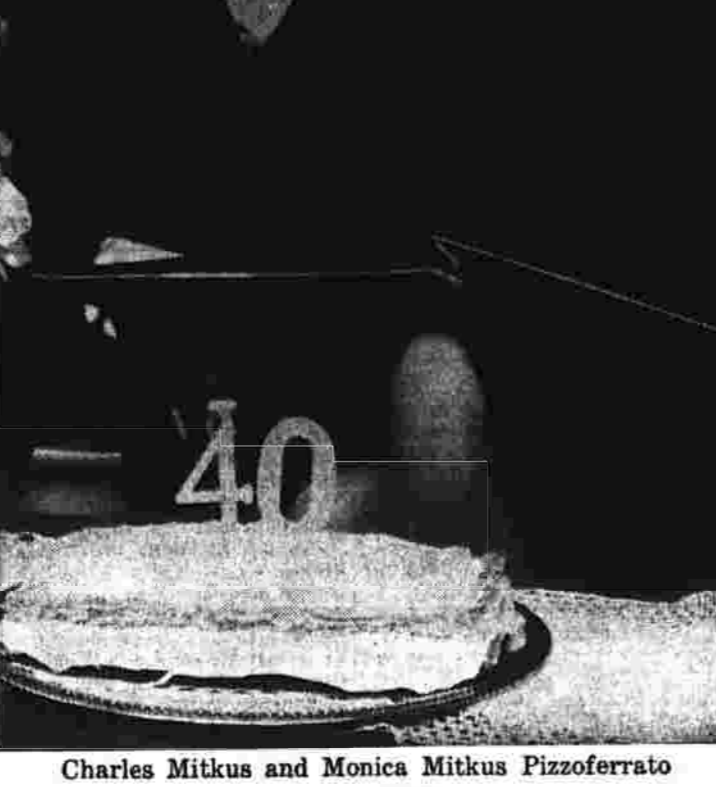

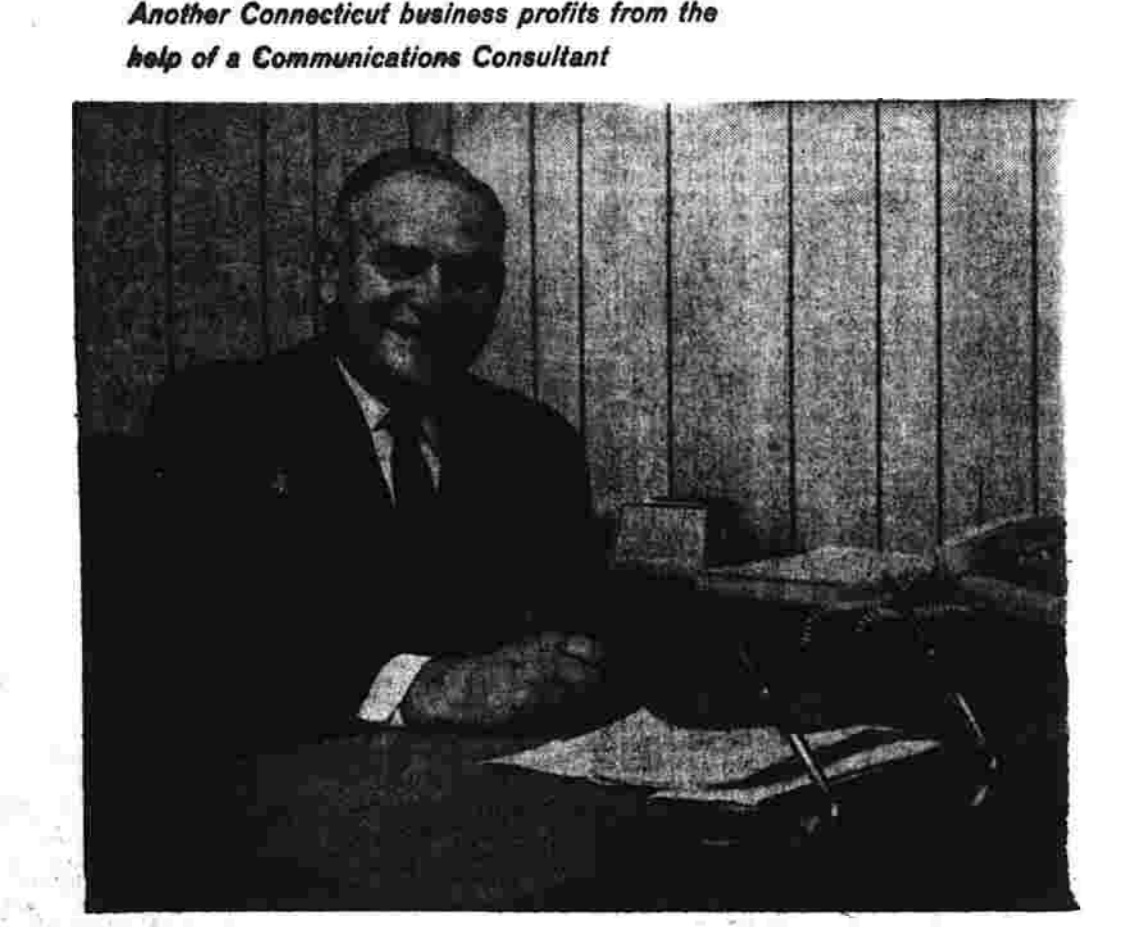

Ives Says Road Costs Climb over Estimates

HARTFORD (AP)—The General Assembly was told today that the state highway construction program during the next 10 years will run \$170 million more than had been anticipated four years ago.

Highway Commissioner Howard Ives informed the House and Bridges Committee that the increase is due to three main factors:

1. Mounting increase in construction costs with no sign of a leveling off.
2. Higher costs of acquiring rights of way.
3. Higher costs of projects added to the interstate program and bringing the highway up to expressway standards.

Rt. 6 Project Low on List

Faced with a need for an added \$20 million to complete present highway building schedules, State Highway Department officials said today that the proposed Rt. 6 relocation project remains set for late in the decade, or whenever an estimated \$30 million in funds are available, they said today.

Construction costs have jumped 25 to 30 per cent since funds were allocated for projects by 1959 legislation. State Highway Department Commissioner Howard Ives said in a briefing at the State Capitol in Hartford.

The costs will probably continue to rise, he said. "We're faced with an inadequate budget to complete our program," said Commissioner Ives. "We're going to try to carry on our present program and complete that. That is our present goal."

Commissioner Ives and other officials said the presently scheduled highway program will be completed by financing for some of them will be drawn out over another two bienniums.

The Norwalk Community College is learning answers to a question which concerns persons involved with the proposed Massachusetts transfer credits.

