His military without whose guns and loyalty he might not have succeeded in weathering the three attempted revolutions of the past year, are telling him he had better suppress the Communists and outlaw their existence if he wants to put some effective curb on their plotting and open agitation against him.
 But some of the leftist and democratic but not Communist members of the Venezuelan Congress are threatening to resign in protest if President Betancourt attempts to outlaw the Communist opposition. And if they should resign, that would destroy his presence of possessing and leading a democratic form of government.
 If he follows the advice and demand of the military, he loses the support of those who give validity to his claim of leading a democracy. If he follows the advice of these democratic politicians, he may run the risk that the military will, next time there is a trouble, leave him and his government to the mercy of Communist-inspired mobs.
 What is President Betancourt trying to do, now that he is hemmed in on three sides? Apparently he is trying to find some formula by which he can get the Communists outlawed to a degree that satisfies his military without giving final offense to the democratic principles of his politicians.
 If he finds and enacts such a formula, it will be reported, for there are any number of fledgling countries to whom it might also be invaluable.

 In any given candidate's discussion of any given issue, there are at least three governing factors.
 One is the distance between the candidate himself and the actual authority or responsibility for dealing with the crisis involved.
 Another is the distance between this country and the crisis.
 And a third determining factor is the number of special bloc votes which may be available in this country.
 The greater the distance between the candidate and the authority, the less the distance required between this country and the crisis the candidate wants to be held about.
 The greater the distance between this country and the crisis, the holder the candidate who actually has responsibility and authority to be held about.

And public attention to the Series would assuredly have been much less than even this had not been the fact that there are such amusing devices abroad in the land as gambling pools based on the number of runs scored in various half innings.
 Anyway, it is all very sad. We have little enough of common pleasure and excitement in our national life without suddenly finding ourselves jaded, fed whatever vision or combination of reasons, over our World Series. We will do our waiting for next year, with more than the ordinary hope, a hope that the whole over-expanded, over-scheduled, over-dollar-hungry national game will somehow retrace itself back closer to the national heart and interest. What a thrill it would be, once again, to care who won!

Dr. Pond Named Coordinator Of Job Rehabilitation Study

Dr. Samuel E. Pond, Manchester research expert, has been appointed project coordinator for a four-year study to be conducted by the Bureau of Vocational Rehabilitation of the State Department of Education.

Dr. Samuel E. Pond

Dr. Pond is a former dean of the School of Arts and Sciences of the University of Hartford and is presently on the adjunct faculty as a professor emeritus in biology. He has recently been associated with the Institute of Living in Hartford as a research associate in neurochemistry.

Dr. James S. Peters II, director of vocational rehabilitation for the state describes the project as an investigation of techniques for utilizing statistics in vocational rehabilitation.

"We will collect data that are concerned with budgeting, case services, research design, personnel administration, public relations and other facets contributing to the rehabilitation of physically and mentally handicapped people," he said today.

It is the first project of its kind to receive federal support and will be conducted in the ten counseling offices and administrative offices of the BVR in the state. It will be financed jointly by the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults and the U.S. Office of Vocational Rehabilitation under the Department of Health, Education and Welfare.

Dr. Pond will work from the Hartford office of the BVR.

Faces Prison, Fine 'I Have Upheld Law,' Gov. Barnett States

NEW ORLEANS (AP) — Gov. Ross Barnett of Mississippi says he has actions in the University of Mississippi desegregation case are based on "what I believe to be the law" and that he is not in contempt of any court.

The Justice Department has asked the court to fine Barnett \$100,000 for failing between court hearings Oct. 7 and 12 to take positive action to purge himself of contempt. It also asked an additional fine of \$100,000 a day starting Oct. 12 until he does so.

Barnett's attorney, Charles Clark, told the court the governor did not consider himself in con-

tempt, because Meredith was attending the university.

"I have never taken the position that I have purged myself," Barnett said Tuesday. "Nor have I authorized anyone to take such a position on my behalf."

He added, "My position is that I have upheld the law and am not in contempt of any court."

Barnett also said: "My position is based upon the Constitution of the United States and the constitution and laws of Mississippi. My every decision in this matter has been formed after careful and deliberate consideration of what I believe to be the law."

Changing that "Mississippi has not yet had her day in court," Barnett said that if anyone felt that he has violated his rights, the courts are open to challenge any action in a proper court proceeding.

Barnett failed to appear, and did not send his attorneys, to the Sept. 28 hearing at which he was convicted of contempt.

In another development Tuesday, attorneys for former Maj. Gen. Edwin A. Walker asked U. S. Dist. Judge Claud Clayton to revoke his order that Walker undergo a psychiatric examination.

Walker, arrested during the riots here, is free on \$50,000 bond on the condition he undergo a mental test to see if he is mentally competent to stand trial on four federal charges including leading an insurrection.

The motion was filed at U. S. District Court in Oxford. It said the order for a mental test violates the constitutional rights of the former general.

