### You Should Know...

Richard L. Sullivan

You may see Richard L. Sullivan while he is on duty as one of Manchester's efficient patrolmen, but his service to the department and the community runs deeper than protecting the welfare of the public and public property.

On Sunday, Jan. 6, Sullivan was elected to his second consecutive term as president of the Manchester Police Mutual Aid Association.

His election marks the first time since the organization's first president, Herman Schenkel, former police chief, served consecutive terms. Schenkel headed the group from its inception in 1925 through 1942.

Benefit Shows Sullivan explains the workings of the organization.

"All times during Schenkel's term in office, the association raised money from an annual concert and later from an annual variety show. During the depression years, the association turned 75 per cent of the proceeds from one of the annual concerts over to the town to help the needy.

"In recent years, we have had wrestling matches, basketball games and stage plays," Sullivan said.

"The monies raised today are used to supplement the salary pay in the event of sickness or accident, as well as pay a death and retirement benefit.

"For the past four years, we have raised funds from the annual Policeman's Charity Ball. A portion of these funds go to charitable organizations," Sullivan said.

In 1959, the association took over sponsorship of the Halloween Dance held at the junior high school and Manchester High School.

Sullivan heads an association membership of 44 men.

John P. Sullivan, 1931, at Lynn, Mass., son of Clifford A. and Audrey F. Sullivan. He attended Lynn Vocational High School. In 1957 he came to Manchester and on July 21, 1959, joined the Manchester Police Department.

During his high school days he played football and basketball. After graduation, he played baseball and basketball with the Lynn National Guard team and was also a member of the Guard's Rifle Team.

Prior to coming to Manchester in 1957, Sullivan was employed at General Electric in Lynn and later was a trailer truck driver for the Arrow Freight Lines, Springfield, Mass.

He recalls his first night on foot patrol duty and first day on the force while he investigated a motor vehicle accident at Larrick Park. A car rolled over four or five times and the driver was unhurt, he recalls. The license plates on the vehicle were lettered "ROYL."

Police work since that first night "has been very interesting work," he says. "No two days are ever the same," he added.

### Bolton PBC Weighs Revisions in School Plans

Possible revisions in the plans for the proposed high school to be located on Bolton St. were discussed at a meeting of the public building commission (PBC) at the Community Hall last night.

Harold Sawyer, a PBC member, felt that the corridor area need to be brought to the level of existing arrangement. It would be possible to schedule the classes at separate times, that both boys and girls would be using the same corridor area at the same time. He said this would be a particularly difficult situation to handle.

After discussion, Dennis Keefe, representing architect Arnold Law, suggested that an additional door could be located at a point which would make it possible to separate the corridor, and by means of a gate the rest of the gymnasium area.

It was also determined that by eliminating one of the doors to the principal's office a space saving of approximately 52 sq. ft. could be realized. This space would then be used for storage, making it possible to use the area already designated for storage as a cloak room for the administrative offices.

The conference room of the administrative quarters was also discussed and the possibility of using a more substantial arrangement

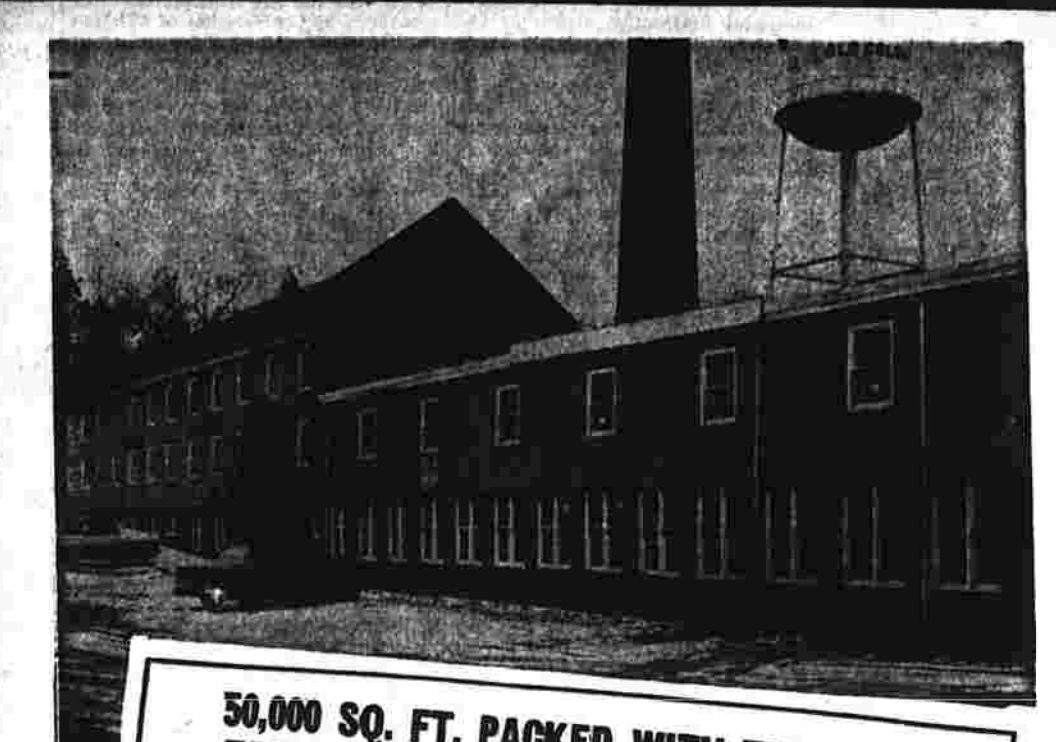

In 1962, about 1,300,000 motor vehicles were registered in the state, up at least \$5,000 over 1961.

Although he agrees that more state legislation is needed to put teeth in existing laws, Mulcahy says Connecticut has fewer fatal accidents for miles traveled than any other state except Rhode Island.
