Coffins Lacking

QUITO, Ecuador (AP)—A shortage of coffins today delayed the burial of some of the 104 children and four teachers killed in the collapse of a Roman Catholic primary school at Hilloan.

The heavy rains that caused the collapse at Hilloan of the Roman Catholic primary school in the Andes Mountains Sunday, killed 104 children and destroyed seven homes. None was injured.
