Laughton Learned To Love America

ALFRED THOMAS HOLLYWOOD (AP)—It is only fitting that Charles Laughton should find rest on an American soil.

The latter years of the great British-born actor, who will be buried today at Forest Lawn, were marked by a love affair with his adopted land. The last part of his life was spent in a book published during his final illness, "The Fabulous Country."

Laughton selected his favorite writings about the United States, and wrote of famous authors which he often read on his hours through the nation. He introduced each passage with a comment of his own.

Among his comments: "New York City—'One of the best things that can happen in New York is to walk through the streets from England on their first trip to America—what excitement to show them their first real skyscraper, to take them to the Radio City Music Hall, particularly if it is Christmas, for the audience family audience, to take them to the State Island ferry, to the museum in town, to the wealth of restaurants and museums."

New England—"When Ellis and I were first in New York we visited New England several times. After the clangor of the city, New England gave us great comfort. We had not known in the Old World that America had such 'antiques' or that there were charming old houses and towns. I kept on asking the Pullman porter if this was still New England, which is near Hartford, Conn., and its graceful white-painted houses. Old wooden houses were a revelation to us, as were clams, clam chowder, Boston scrod, trilliums which carpet the woodlands in spring, mountain laurel and the blazing colors in fall.

The South—"I have many memories of the South—of Chapel Hill in North Carolina, where Thomas Wolfe was educated. It was spring and I have never seen such a beautiful landscape. There was a backyard with cherry trees, and there were cardinal birds among the pink blossoms. I will never forget that."

Chicago—"Chicago has many memories for me, and the best was the first. Bill and I had just come to America and we were in a play together in Chicago. We had a small apartment overlooking the lake in a hotel on Lake Shore Drive, and the weather was bitter cold."

California—"Bill and I were in New York first and then Chicago and afterward in California. It was only in California that we began to look around. We got to the mountains, the lakes, the deserts and the sea, to San Francisco, the Monterey Peninsula, the old missions, and started to learn about the birds, the plants, the flowers of the prodigious West Coast."

New York Strike May Shape Future of Press Industry

NEW YORK (AP)—The future of the newspaper industry — and other publishing ventures — could be shaped by the outcome of the strike which has shut nine New York daily newspapers since Dec. 8.

The strike is being led by Local 6 of the International Typographical Union.

It has led to the belief in many quarters that the main goal of the strike is not just higher wages and other benefits, but an effort by the ITU to make itself the dominant union in the rapidly changing newspaper industry.

For many years the ITU had this position, but it is the American Newspaper Guild — an organization of reporters, noncraft and clerical workers which the ITU men formed in 1938 — that has helped foster a more militant effort, and members rallied around him.

After he took over, he promised that things could be different. When the Guild agreed last month to a package increase of about 25 percent per man over two years, and returned from a one-year strike, the ITU warned it wouldn't be bound this time by that settlement.

DONATED EYE TISSUES HELD BY GREENBERG

It would be hard to say how many lives have been saved because public-sighted citizens have given blood to their local blood banks. If donated blood is not needed as whole blood within the two or three weeks after it is withdrawn, it is not wasted. The plasma or fluid part can be processed and kept for a much longer time, and this can also give eye bank.

Most of us can and have given blood for a blood bank, but how many of us are aware of the equally deserving banks to which we can contribute only by making proper provision before death. When it can no longer matter to you, you can still be of great service by your contribution to an eye bank.

Although the eye tissues so donated are not actually saved, they do help to restore sight to many an injured person. I can refer you to the eye bank in your state, and you can tell me the procedure to use in donating eyes.

The principles on which eye banks work are similar for all states. Donors must be of legal age, before signing any forms. If a child dies before he becomes of age one of his parents may sign a special eye bank form at the time of death. It is not necessary to have good vision to donate your eyes. The only requisite is that your cornea be clear. Eye color, age, sex, religion, or race are of no importance.

The eyes donated must be retrieved under sterile conditions. Eye surgeons are available to render this service without charge day or night in the home, funeral parlor, or hospital. Furthermore, the motor vehicle of an American Red Cross provides around-the-clock free transportation of eyes from the place of removal to the place designated by the eye bank.

The corneal transplantation must be performed within 48 hours (the sooner the better) after death of the donor. No corneas are bought or sold. When a cornea is made available it is assigned by the eye bank to the applicant on their roster who has been waiting the longest. Removal of the eyes does not in any way mar the appearance of the body, thanks to the skill of modern denturists.

The sclera or white outer coating of the eyeball is not needed

as often as are corneas but they may be transplanted in the same manner as corneas when the need does arise. The vitreous fluid from donated eyes can be stored for an indefinite period when it is removed under sterile conditions, and it can be used in some types of operation on the eye. Unfortunately no way is known

to make use of the retina, the light-sensitive nerve ending of the eye, or the optic nerve and by the same token persons whose blindness is caused by retinal disease cannot be helped by the eye bank. There are, however, still many more persons with opaque corneas whose sight could be restored than there are corneas available for transplanting. You can help.

