





Prairie Churches Push AST3 DAYS FRIDAYS Prohibition for Kansas

TOPEKA, Kan. (AP)—The pro-elater who has been jousting with hibition movement is rolling across Kansas again, staunchly supported by the prairie churches he was active in an unsuccessful here. supported by the prairie churches which won the first ban-the-boose battle 80 years ago.

Encouraged by success this year in trouncing an attempt to liberalize state liquor laws, the Kansas United Dry Forces are sealously promoting a return to prohibition.

In 1880 Kansas became the first state to outlaw the sale of liquor. That constitutional amendment withstood all challenges until 1948, when the voters repealed it in favor of package stores.

This year, hotel and motel operators, trying to attract more tourists and conventions to Kansas, got a bill introduced in the legislature to permit sale of liquor by the drink. The drys raised such a fuss that the bill didn't even get out of committee. Now the drys have introduced a bill for a referendum on reinstituting prohibition.

Leading the campaign against the was active in an unsuccessful campaign to retain prohibition.

Hollomon says he has allocated \$10,000 for radio and television broadcasts to win support for the new dry campaign.

Although many observers believe Hollomon will not win committee approval of his bill, proponents of legal liquor fear the drys' strength in the prairie villages.

The Kansas Legislature, like that of most states, is dominated by representatives from rural areas who fear a pro-liquor vote would be difficult to defend at the polls.

The legislative struggle begins in earnest next Tuesday when the House State Affairs Committee holds its first public hearing on the prohibition bill.

At noon that day, the Kansas United Dry Forces will be luncheon hosts to 2,000 Kansas ministers.

Bleeding Ulcer Slowed Up Geiger

Critical Road Ahead For Bosox Fielder NEW YORK (AP)—Gary Geiger, whose problem-plagued baseball career contains all the ingredients for a radio soap

opera, has survived a collapsed lung and a bleeding ulcer in the last two years, and now faces this critical question:

the last two years, and now faces this critical question:

Can a young, frail outfielder, from the little town of Sand Ridge. Ill., find happiness while playing for the Boston Red Sox?

That's the exact position the 25-year-old left-handed batter finds himself in today after revealing that the stomach trouble he suffered last season was actually a bleeding tileer.

Geiger, whose 160 pounds stretches somewhat thinly over a 5-foot-1 frame, was, struck down at one point in 1962 for eight days. He required six blood transfusions and lost 18 pounds. Now, on declors' orders, he must either relax or undergo an operation.

Battling to grab an outfield berth over Carl Yastrzemski, Luc Chinton or Roman Mejias, Geiger said at the Red Sox camp Tuesday that the stomach disorder was diagnosed as a bleeding ulcer by his hometown doctor after the 1962 campaign in which he wound up hitting 349.

"I have been on a diet ever since," Geiger said. "The doctor tells me I can play baseball, but I mustn't get tense. I must relax and—no matter how things go—I must not worry or get upset."

That's a large order, but if he succeeds, Geiger is sure to fit in with Boston plans somewhere. The former pitcher proved he could hit major league hurling in 1960 when he batted 302 with nine homers and 38 runs batted in before his hung collapsed.


