Farmer Discovers Fallout Balloon

IMPROVE, Miss. (AP)—It did not scare me, but it scared my young son to death.
Lamar Gore, a Mississippi farmer, who found the partially deflated map of a huge balloon draped over a large tree back of his house when he awoke Friday.
In the end, Gore found out that the balloon carried instruments to measure nuclear fallout, and that the Navy and the University of Minnesota sent up the package in a joint venture.
But that didn't come until hours after Gore began bawling in neighbors and friends and welcoming strangers who stopped on Mississippi Route 44, to see the most interesting sight in this area in some time.
The first problem was to find a way to get the thing out of the tree. So they got a shagreen and fired a blast of it, hoping to finish the job of deflating it. No luck.
Then they got some tree-cutting equipment and felled the limb that was holding the balloon out of reach. Neighbors Joe Scuggs and Robert Harrell climbed into the branches of the fallen tree and retrieved three boxes — the largest about the size of an old prairie camera.
Small labels on each box carried this legend: "This scientific apparatus (joint property of U. S. Navy and University of Minnesota). The message asked the finder to call the university.
"Somebody in the crowd made the call and returned with the word—the boxes contained instruments to measure nuclear fallout.

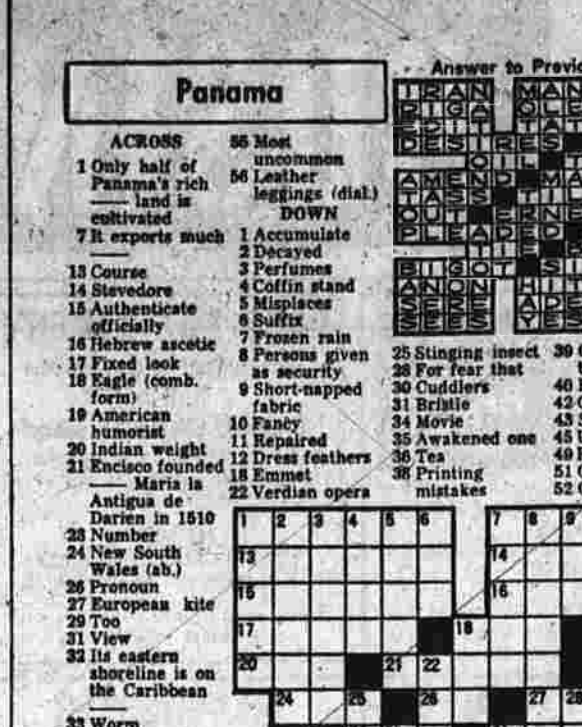

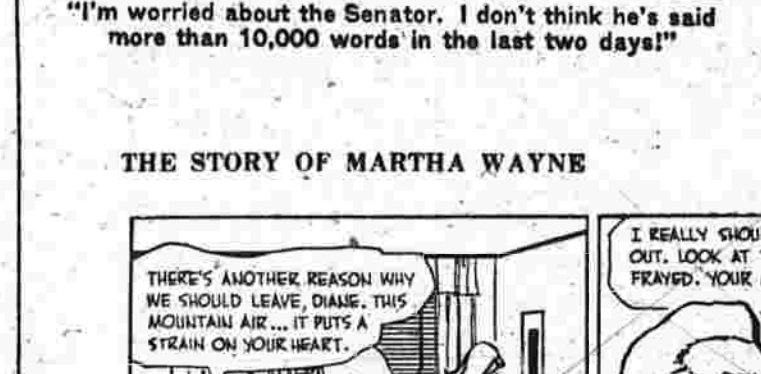

Pat Blair Fem Regular In 'Rifleman' Series

Pat Blair, who was chosen from some 300 actresses to play the regular role of "Lou Mallory" on the western series "The Rifleman" now in its fifth season, admits the word "star" has a lot of appeal for her.

"I'm not dabbling in show business until I land a husband," the ex-photographer's model declared emphatically. "I'm in it for keeps and expect to be in it a long time."

"I've played ingenue parts in my time. Now as 'Lou' I've got a pretty meaty role. I'll still be acting, I hope, when the role calls for me to play a grandmother — and I won't need the services of the makeup department."