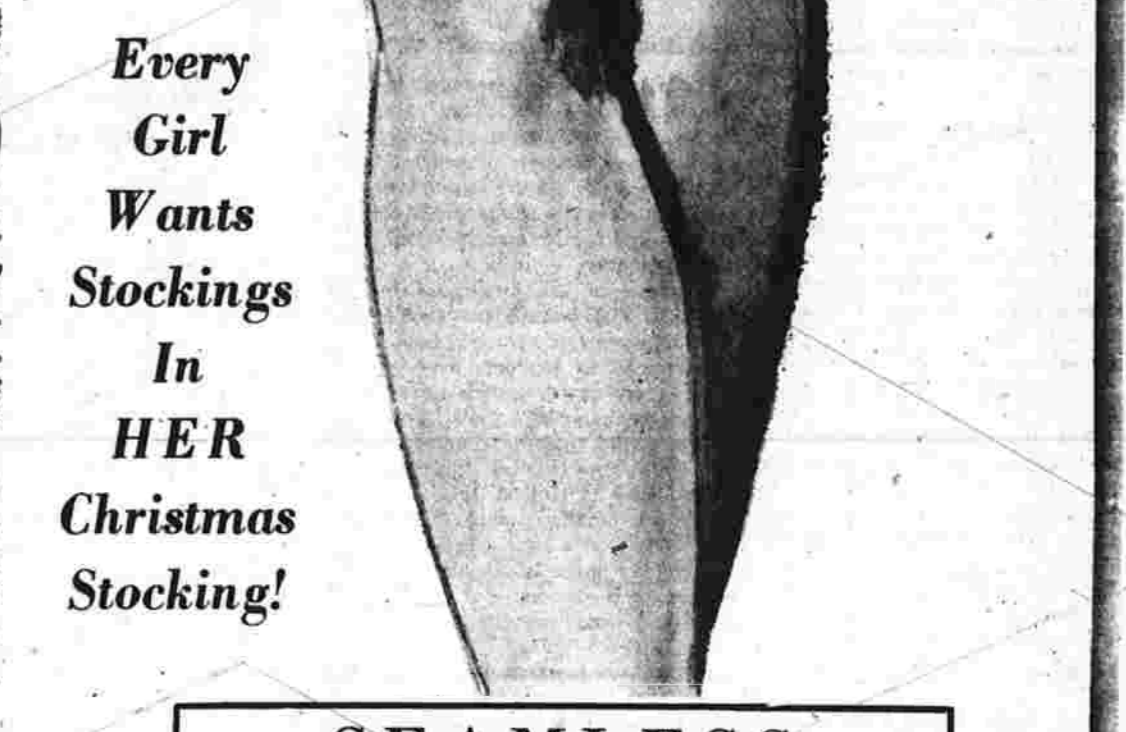

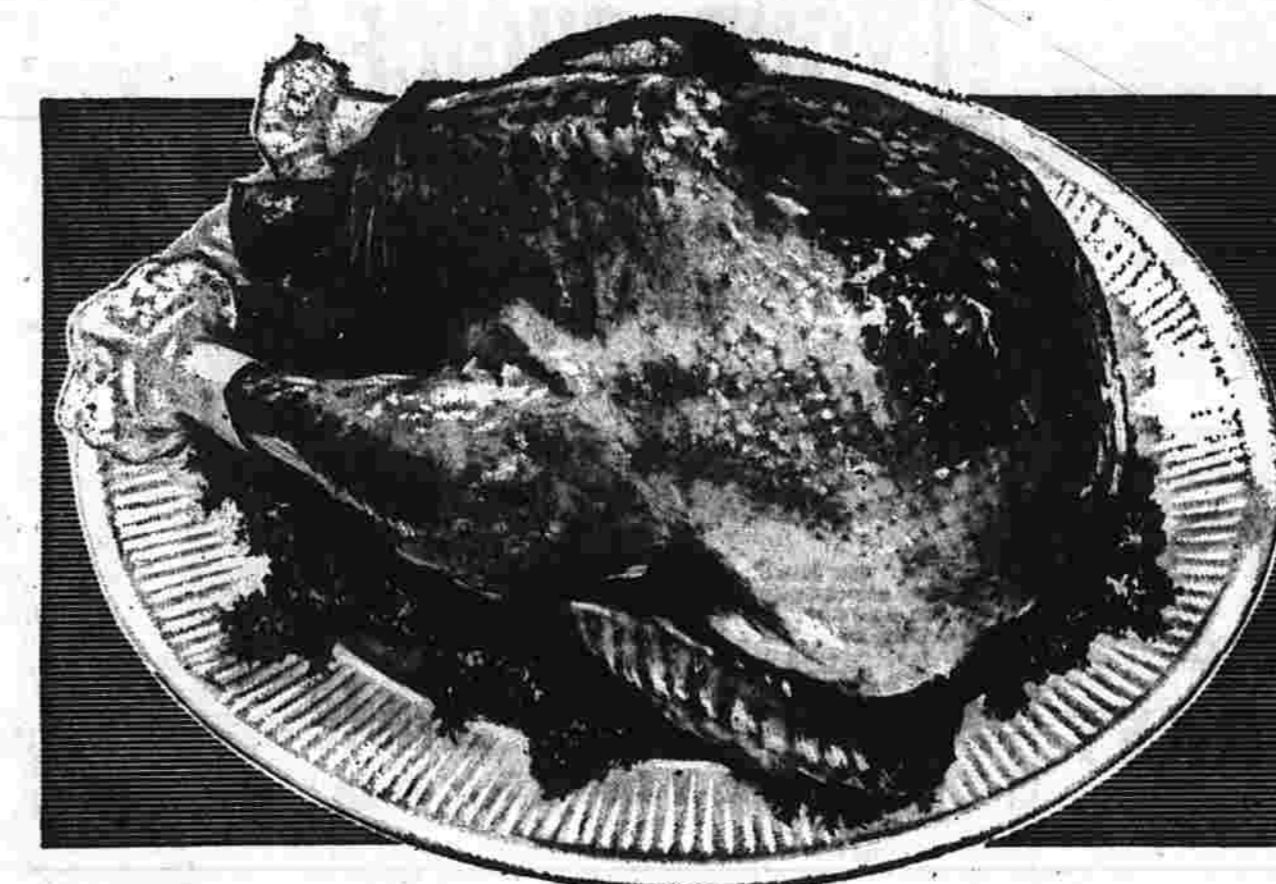

See officials have decided to seek from the three major television days of FDR. The Kennedy interview was carried on radio as well as on television. Kennedy himself spoke from texts and followed them with nearly flawless presentations and diction. Kennedy had no text what-so-ever, and the White House said he was given no inkling of the specific questions to be put to him. Naturally, he had some idea of the general areas that would be covered, such as domestic and foreign issues, congress, and politics.

The fireside chats of Roosevelt enabled the president to talk to the people directly about a special problem at a special time. Although there is an inclination now to think the fireside chats came too frequently, they were actually scattered fairly far apart. There was a feeling that too many would be overbearing a good Kennedy's session with network newsmen brought such wide-spread approval that the format spread may be used again, perhaps with variations.

There wouldn't be too much surprise around Washington now if the President scheduled the small, televised interview for some of the catch-as-catch-can formal conferences he holds in the formal, theatrical setting of the State Department auditorium. Roosevelt's new conferences, held in his White House offices, were smaller, less formal and more frequent. He held back his head, his chair, and a cigarette holder and chatted with reporters clustered around his desk.

There was time then, on many occasions to explore and discuss a subject. Both newsmen and the White House, for the last couple of administrations at least, have been reluctant to let the camera get a little out of hand and skipping around too fast and fast without bringing out all the points that needed attention.

Often an important question is raised on a crucial point, and almost before the answer is finished reporters are on their feet clamoring for the President's attention and the opportunity to ask the next question.