The credits earned at the Norwalk college so far have been accepted by most schools to which the credits have been applied to complete their work, says Dean Beverly L. Baker.

Dean Baker says some students have been accepted by and plan to attend next fall the following schools: The University of Connecticut, the University of Bridgeport, Southern Connecticut State College in New Haven, Danbury State Teachers College, Salem, V. A., and Orange Community College in Middletown, N. Y.

The dean says other students have been accepted with advanced standing by Long Island University, the College of Advanced Studies, College of Arts and Sciences, N.H., Rocky Mountain College in Billings, Mont.; New England College

in Amherst, Mass.; and Washington State Teachers College in Machias, Maine.

In addition, a high school senior who took a freshman course at Norwalk Community College has been allowed to transfer the credit to Massachusetts Institute of Technology, he says.

Dean Baker says the students who have been turned down generally were those who applied to schools against the advice of their guidance counselors.

He says that the most difficulty in transferring credits has been, and will continue to be for a few years, with colleges and universities outside the United States and in remote sections of the country.

The Norwalk Community College, now in its second year of operation, is awaiting accreditation from the Connecticut Department of Education.

An accrediting committee visited the school Jan. 14 and will make its decision soon.

The state accreditation, a community college applies for advanced credit from the New England Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools, N.H.

Accreditation by that body is a long process, sometimes involving a caucus for candidates for the October town meeting. The caucus is tentatively scheduled for July.

