Chinese Rout Indians As Truce Time Nears

NEW DELHI, India (AP)—Sweeping toward a cease-fire deadline set by their own high command, Red Chinese troops scored spectacular gains today in twin drives on the Himalayas toward the flat, open country of north Assam.

Red Chinese military spokesmen said they had captured 400 Indian soldiers and 100 tons of supplies. The Indian army says it has lost 150 soldiers and 300 tons of supplies.

At the eastern end of the front the Chinese pushed about 40 miles farther down the Laitum River valley toward the Brahmaputra. This was a drive which, linked with that from Bomdila, could form a bridgehead on the plateau.

U.S. to Remain on Guard, Prevent Any Cuba Buildup

WASHINGTON (AP)—President Kennedy, saying there is reason for gratitude in this Thanksgiving week, has called off the U.S. blockade of Cuba in return for promised removal of Soviet bombers from the island.

Serious problems remain, Kennedy emphasized Tuesday night at his first news conference since the Cuban crisis spread fitters around the world.

Until arrangements are made to verify the withdrawal of Soviet missiles and planes, preferably by inspection on the spot, he said the United States will do its own checking on military activity in Cuba.

He clearly meant that among other measures this country would continue to send out reconnaissance planes to guard against another buildup in Cuba, despite Prime Minister Fidel Castro's threat to shoot them down.

Yet, with the manner of a man reporting the worst is over, Kennedy said real progress has been made—and a complete settlement could open the door to solution of other east-west issues.

Philosophically, he added: "In this week of Thanksgiving, there is much for which we can be grateful as we look back to where we stood only four weeks ago—the unity of this hemisphere, the support of our allies and the calm determination of the American people."

On the main question of the day, Kennedy said "important parts" of his understanding with Khrushchev have not been carried out. Castro has not allowed the replacement of all offensive weapons, he said, and no real safeguards have been established against the return of such weapons.

Washington (AP)—Navy patrol planes received the assignment today of checking outwards bound ships carrying Soviet bombers. The Navy said that 68 ships of the blockade force should be back at home ports or other duty stations between now and the end of this month.
