### Mamed Newman Dies in Chicago

CHICAGO (AP)—Funeral services will be held Thursday for Robert J. Casey, famed Chicago newspaperman, author and war correspondent.

Casey, 72, died Tuesday. He had been in failing health for several months.

He was author of a World War I diary, "The Cannoniers Have Heavy Guns," highly praised by critics. It was one of 30 books, including "Buster Island," the story of the desolate island chieftain with huge heads carved from stone, on the East Coast.

His best known works, among newspapermen at least, were "How Interesting People," and "The Daily News." Casey was born in Berea, Ohio, in 1895. He worked for the Cleveland Plain Dealer in Des Moines, Iowa, and later worked in Houston, Tex. He had worked for Chicago newspapers for 30 years, mostly with the Daily News.

Survivors include his widow, Hazel MacDonnell Casey, a former member of the Chicago Board of Education.

### 714 Idle Claims Listed Last Week

Unemployment in Manchester for the week ending Dec. 1 increased by 10 claims over the previous seven-day period, including a reported layoff of 30 textile workers, the State Labor Department reports today.

The increase, to 714 from 704 claims, parallels a rise to 28,220 from 26,248 in the state as a whole.

The claims filed in Manchester were at the factory of the Bushnell office. Of the total, 336 were filed by women.

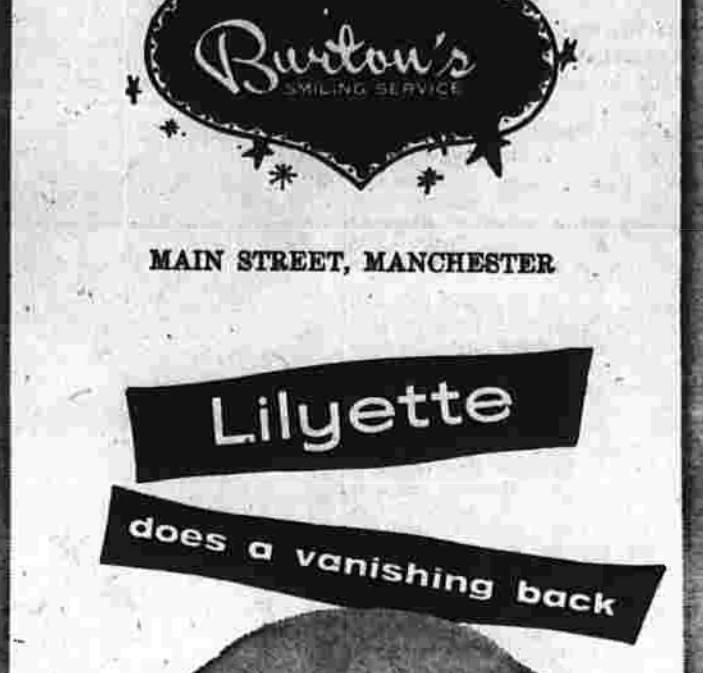

The Cuban crisis, Arthur Sylvester, assistant secretary of defense for public affairs, instructed all Pentagon officials to report to him the substance of all interviews with newsmen. That order still stands.
