St. Vincent's and Bridgeport Hospitals said they would continue to accept emergency cases.

Park City officials said the patient total has increased 100 percent since the construction of Conn. Tpk., which passes within two blocks of the hospital.

Shrinking Economic Pie Causes All-Out Strikes

EDITOR'S NOTE: A new and important issue is being raised in collective bargaining between labor and management. It is the issue of a shrinking economic pie. There doesn't seem to be any disposition to reduce the frequency of disputes intervention that hit dramatic peak when Arthur Goldberg, now a Supreme Court justice, served as Kennedy's labor secretary.

Some second thoughts are being given, however, on how to better federal intervention work better. Secretary Wirtz's busy man riding herd on the troubled labor scene in the five months since he succeeded Goldberg—frankly admits the government has been improving. Wirtz recently wrote that there were some 30-odd public participants, from President Kennedy on down, including city mayors and a federal judge, trying at one time or another to settle the recent dock strike.

Hinting that government intervention moves may not always have been wisely carried out, Wirtz says they were undertaken not only because the public demanded something to be done but to prevent collective bargaining from committing suicide. The White House and Labor Department generally get into the major labor disputes in an extra-legal sort of way. Without specific sanction of law, and merely stating intervention in "the public interest," the government suddenly will create a special board or send in a special mediator to recommend a labor dispute compromise. The recommendations have no legal force but they usually have, or at least seek to have, the powerful backing of public opinion. The emergency provisions of the Taft-Hartley labor-management law have been invoked only 22 times in the 15 years since the law was enacted.

The Taft-Hartley strike emergency procedure and the company strike delaying procedures of the National Labor Relations Board are the biggest labor-management contracts will fully run out then, including James R. Aides Study Insurance, Pension Cost

General Manager Richard Martin discussed the town's insurance and pension budgets with members of the Insurance Advisory Committee and Pension Board at a hearing at the Municipal Building this morning.

At stake were the budget requests for pensions for town employees, with \$78,000 requested, and for the town's various insurance policies, which will require a total of \$128,250, a smaller amount than was allocated last year.

The Advisory Committee has suggested changes in the town's policies that could save money on the town's fire insurance coverage. The new fire insurance coverage would require an updating of town's present policies to 90 per cent of the total value of town buildings. At present the coverage extends to about 70 per cent.

The town would then switch to Public and Institutional Policy, referred to as PIP, which would broaden the town's coverage and all the same time effect at least a 25 per cent saving, according to the committee.

