

Albania Boss Fumes, Red Rift Widening

Who is "the sworn enemy of the Socialist camp and the international Communist and workers movement?" Who prevents "the friends of the U.S.S.R. from profiting by the great benefits of Soviet science?" Who is a traitor, a "renegade and Marxist?"

According to Enver Hoxha, boss of the Albanian Communist party, the culprit is Nikita S. Khrushchev.

And that seems to mean that the rift between the Soviet Communist party and the Red Chinese has become even deeper, and that there is division and confusion in the Soviet Communist camp.

One of the reasons for the widening of the chasm appears to be Khrushchev's performance in the recent Cuban crisis. But there is more to it than that, and Hoxha seems to have let the cat out of the bag.

Hoxha has been quarantined by Moscow's ruling Communists for disagreeing with Khrushchev and siding with the Red Chinese in the squabble within the world Communist movement. He has just let go with the most violent blast yet launched by any Communist leader against the Soviet premier.

Four States Still Lack Governors

WASHINGTON (AP)—The final outcome of election contests to choose four governors and one U.S. senator remained cloudy today by the closeness of the vote and the possibility of ballot recounts.

It may be weeks before voters in the Albanian Communist, Maine and Massachusetts can be sure who their new governors are.

In Minnesota and Rhode Island the winners have not even been unofficially determined yet and recounts are possible in all four states.

And in South Dakota and Alabama, Republicans said they may challenge the victories of Democrats.

Votes still trickling in from Tuesday's election produced a virtual dead heat in Minnesota's gubernatorial race between Republican incumbent Elmer L. Andersen and Democratic challenger, L. Gov. Karl Roalvaag.

With two weeks to go, Andersen's lead over Roalvaag was 44 votes—419,776 to 419,732.

The final determination of the state's voting boards probably will be made until Nov. 26, and then a recount request by the loser would be still to be completed.

In Rhode Island, incumbent Democratic Gov. John A. Notte Jr. is expected to be re-elected, but the absentee vote still uncounted and the canvass of voting machines tabulations still to be completed.

In Massachusetts, state police started balloting and voting machines as both candidates for governor took out petitions for election. The final unofficial tally showed Democrat Endicott Peabody a winner by 2,143 votes over Republican incumbent John A. Folye, out of a total vote of 1.1 million.

The official count is not expected.

British Claim U.S. Leads in Rocket Power

LONDON (AP)—America's long-range missile strength exceeds that of the Soviet Union, according to an intelligence report issued today by the British Intelligence Services.

The report claims the United States has between 400 and 500 intercontinental ballistic missiles compared with 75 in the Soviet arsenal.

Agency Fines 13 Pilots for Laxity on Duty

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Federal Aviation Agency has fined 13 airline pilots for "inattention to flight duty" and ordered Eastern Air Lines to draw up a plan to make sure it doesn't happen again.

The fines, ranging from \$300 to \$500, stemmed from a congressional investigation which brought to light some shocking piloting errors in the laps of other pilots at the controls of airliners.

A former Eastern flight engineer testified at the congressional hearing that he took the pictures of 14 pilots on 18 Eastern flights between May 1959 and June 1961.

The FAA said there is reason to believe that the pictures were taken on the flight indicated. The information also supports the allegation that there were violations of the civil air regulations, specifically that lack of vigilance on the part of the pilots.

The prosecution asked the jury Thursday to return a verdict of guilty—but with a recommendation for leniency—against all five defendants charged with the killing of a 3-day-old Carline Vandepot.

The verdict is expected Saturday.

Vandepot, 24, is charged with homicide and has admitted giving her deformed baby a fatal dose of barbiturate in a single gulp. He could get the death penalty if the jury takes the death penalty drug thalidomide which has been blamed for malformation in babies.

Accused accomplices are the baby's father, Jean Vandepot, 25; Mrs. Vandepot's sister, Mrs. Marguerite de Marck, 35; the baby's grandmother, Mrs. Fernande Colpaert, 60; and the family doctor, Dr. Jacques Gaster, 38. Gaster admitted prescribing the barbiturate which killed the infant.

Second 'Mutiny' Film Probably Profitable

 HOLLYWOOD (AP)—"Mutiny on the Bounty" at long last has found its second film voyage, and the question will be asked: "Was it worth it?"
 In view of the new economics of the movie business, the answer will probably be: Yes. In the old days, investment of \$15 million in one film would be enough to put a studio under the waves. But today's market allows a company to recoup such an investment over the long haul—if the movie has merit.
 "Mutiny on the Bounty" does. Even if all its millions don't show up on the screen, enough to make it one of the great screen spectacles.
 Some of the Tahiti scenes—native boats swarming around the newly-arrived "Bounty," an immense human chain herding fish into a lagoon—are no less than magnificent.
 What about the film as drama? It is no easy job for a remake to capture the magic of the original, especially a well-remembered one like the Clark Gable-Charley Laughton version.
 The 1962 film tries a few new tricks, which are welcome and often successful.
 The portrayal of Marion Brando as Fletcher Christian is destined to be controversial. He appears to have sought the farthest reach from the cable portraiture and presents Christian as an upper-class type.
 But Brando is still the most fascinating actor around, and it becomes apparent that he knows what he is doing.
 Trevor Howard also manages a difficult feat. He Bligh would naturally face comparison with Laughton's Bligh, Howard is captured as the inflexible captain.
 Richard Harris draws third star billing, and he makes a fine, maturing matinee. The rest of the crew, Britishly all, are superbly cast. Tania, the native girl who provides the major romantic interest, is easy on the eye, especially in performance of the free-wheeling Tahitian. Need Some Cloves, The Sultan Has Them

 ZANZIBAR (AP)—Anybody with a bright idea for increasing the consumption of cloves should get in touch with his highness the sultan, Seyyid Sir Abdulla Bin Khalifa, royal palace, East Park Square, Zanzibar.
 The sultan's realm, which encompasses the tiny islands of Zanzibar and Pemba off East Africa, has 4.5 million clove trees and supplies 85 percent of the world's clove supply.
