### You Should Know ...

A. Raymond Rogers

World War II helped many men... A. Raymond Rogers Jr. was one of them. He decided... "I had a lot of time to think," he says. "I had a real feeling that the war was not the answer to man's problems and that if any hope came, it was education."

He is often asked what he thinks the high school needs. If he answers that a new course is desirable, he also answers that sufficient textbooks for courses already taught are necessary.

From 1937-40, he was assistant principal of Newton (Mass.) High School. He is now principal of secondary schools in progressive education. The school is administered on a "school within a school" concept, with students divided into small groups according to a home plan, says Rogers.

Rogers was one of three education officials who joined the school system in 1960. The others were Supt. of Schools William H. Curtis and Asst. Supt. Ronald P. Booth. Rogers succeeded Elton M. Bailey, who retired and since has become a staff member of the University of Hartford.

His weekly meeting schedule... "I would hate to see the existing groups be a divisive factor and hurt teachers and boards of education," he says, however, "I think there can be a climate educational matters, and an advisor to the town's young people and lead to a even better design."

After the war, he went to Colby College, also in Waterville, earning a bachelor of arts degree in pedagogy in 1949. In 1950, he received a master's in education, majoring in secondary school administration and guidance, from the University of Maine.

While he has been a teacher, Rogers' educational positions always have been primarily administrative. From 1949-51 he was principal of a school of 30 pupils in Brooksville (Maine) High School.

Space Problem Rogers says a major problem facing Manchester High in the past few years is that of space. More students than ever are taking five subjects instead of four, he says and the variety of classes offered secondary students poses scheduling problems.

### Bolton School Board To Consider Gr. 9 Plans

Housing for next year's Grade 9 pupils will be considered at a special meeting of the board of education tomorrow at 8 p.m. at Bolton school. The open meeting will be preceded by an executive session at which personnel problems will be discussed.

The board discussed possibilities for housing Grade 9 pupils briefly at its last meeting and School Supt. Philip Liguori was to have made a more comprehensive report at the February meeting.

Rooms if needed, rooms such as those for homemaking classes cannot be converted, he says. Next year's enrollment of senior high pupils is estimated at about 75 more than this year's, necessitating the addition of three teachers.

He is adamant in his stand against teachers' strikes. He says teachers who feel underappreciated are a far more "professional" approach to serious disagreements.

He is a member of many teachers' and professional organizations and also of the Kiwanis Club of Manchester and the Jaycees. Rogers is past president of the Congregational Church.