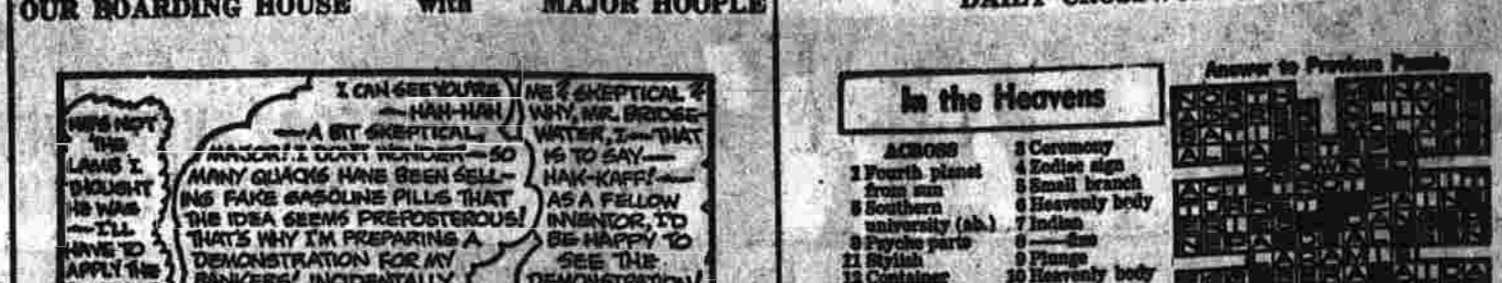
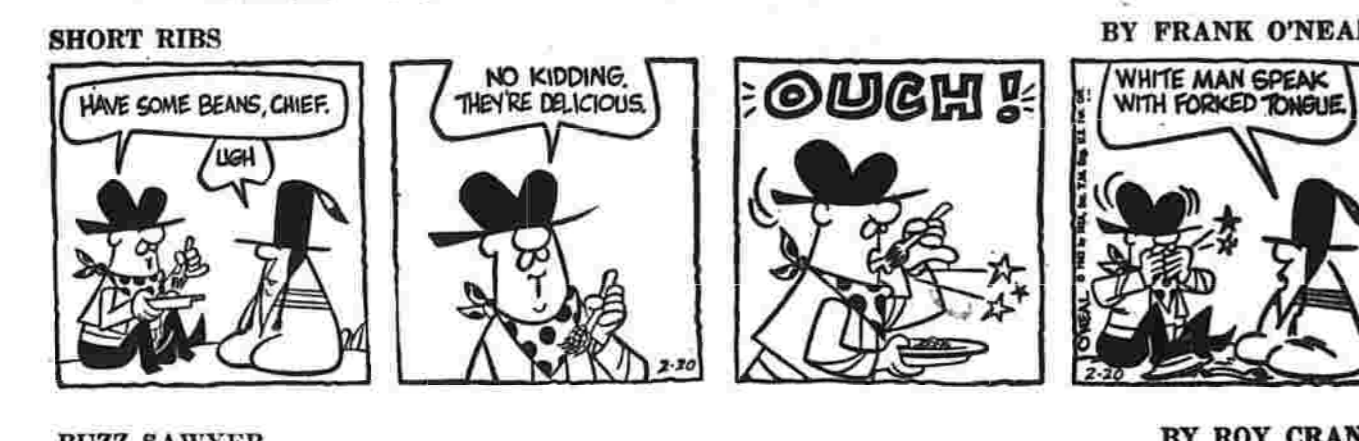
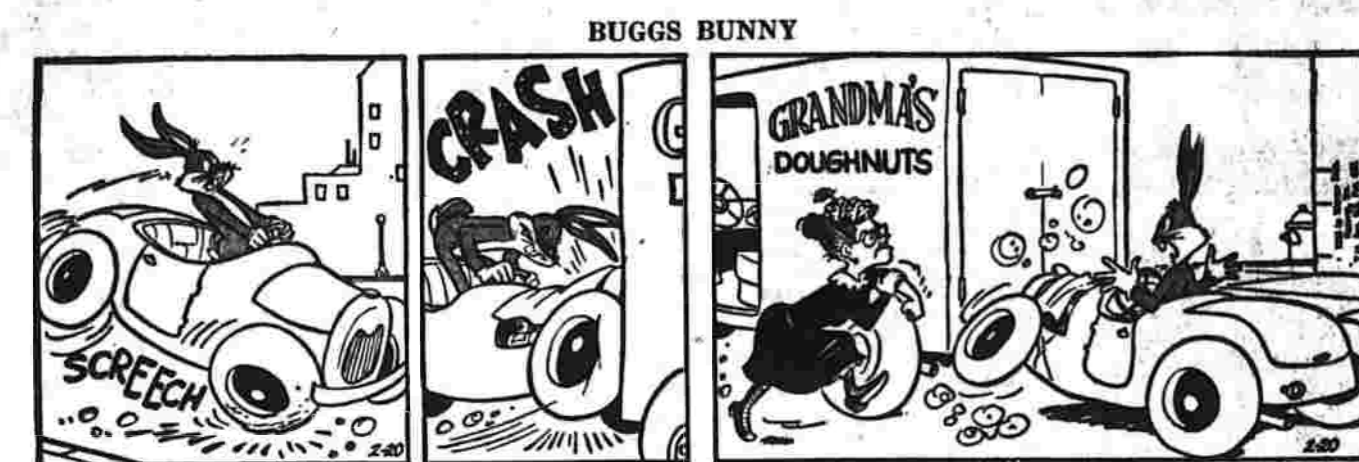