Pat said she expects to have an "interesting career" in TV and the movies and for this reason is careful about the roles she accepts. "I don't want to be associated with a lot of small, walk-on parts that have no merit," she said. "I want to wait until the role is right for me even if it means going hungry. I've lived on Swiss cheese sandwiches before while waiting for the right break and I can do it again."

The tall redhead said she took the role of "Lou Mallory" because it offered her a challenging role — "the very interesting concept of a determined woman with sex appeal... and establish me as an actress in my own right."

Pat said she also liked the idea of playing opposite Chuck Connors because it is one of the few times she will be able to play certain scenes with her shoes on.

"I'm not that tall," she laughed, "but you'd be surprised how many actors I've appeared with who have been shorter than me. Even a good camera angle won't help them so I have to take off my shoes and play in my stockings. I won't have that trouble with Chuck."

Born in Fort Worth, but raised in Dallas, Pat reviewed her career as a model in New York and an actress in Hollywood with an occasional smile and an occasional frown as she remembered some of the ups and downs she went through.

"My parents didn't want me to become an actress," she said, "because they were convinced it was not a nice career for a girl. It's not that they thought there was anything wrong about it. But they had read so many stories about the emotional troubles actresses have and they didn't want me to be unhappy."

Pat played summer stock, and she was voted the girl with the prettiest legs in Texas. These were mostly forthy comedies like "Hayfever" and hairraisers like "Ten Little Indians."

"I was mostly used to decorate the stage," she said with a laugh. "I really don't think anybody spotted me as an upcoming Helen Hayes, but at least I was working on the stage, and not just talking about it."

When she was 19 Pat decided to read for New York to become a model after Harry Conover, the model czar, picked her as one of the five prettiest college girls in the country and offered her a modeling scholarship in Gotham.

However, the glamorous life of a high paid cover girl was not all it was cracked up to be. "I was always on the go from one photography assignment to another. It was fun at times, but it wasn't easy."

Her parents had moved to Hollywood from Texas when she had slipped into her early 20's and she joined them on the coast. Through friends she was introduced to Clarence Green and Russell Rouse, the creators of the TV series, "Tightrope," and they persuaded her to attend the evening drama classes they were conducting in Hollywood.

"All at once I wanted to be an actress again," Pat smiled. "The ambition had never really died in me, but because of my parents I had kept it hidden. Now I told my folks I really wanted to act. They thought about it for a few days and then gave me their blessing."

Pat started getting roles in several TV series—but was never really happy with these assignments because "the emphasis was not always on acting, but on sex appeal."

Pat heard that the producers of "The Rifleman" were look-

ing for a girl, preferably with an Irish background, to portray "Lou Mallory." It was also stressed that the girl should be more than just a fine actress, but she should also be no stranger to horses and guns.

Being qualified on all counts, Pat went to the Four Star studios

to try out for the role. Up until her appearance big Chuck Connors had his problems. It seemed that the right girl to play "Lou" wasn't on this planet.

"We talked to some 300 girls in

Hollywood on TV

HOLLYWOOD — (NEA)—The irresistible lure of a great character role had brought the legendary Paul Muni out of retirement after five years.

White-haired, mustached and bearded (courtesy of make-up), he was playing a 93-year-old codger, throwing his family into an uproar on his 75th wedding anniversary.

Facing children and grandchildren, his hands shook and his voice cracked as he announced a fanciful whim — a divorce.

Like the age make-up, the trembling hands and voice and the stooped walk were part of the character. Offstage, at 63, Paul Muni stands tall and erect and walks with sprightly steps.

He had come down from Santa Barbara, Calif., where he now lives, to guest star in "A Shame for the Diamond Wedding" on the television show, "Saints and Sinners." The new Four Star series stars Nick Adams as a young news reporter.

"No," he said, "it is no big comeback attempt. I liked the script and the director" (Marc Daniels, who directed him in a summer stock play in 1947). He's not even writing a book about his fabulous career.

"I read a few books written by movie actors," he grunted to us, "and that's why I'm not going to write a book."

His loss of an eye in a home accident is no great handicap for him, he said, and as a star who appeared in only one movie a year — "that was exhausting enough" — he said he envied today's young television actors.

"Television is great for them to learn their trade, to be versatile. I had this opportunity in stage stock companies but then movies
