The mower leaped toward a link-chain fence. I still fought for control. Suddenly I was chilled and filled with horror. There was fire.

I tried to push myself free of the mower. There was no escaping. The fence was over my left foot and had it trapped against the mower's frame. It is a moment I will never forget.

Fortunately, the mower's engine did not stall and the clutch did not disengage, as I was dragged under the fence. I was left stunned and afters.

He attempted to disengage the clutch with a screwdriver. I tried to get up. I was filled with hands and only burned more severely.

The mower lay on its side a few feet away still burning and spinning one wheel in the dirt. For a moment, I felt a response to do something about it.

Turning toward Lake Washington, I saw a fire truck. I was at the edge of the flames and staggered to the fence and flung myself into the water.

I crawled over some logs and plunged into the lake. I splashed around and then lifted myself from the water. Flames billowed again under my shirt.

For the first time I realized I was seriously hurt. I looked into the twilight sky. My left eye was blurred. I was cold and the water strode uphill through the loose dirt.

My mind was filled with fearful thoughts. I wondered if I would lose consciousness and not be found for several hours. My vision was bad. I wondered if I could find my way through the gates and fence.

There were voices somewhere. I kept shouting for help. My cries were unheard. My wife, Alice, was in Seattle attending a meeting.

At the ambulance turned and weaved along the streets a few minutes later. I watched the reflection of the light from my eye and wondered. Would my injuries be fatal?

We reached the main highway. The attendant who had sat silently beside me this far spoke to the driver.

"Have you got your big light on top?" he asked. "How your street? I think you'd better roll this one."

TPC Denies England Bid

A requested zone change for the west side of Grand St. at the corner of E. Center St. was denied unanimously last night by the Town Planning Commission.

W. Harry England had asked for the change from Residence A to Residence C to construct town house style apartments.

The change is a logical extension of an existing business zone, the commission said in giving approval.

Another zone change requested last week by Oak Lodge, Inc. for eight acres on Toland Pike, east of Daning St. from Business II to Residence C, was tabled by the commission last night.

\$1.2 Million Expected in Aid, Income

The board of education expects the town to receive \$1,200,000 in revenue from the state and from miscellaneous sources during the 1963-64 fiscal year, leaving a net budget deficit of \$679,000.

The expected revenue during the present fiscal year is \$1,181,200. Most years, 1,001,000 is estimated in general state aid to education, a decrease of \$3,800 from the amount estimated for the current year. Other state grants are estimated at \$11,500, and miscellaneous revenue at \$108,410.

For the current year, \$62,500 is expected in other state grants and \$14,800 in expected in miscellaneous revenue.

The other state grants are estimated for the next fiscal year as follows: Adult education, \$2,400. Educationally exceptional pupils, \$14,000. The physically handicapped and \$3,000 for the mentally handicapped.

Vocational agriculture, \$7,000 for elementary pupils and \$1,200 for technical school pupils.

Driver education, \$2,400. National Defense Education Act (NDEA) grants, \$10,000. Vocational agriculture tuition, \$147,510, compared with \$104,350 this year.

The tuition includes \$138,500 for high school pupils, \$1,875 for handicapped pupils, \$400 for adult education pupils and \$3,000 for summer school pupils.

Building rental fees are expected to total \$6,000, \$1,000 decrease over those of the current year, and dental credits are expected to be \$500, a \$100 increase.

Other miscellaneous revenue is estimated at \$4,000, \$2,000 more than that this year.