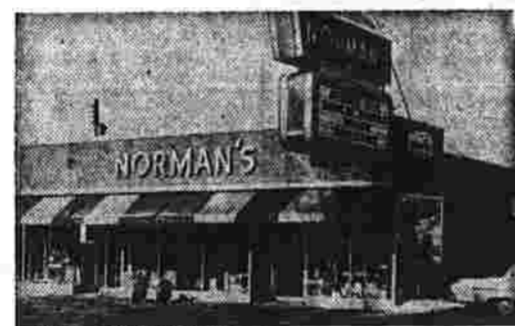

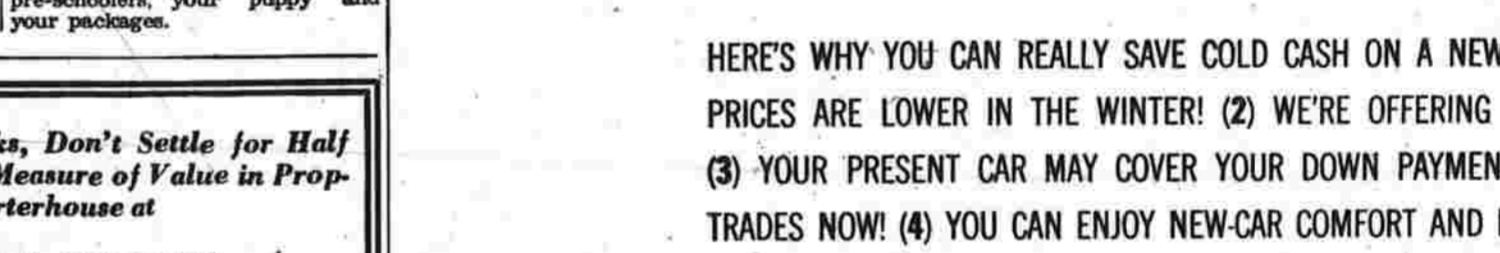

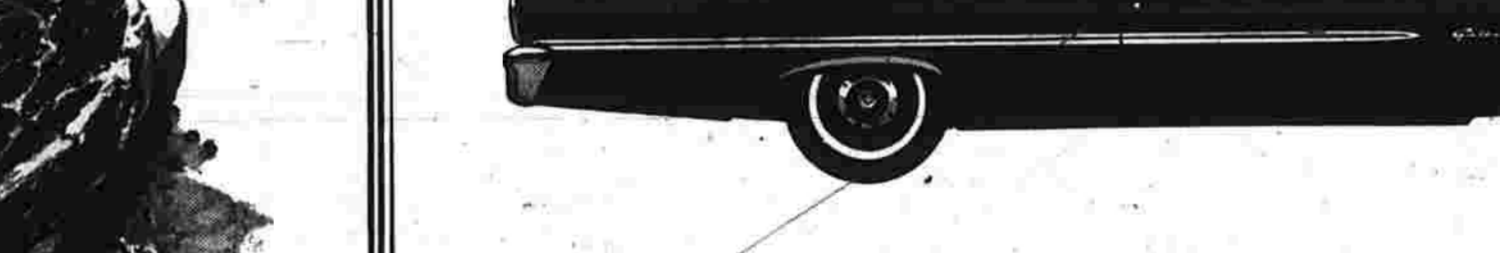

Hebron School Board Votes to Sign Bus Contract

The Hebron School Board has voted to approve the recommendation of the transportation committee to continue with its present school bus contract. This means that the town will not try out the proposed plan of owning and operating its own buses.

Raymond Burt, chairman of the transportation committee, reports that the board will re-negotiate a three-year contract with the Clark Transportation Co. of Colchester for bus service for the regional high school and elementary school at \$26,000 a year, based on a mileage of 58,000. In case of excess mileage there will be a charge of 50 cents per mile for regular extra service; 55 cents per mile for regional high school and late bus service; and 23 cents per mile for the 15-passenger bus transporting students to Lebanon, and technical students to Willimantic.

A pleasing feature of the contract is the report from the Clark Co. that the good behavior of Hebron students on the buses is one of the reasons why the company is able to make the above offer with few repairs having been necessary in bus interiors.

Decade-After Stalin's Death Onetime Luxury Goods Now in Popular Reach

EDY GILMORE, Pulitzer prize-winning AP correspondent Eddy Gilmore met the death wish for Joseph Stalin. Now, a decade later, he has returned to the Soviet Union to observe what Stalin's death has brought to the U.S.S.R. And what changes have been rung.

By EDDY GILMORE MOSCOW (AP)—Joseph Stalin died here 10 years ago today—an event that brought a revolution in the lives of 200 million people.

A decade after the demise of the old dictator, great changes have taken place in this vast land, covering one-sixth of the earth's surface.

First and foremost, the unspeakable sufferings of people in every section of Soviet life—at the hands of the dreaded secret police—have been relieved. Stalin's successors, more especially Premier Khrushchev, have choked off the near absolute power of the Red

There has been a remarkable upswing in the standard of living. By Western standards, many things are extremely costly, but that is not the point.

The point is that 10 years ago they just couldn't be bought. In the early days of the first Soviet "Spring," an unusually naive Western diplomat said to a woman member of the ruling hierarchy: "Yes, you can make Sputniks, but you can't make refrigerators or nylon panties."

The woman replied: "True, Mr. Ambassador, but I think it's going to be a lot easier to go from Sputniks to nylon panties than it will be to go from nylon panties to Sputniks."