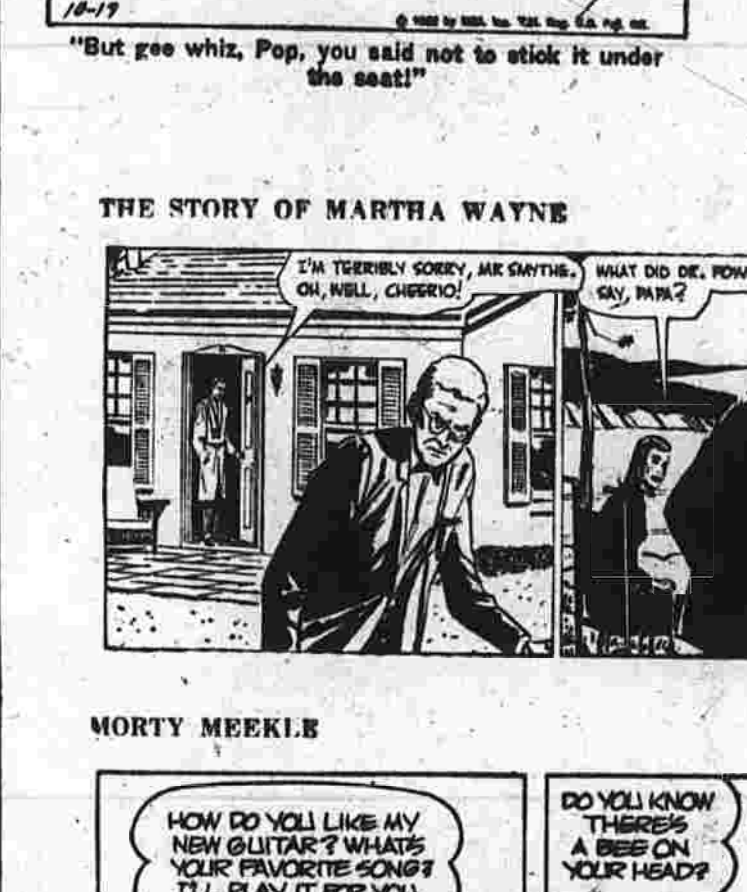

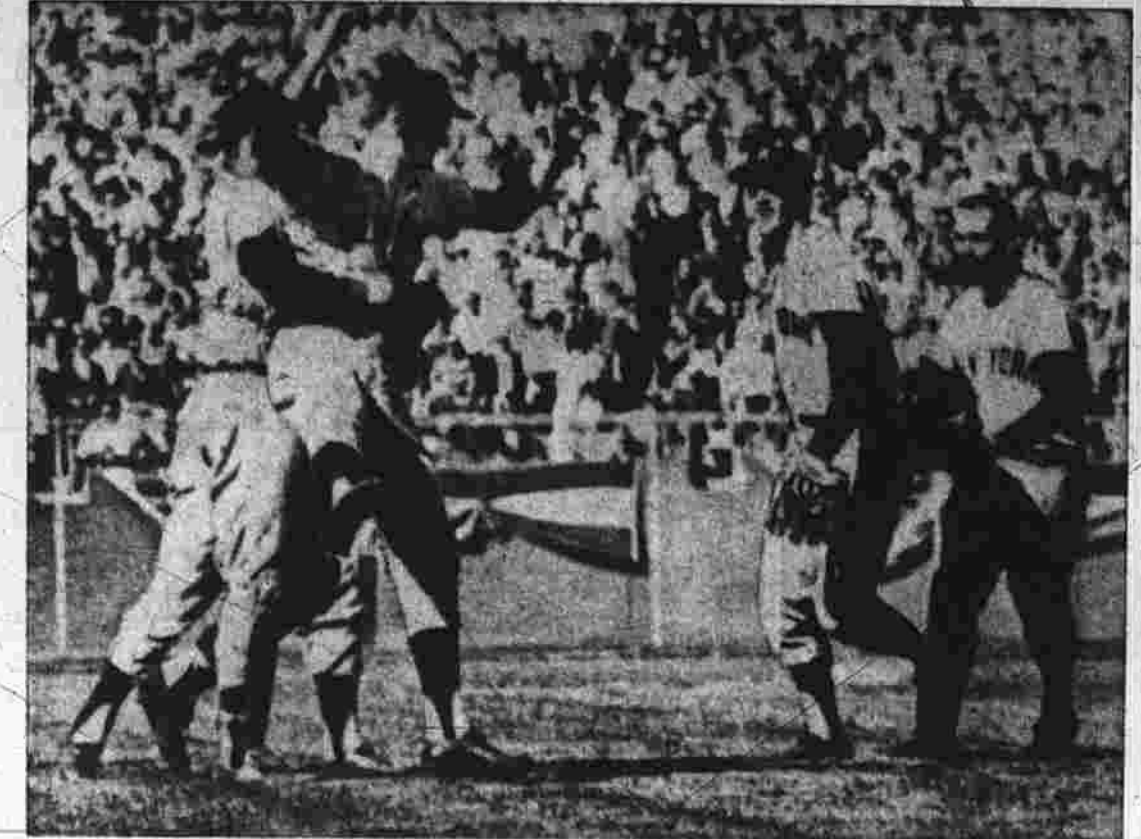
