From Your Neighbor's Kitchen

Lamb is a popular meat and is especially priced right now. Mrs. Charles McKennie, of East Windsor, Conn., prepares a delicious lamb roast, and says that it is especially favored. With the usual serving pan roasted or broiled, it is a simple meal and a light dinner.

Charles Leg of Lamb

- 1 whole or 1/2 leg of lamb on conditioned onion soup, garlic cloves.
- Trim fat off lamb. Insert garlic cloves in cuts made in meat. Use 1/2 bulb of garlic or less for large roasts. Cover with foil if larger cut of meat is used, or remove foil if desired. Place meat on rack in pan. Brown in 300 to 350 degree oven for one-half hour or more. Remove from oven and pour off excess fat.
- Heat onion soup, add 1/2 cup of wine (use two cups for whole leg) and pour over meat. Cover tightly and bake for about three hours or more, depending on size of roast. Baste several times. Potatoes and carrots may be placed around meat for last hour or so of baking.
- For gravy, make a thin paste of three tablespoons of flour mixed with water and stir into pan liquid after excess fat has been spooned off. When smooth, add water to desired consistency, about one and one-half to two cups. Liquid from cooked vegetable is excellent for gravy. Simmer gravy slowly for 10 to 15 minutes.

Lamb prepared from this recipe is very tender and moist, said Mrs. McKennie and the recipe gives it a flavor boost.

Mrs. McKennie was born in Parkersburg, W. Va., and moved to Long Island, N. Y., before she was five. She graduated from Skidmore College, Saratoga Springs, N. Y., in 1928, with a B.S. degree in art education. She did graduate work at New York University, and went to Europe in one of her education courses, studying at the University of London, England, and the University of Heidelberg, Germany.

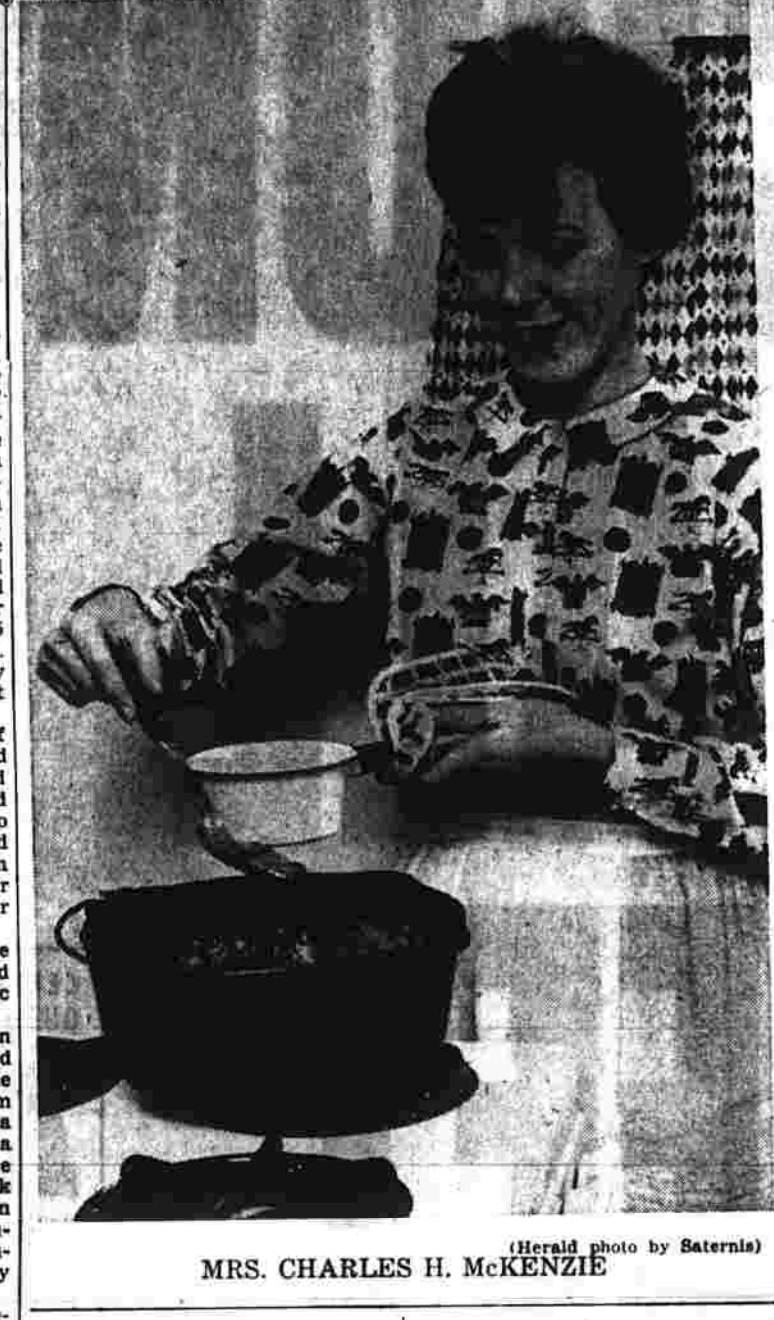

even if you paid more than half the child's support.

You can — in addition to your own support, child or adopted child — claim the following relatives as dependents if they fit the rules given later.

Your grandchild, great-grandchild, and so on; your brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister; your parents, grandparent or great-grandparent or other direct ancestor but not a foster parent; your stepmother or stepfather; your aunt or uncle, meaning a brother or sister of your mother or father; your niece or nephew, meaning a son or daughter of your brother or sister; your father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, brother-in-law, or sister-in-law.

None of these relationships ends if the person is a dependent if he got more than half his support from you and did not have \$600 or more of his own taxable income.