Today in Moscow you can buy all the frilly nylon panties you want at prices ranging from 25 to \$46. Those who are still as frugal as those that existed refused to work in hot weather. Still not easy to get, there are, nevertheless,

plenty of them in Soviet apartment houses. Returning here for the first time in 10 years, my wife and I went to an apartment we knew very well. It was a two-room flat with a communal kitchen and bathroom. A decade ago it was occupied by four adults.

Today one person occupies the apartment and she went about preparing our dinner she said to my wife: "Will you please go in the kitchen, look in the refrigerator and get out the caviar?"

Ten years ago these things would have existed only in the homes of the Soviet's wisest. Housing still is desperately short of the clamorous demand. The government admits it. House-building is going forward at a great pace. It began on a big scale in 1958. What seems to be an overly ambitious goal is that everyone shall have a private room or apartment by 1965.

Ten years ago I'd seen toilet tissue in the Kremlin but nowhere else. Today it's on sale from Leningrad to Rostov-on-Don at the equivalent of 25 cents a roll. Here are some current Moscow prices:

One lemon—(best grade) 36 cents (second grade) 28 cents. Man's shirt—\$15 to \$16. A Communist party official proudly said he cost the equivalent of \$4.4. But a long search of Moscow's markets failed to reveal any at that price.

Good grade overcoat—\$265. Socks—75 cents for a small tube. Toothbrush (small)—11 cents. Mens shoes—from \$25 to \$46. The water on my hotel floor disappeared for two hours one morning. I asked him where he had been.

"I heard some new shoes, made in Czechoslovakia, were on sale at a store not far from here. I got in line."

"Did you get a pair?" "Yes," he said, "my heels and sole are 48 rubles (about \$3) a pair. The shoes cost 48 rubles but that wasn't the point. By the

time I got to the counter only big sizes were left."

I asked him how he could afford shoes on his salary. "I got good tips. My wife works and I don't pay much rent. This is one of the secrets behind Soviet family budgets. With \$9 per cent of the apartment nationalized, a two-room apartment often rents for as little as \$7 a month.

