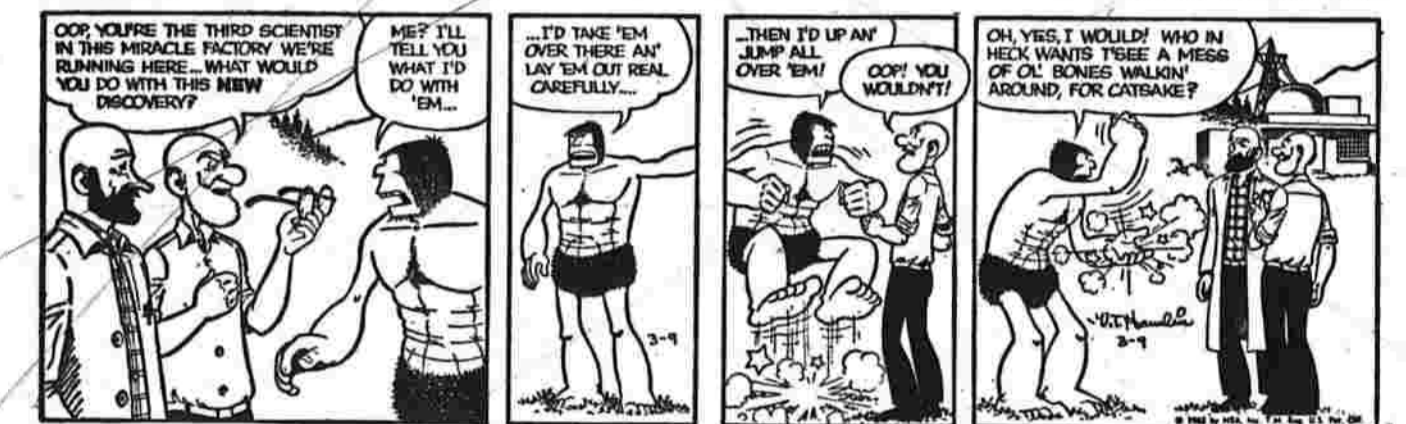

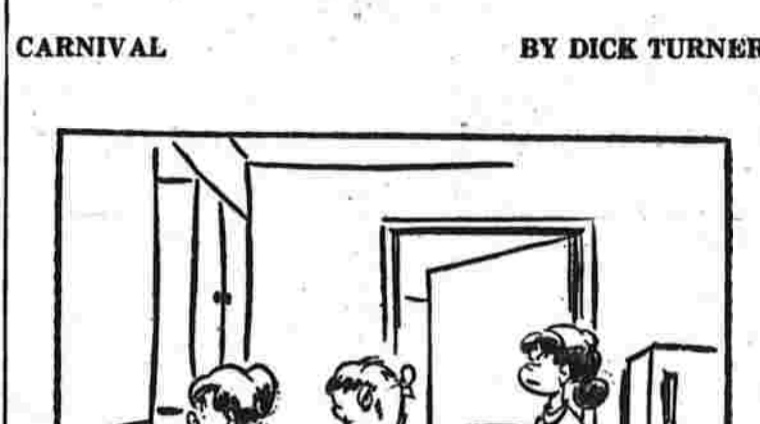

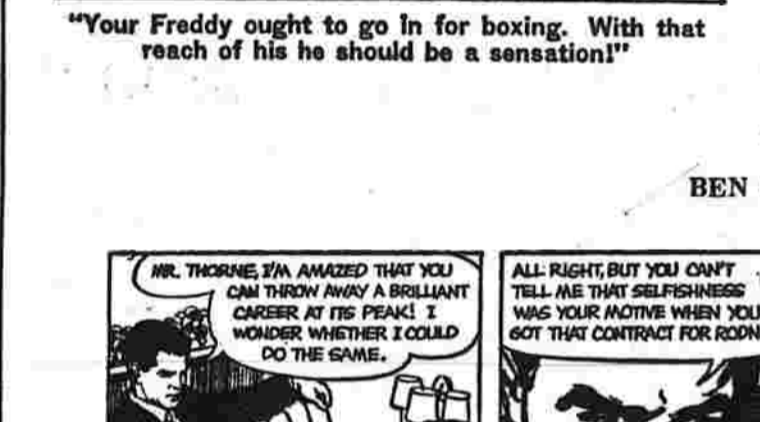

RAPID INCREASE

Telephones in service and long-distance calls both increased more rapidly in 1962 than in the previous year according to the Southern New England Telephone Company's annual report issued yesterday.

A gain of 57,000 phones during the year brought the company's total to 1,372,000.

The company's 1962 construction program was the second largest in its history, with more than \$50 million spent for service expansion and improvements. Earnings for the year were \$2.60 per share.

"Telephones in service and long-distance calls both increased at a greater rate than in 1961, with resulting higher total revenues," said SNET president Ellis C. Massey. Per-share earnings, however, were 19 cents less than in 1961 because of increased expenses. Dividends were continued at the rate of \$2.20 per share.

The big construction program brought to completion a six-year project to provide direct distance dialing for all Connecticut phone users. The service was also improved in two ways: Six out of every ten customers now have "automatic number identification," so an operator no longer asks for their numbers, and phone users in more than half the company's exchanges make their long distance calls by dialing "1" instead of "12," as is the case in Manchester.

TV Personalities

Sander Vanocur

One of the hazards of working in the nation's capital is the after-work cocktail party or dinner party or theatre party.

This, from NBC News White House correspondent Sander Vanocur, makes for a long day. "Because it is really nothing more than an extension of your work," he says.

Six years ago, when he was Midwestern correspondent for NBC News, Vanocur spent a great deal of time in planes and hotels away from his home base in Chicago. Now, his work takes him not out of town but into embassies and hotels in Washington where he perks a keen ear for news.

Such an ear produced a national scoop a year and a half ago when Vanocur broadcast that Kennedy would attend a summit meeting with Khrushchev. Vanocur's ear for news also produced for him a Merit Award from Northwestern University, his alma mater, and a Broadcasting Leadership Award from the Yale Broadcasting Co.

Vanocur was born Jan. 3 thirty-five years ago in Cleveland. He pronounces his last name "Van-Oak-Her." He received a degree at Northwestern in 1960 and immediately went to London and enrolled in the London School of Economics.

He served in the U.S. Army from 1952 to 1954 and, after discharge, joined the staff of the Manchester Guardian newspaper in London.

As a sidelight, he began doing a weekly news analysis radio program for the North America Service of the British Broadcasting Corporation. This led to an assignment as a stringer for CBS News in London.

In 1955, Vanocur returned to this country and joined the city staff of the New York Times. Two years later, he came to NBC News. His first post was that of Midwestern correspondent where he distinguished himself with coverage of the Our Lady of the Angels grammar school fire which killed 88 children.

He also covered Khrushchev's tour of the U.S. and, when Senator Kennedy ran for President, Vanocur provided coverage for NBC News through the primaries to the election.

He is still covering Kennedy, now as White House correspondent. When Mrs. Kennedy went to India and Pakistan last spring, Vanocur accompanied the First Lady and, when he returned, was anchorman for a full-hour special TV News program that recapped Mrs. Kennedy's trip.

Vanocur appears each weekday on the five-minute "NBC News Afternoon Report" on NBC-TV and the NBC-TV 15-minute "Bristol-Myers Saturday Night Report." When not broadcasting or drumming up a news story, Vanocur relaxes with his family at their home in Washington. His wife, the former Edith Pick is from Vienna. Their two children are Nicholas, 5, and Christopher, 2.