While many questions deal with the profound, some of them deal with the provincial, such as prospects of filling a minor federal job.

GOP Wants In
WASHINGTON (AP)—The Republican National Committee plans to ask the radio and television networks for a "comparable" slot to offset President Kennedy's national roving chair interview.

But when the Republicans would put on the airways to speak for the GOP—assuming the forum is granted—is uncertain.

The Republican most frequently mentioned by members of his party is former President Dwight D. Eisenhower. But Eisenhower worked hard for the GOP in the recent campaign, and there is some reluctance to ask him to assume a big new task.

Sabin Use Urged, Risk Held Slight

WASHINGTON (AP)—Americans are urged to use the Sabin oral vaccine against polio—but with a warning of a "very small risk" for adults.

The report came Wednesday from U.S. Surgeon General Luther Terry and his special advisory committee on the vaccine which for months has been pondering the question of hazard.

Committee experts estimated the chances at 1 in 10 million to one that the vaccine's live viruses might cause paralytic polio in persons of all ages. The odds, they said, were only slightly higher for adults, especially for those over 50.

Terry and the committee urged communities to go on with planned vaccination programs with the three types of Sabin virus, with special emphasis on vaccination of children and young adults.

"The oral (Sabin) and Salk (injected) vaccines have two established weapons against polio and we can, I believe, look forward to the day when polio is finally eliminated from this country," Terry said in a statement.

"With a total of more than 800 cases reported this year, compared to almost 10,000 a decade ago (when vaccines were not available), it is clear we are well on our way," he said.