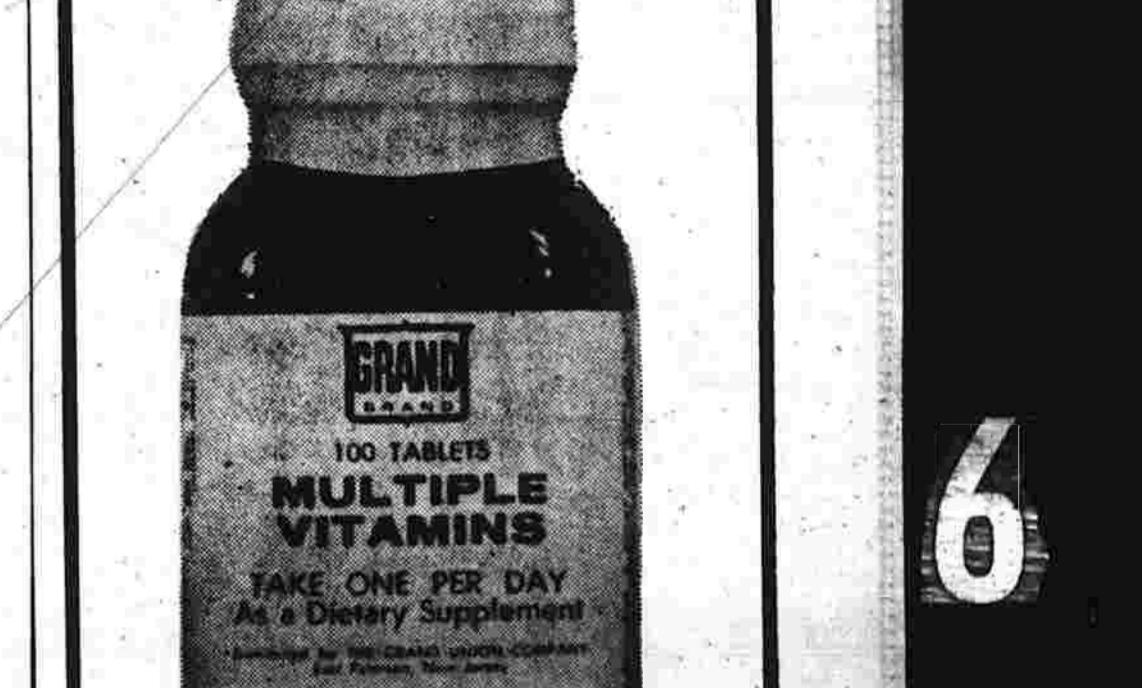

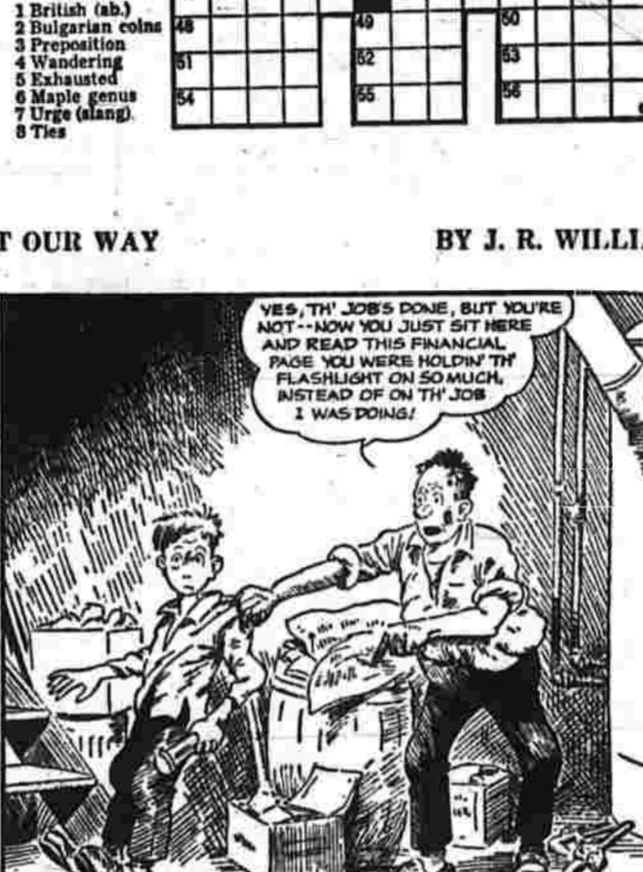

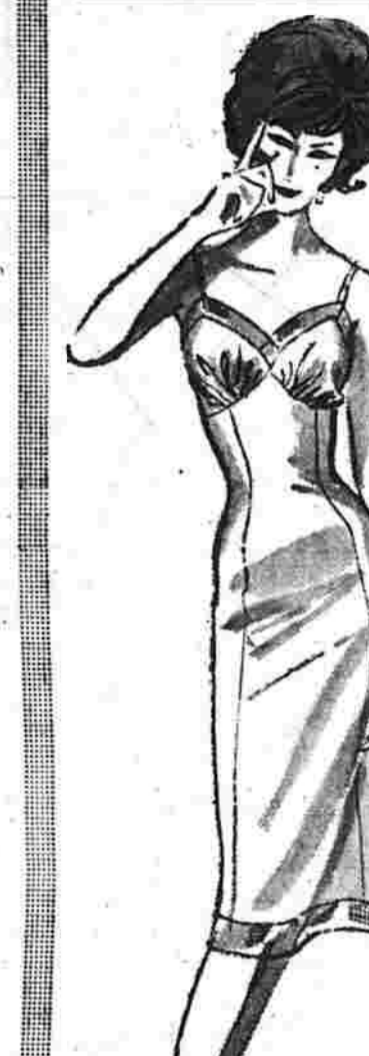
