# Kennedy Aides Talk Defense Plans, Costs

(Continued from Page One)

The subject Wednesday was the tax cut proposal. For more than two hours, the President met with Secretary of the Treasury Douglas Dillon and other key financial advisers on the specifics of the tax package. The broad outlines of the plan, envisioning lower tax rates after next year for both individuals and corporations, were approved several weeks ago. At Wednesday's session, Kennedy got into many of the details and gave general approval to the Treasury's plan. However, several of the conference reported that much work remains to be done. Kennedy said he was "a good hearing but the program is not far beyond the drawing stage." He said Stanley S. Surrey, another key Treasury aide, had been "at it" to take part in the tax cut. Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara had to leave the session to go to a meeting of the joint Chiefs of Staff. McNamara said he was "a little bit" away from participating in the military discussion.

### Japan Declines To Halt Flow Of Steel To Reds

TOKYO (AP) — Foreign Minister Masayoshi Ohira said today that the Japanese government cannot grant a request by the North Atlantic Treaty Organization to halt the export of oil pipes to the Soviet Union.

"I can well appreciate the feelings of the NATO countries," Ohira said, "but the Japanese government has no legal power to stop private enterprise from exporting pipes to the Soviet Union."

### Red Aide Fired For Nationalism

MOSCOW (AP) — Pravda disclosed today that the premier of one of the Soviet Union's most important republics, the virgin lands territory of Kazakhstan, has been fired for displaying "nationalism."

In Soviet Kazan, this could mean showing too much independence of Moscow. The disgraced official is Selken Dautenov, who also was accused of "violation of party ethics, crudeness and conceit."

Pravda, the Communist party's official newspaper, said he was expelled from the central committee of the party's Kazakhstan branch.

He is being replaced by Dilmuhammed Kunayev, who was relieved Wednesday of his job as Communist party chief of Kazakhstan. Since party chiefs are generally more powerful than premiers of Soviet republics, Kunayev apparently is being lifted upstairs.

Kunayev was relieved of his party post by a plenary meeting of the Kazakhstan central committee.

Kazakhstan, a vast territory in west central Asia, is lagging far behind Premier Khrushchev's expectations in agricultural production. Pravda said the committee admitted the correctness of Khrushchev's criticism last month of agricultural production in the republic. Khrushchev said Kazakhstan had delivered only half of its quota of grain to the state this year.

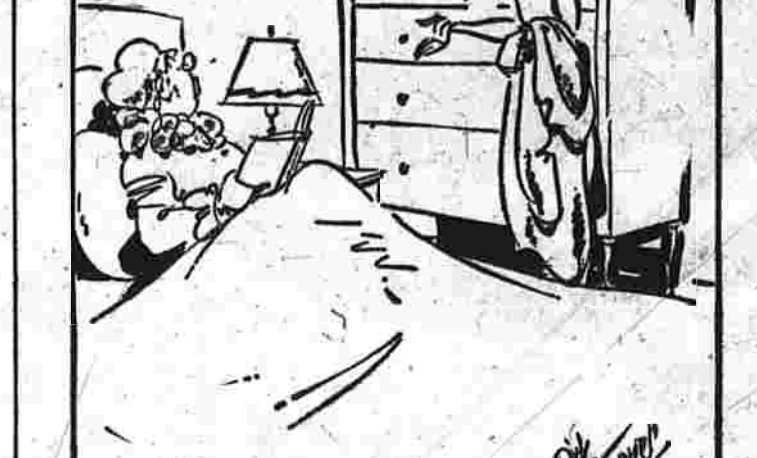
