Nikita, Kennedy Talk On Berlin Issue Seen

(Continued from Page One) Kennedy was expected to emphasize strongly in his meeting with Gromyko that Khrushchev's insistence on removal of the Western forces from Berlin is totally unacceptable and that the Western powers are completely agreed on defending West Berlin and its military and civilian supply lines against any kind of Communist move against them. It was understood Kennedy continued to make the point that continued U.S.-Soviet talks on the Berlin situation can be considered useful only if nothing happens in the meantime to change the basic situation on Berlin. Top U.S. officials actually see no prospect at the moment of reaching any kind of accord with the Soviets on West Berlin's future and they are strongly in favor of continued exploratory discussions aimed at some understanding which would reduce the tensions.

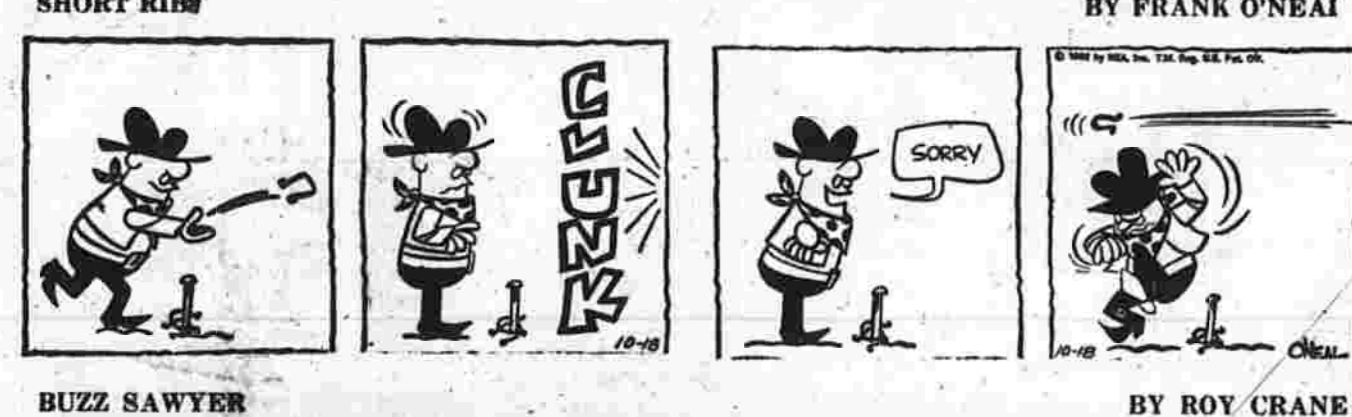

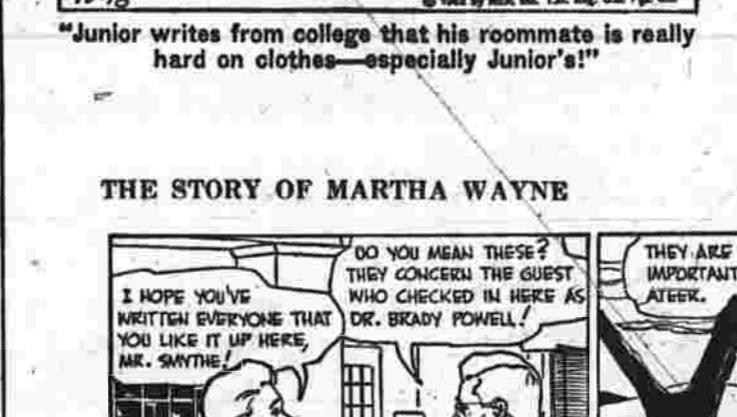

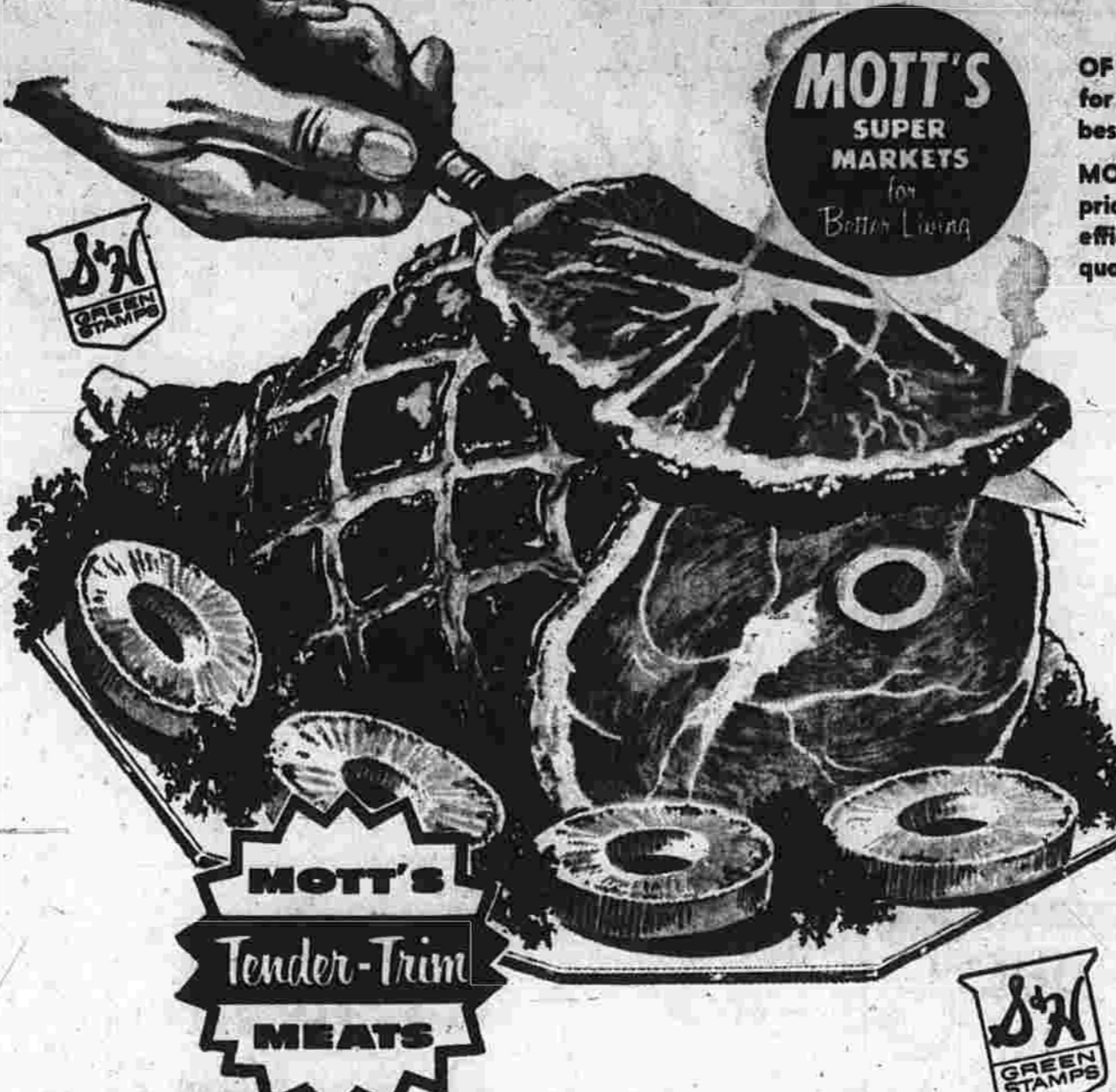
