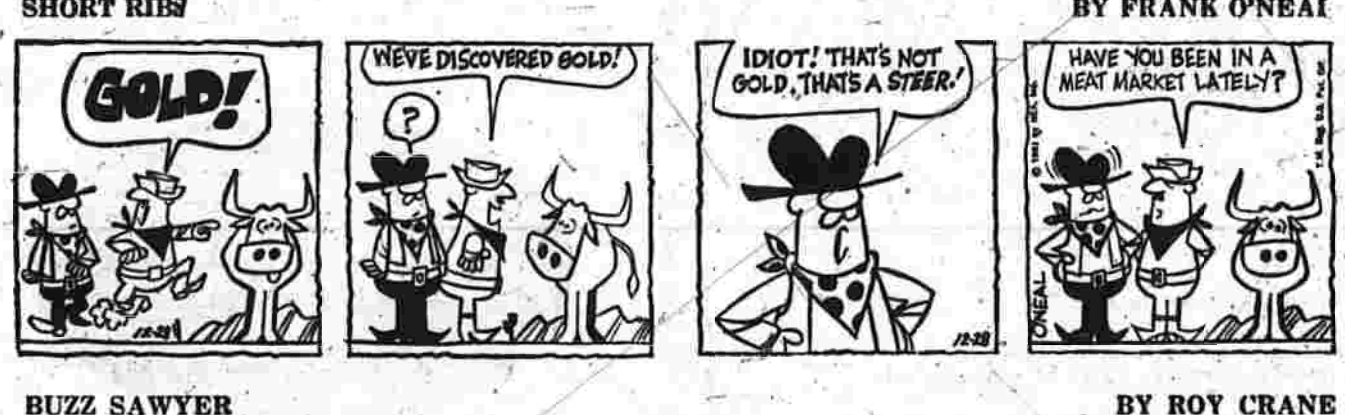

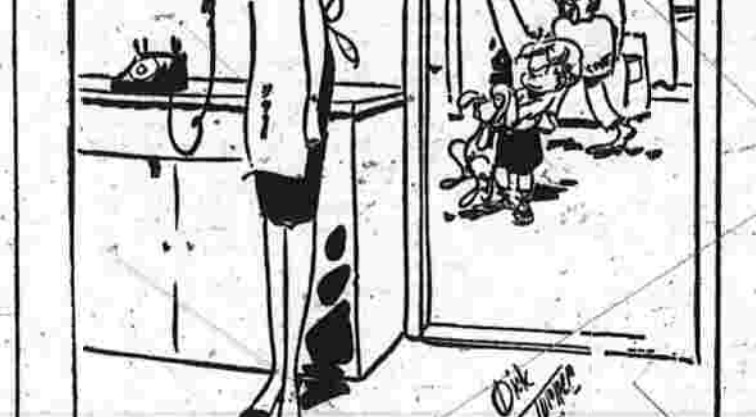

Club Members Favor Arranging New Lease

Manchester Country Club members voted almost two to one last night in favor of arranging a seven-year lease for the 177 acres of town-owned land the club now occupies. One hundred and twenty-five members of the club were present at the meeting, which was held at the club house. The vote was 100 to 25 in favor of the seven-year lease. The club members also voted to accept the terms of the lease, which was presented by the town board. The lease would allow the club to use the land for recreational purposes for a period of seven years, starting on January 1, 1963. The town board will now consider the lease and, if approved, will sign it on behalf of the town.

Bolton School Votes Slated Tonight

Although local residents have come to expect a machine vote on school issues, no petition asking for a referendum had been filed with Mrs. Olive Toomey, clerk, at 9 p.m. last night, one hour past the deadline for filing such a petition. Therefore voters will decide tonight at a special meeting to be held at the Bolton High School on Monday, Dec. 31, whether the town should build a junior high school, a junior-senior high school, or a junior high school with a cafeteria-auditorium addition. Also to be voted on will be appropriations of \$700,000 for construction of a junior high school on Brandy St., \$300,000 for a junior-senior high school, and \$100,000 for construction and equipment for a junior high school with a cafeteria-auditorium addition. Other items in the call for the meeting are authorization of the Board of Selectmen and/or the Board of Education to make application for state aid and for the location of state-owned buildings in leasing and recording bonds.

Tshombe Flees Palace, Mopping Up Under Way

ELISABETHVILLE, Congo (AP) — UN forces supported by aerial bombardment seized almost complete control of this secessionist capital today and apparently started a mopping up operation. President Moise Tshombe fled his palace and his whereabouts were unknown.

A UN spokesman said Katanga resistance was cracking and that Tshombe's heavily-armed police were fleeing into the bush, leaving behind weapons, equipment and armored cars.

UN forces took the offensive after two days of Katanga police attacks on positions in Elisabethville.

UN planes bombed strategic points in Elisabethville and the mining town of Kolwezi about 150 miles northwest of the capital.

A UN spokesman said the city's water supply, cut off in the outbreak of hostilities Thursday night, had been restored. He said the UN hoped to have electric power restored within two days.

Tshombe was gone when blue-helmeted troops—mostly Ethiopians and Indian Gurkhas—occupied his palace.

Previously, Tshombe had been reported to have fled to the northern Rhodesian border, or to Kolwezi.

The spokesman said the United Nations moved a railway tunnel in the vicinity of a roadblock where fighting took place last year ago.

The spokesman said UN troops reported few Katangans had been taken prisoner and that Tshombe's casualties were believed to be heavy.

UN forces lost one killed and five wounded in fighting Friday. Previous reports said seven UN soldiers and eight civilians were wounded.

Despite the success of UN troops, small arms and heavy mortar fire continued in several sectors of the town.

The fighting went on after two UN planes bombed Katanga on the capital and on the airfield at Kolwezi, the base of Tshombe's rudimentary air force.

The raid on Elisabethville was carried out by a single aircraft at 4 a.m. The plane dropped bombs and incendiary bombs and damage were not yet known.

The raid on Kolwezi was carried out by Swedish-made F-105 jet fighters. It is believed that the United States made no commitment to supply the fighter planes.
